“HORNETS WEB”

What is **Hornets Web**? **Hornets Web** is the online faculty and student information system that will allow you to:

- Register in on-campus computer labs and dormitories that are equipped with computers or anywhere in the world if you have internet access.
- Look up and print your schedule of classes.
- Look up and print a copy of your transcript.
- Change personal information like local addresses and telephone numbers.
- Check bill balances and the status of your financial aid.
- Request and pay for a transcript online.
- Use a variety of other services online.

You may log into **Hornets Web** using your nine (9) digit **SID** (system generated Student ID) and the personal identification number (**PIN**) (the first two (2) letters of your first name, the first two (2) letters of your last name, and the last four (4) digits of your SID). You must be **advised prior to registering**. To register, click on “Registration Instructions,” then follow the steps on “How to Register.”.

You may use other functions of the system even if registration is not available.

Step 10: Follow the directions on the screen to search for and build your schedule of classes for the term. Note: If you were enrolled in the previous term you will have to select the term before you can proceed with registration.

Step 11: Adding a class is a three Step process:

1. Select Class to Add – In this step you will search, identify and add the desired course section to your schedule.
2. Confirm Classes – In this step you must confirm that the class that was added to the schedule is the correct course.
3. View Results – It is in this step that you will review and print your completed schedule

Step 12: Once you have reviewed and Printed your schedule you have now completed the process of selecting your classes. Below is an example of what a completed class schedule will look like.

Step 13: After the selection of classes, it is your responsibility to complete registration by Satisfying your financial obligations.

NOTE: REGISTRATION IS NOT COMPLETE UNTIL FINANCIAL OBLIGATIONS ARE MET. Financial arrangements(financial aid, cash, promissory note, etc.) must be made no later than August 11, 2010. Failure to make the necessary financial arrangements will result in your classes being dropped. (See page 22 for the new enrolment policy)

POLICIES AND PROCEDURES GOVERNING WEB REGISTRATION

- (1) Students are required to submit the Schedule Request Form to their academic advisers in person, by fax or e-mail.
- (2) The academic advisers will release the adviser hold upon approval of the selection of classes.
- (3) Academic advisers will give students a copy of their program of study (curriculum sheet) and have students sign the form. The program of study must be signed by an adviser and maintained in the student's advisement folder.
- (4) All currently enrolled students should register on the web providing all "holds" have been cleared.
- (5) Transfer students will be allowed to web register, only after consulting with their adviser. They will be advised, given a PIN number and instructed on how to use the web for registration.
- (6) Regarding Drop/Add, students will be allowed to make their own program changes (add open classes and drop classes) via the web through late registration.
- (7) Web instructions are published in the course schedule book, available on the web and given to all academic advisers.

NOTE: Students with registration holds (academic suspension and dismissal, disciplinary suspension, administrative holds and financial holds) cannot web register. They must report to the respective offices to clear the hold(s).

Students who wish to take overloads cannot register for more than the maximum (18 hours) for regular terms and (9 hours) for summer term load online.

- (9) Students may update their personal addresses and phone numbers online.

NOTE: A change of major must be done in the Registrar's Office.

- (10) Students may view their grades and transcripts online.
- (11) Students may screen print a class schedule and a bill via web.
- (12) Students who have not paid 60% by **June 5, 2012** will be dropped from their classes. Once a student has been dropped after June 5, 100% of all tuition and fees are due at the time of re-enrollment.

REGISTRATION FACTS AND PROCEDURES

Student Identification System Change

Alabama State University changed its student identification system for all students, effective 1990 summer session. The student numbers used by all offices for accessing student information have been replaced by students' Social Security numbers. The number is required for registration, program change (drop/add), payment of tuition/fees, financial aid, etc.

Information on the use of students' Social Security numbers may be found in the policy statement in the current *General Undergraduate Catalog*.

Registration

To receive the proper credit for a course, a student must be officially registered for the course in the Office of Records and Registration, and the student's name must be listed on the official class roster. A student who attends a class without official registration will not receive a grade for the course. Any student who fails to comply with the official registration rules and regulations will not be allowed to petition for course credit.

Praxis II Testing Requirement Effective Spring 2005

PRAXIS II TESTING REQUIREMENT The Praxis II Testing Requirement

- The Praxis II is a graduation and certification requirement.
- Teacher candidates will be required to take and pass the test prior to student teaching.
- Candidates must score at or above the cut score to be cleared for graduation. Although cut scores for many teaching areas have already been established by the Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE), new cut scores became effective for several teaching areas on June 1, 2007. Candidates applying for certification after June 1, 2007, will be required to meet these new scores.
- Candidates do not have to take Praxis II if they are completing an advanced program in a subject area for which they already hold a valid teaching certificate.

FILING FOR SUMMER GRADUATION

**Filing Dates: April 11 – June 1, 2011
(2011 Summer Term)**

If you plan to complete academic requirements by the end of the summer term, you must file an official application for graduation by the beginning of the summer term. Applications for graduation are available for undergraduates in the Office of Student Affairs, McGehee Hall 108. Applications for graduate students may be picked up from the School of Graduate Studies, Council Hall 201.

Graduate candidates need to make certain that research projects and all appropriate test scores have been submitted to the School of Graduate Studies in Council Hall 201.

DEADLINE FOR FILING – June 1, 2011

Graduation Application Fee - \$100

*** NOTE ***

There will not be a commencement ceremony held Summer term.. All summer graduates will have degrees conferred in at the end of the summer term, however participation in the graduation ceremony will be during the Fall commencement held in December per the Academic Calendar

Clearance Deadline for Graduation

To qualify for graduation, candidates must clear all academic deficiencies five days prior to the last day of classes for the term.

Students who file for graduation for a specific term and do not complete all requirements, for any reason, must refile for the next graduation term by the deadline specified, including the payment of another application fee.

INDEPENDENT STUDY COURSES

A request for independent study must be submitted by the faculty and student in writing for approval by the department chair, college/school dean, and the vice president for academic affairs. The request must explain the need to use this independent format and the rules to be used in evaluating required assignments. Faculty must maintain documentation of weekly contact with the student and submit progress reports to the department chair, dean and vice president for academic affairs during the week of midterm and final exams. This does not apply to university approved practicums and internships.

Late Registration Policy

The late registration policy will be strictly enforced each semester. All students must complete registration (validate and receive a computer-generated class schedule) before late registration for each term ends. Students who

attempt to validate and pick up a computer-generated class schedule after the late registration deadline will be DENIED and will have to wait until the next term to enroll for classes at the university.

A late registration fee will be charged to all students, including preregistered students, who have not completed registration by the end of general registration.

Unregistered Students Attending Class

Students will not be allowed to remain in class if their names do not appear on the official class roster or if they do not have a class schedule at the end of the late registration period. Any exception to this policy must have the approval of the Vice President for academic affairs.

CATALOG REQUIREMENTS AND TIME LIMITS Undergraduate Students

Degree requirements or other university regulations are established by the catalog current at the time of initial enrollment, and the student is entitled to complete requirements under the catalog within an eight-year period. The student may elect to satisfy requirements under the latest catalog, provided all requirements of the current catalog elected are satisfied within an eight-year period. Students who fail to complete requirements under one catalog within the eight-year period must fulfill requirements of the current catalog. Students whose eight-

Graduate Studies

All graduate students, new and returning, should first report to the Graduate School, Council Hall 101, before advisement and registration.

New students applying for admission after the stated deadlines in the graduate catalog will have to wait for pertinent information to be entered into the database before they can register.

Off-campus students are required to register in person on the Montgomery campus. Applications for graduation and registration for comprehensive exams must also be completed in person.

Course Numbers

year catalog entitlement expires as a result of discontinued enrollment are subject to the requirements of the current catalog. Students whose eight-year catalog entitlement expires as a result of discontinued enrollment are subject to the requirements of the catalog current at the time of re-enrollment. Students who transfer to another institution lose entitlement under the catalog of initial entry and upon readmission are governed by the catalog current at that time.

The institution reserves the right to correct, alter, amend or modify any item contained in the catalog. Any such changes will be shown in the schedule book of classes or on the correction sheet to the schedule book and on the student's individual program of study (graduation checklist).

Curriculum changes made pursuant to federal and state governmental agencies are exceptions to the student's entitlement to complete requirements under the catalog current at the time of initial enrollment.

CLARIFICATION ON SATISFYING THE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS IN CORE COURSES

Students whose initial entry date was the 1987 fall semester or a subsequent term must earn a grade of "C" or higher in all core curriculum courses used toward degree requirements.

All courses consist of a course abbreviation, a call number (five digits) and course numbers (three digits and a two-digit section number). Be sure to include all of this data on the request form. Example:

Eligibility

All continuing and returning students in good academic standing are eligible to register without having to apply for readmission, with the following exception of categories:

(1) Returning students who have not been enrolled within the past academic year

These students should apply for readmission through the Office of Admissions and Recruitment and request (through the Office of Records and Registration) a copy of their transcripts to be sent to the academic advisers at least two weeks before general registration. This procedure also applies to transfer students who enrolled at ASU, attended another institution and wish to return to ASU.

(2) Students who wish to return after being placed on academic dismissal

Such students should apply for reinstatement, after remaining out of ASU for a minimum of two regular semesters, through the Office of Records and Registration.

A student seeking reinstatement after dismissal must complete an application for readmission and must petition the Academic Standards Committee through the Office of Records and Registration. The application for readmission must be accompanied with evidence that the student is likely to succeed upon readmission. Applications for readmission may be picked up from Records and Registration. The application and letter of petition must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the semester in which the student seeks readmission.

Auditing Courses

Students who wish to audit courses should contact the registrar in the Office of Records and Registration before attempting to register. The fee for auditing a course is \$50. No credit or grade will be given for the course. Audit status may not be changed after the end of the program-change period.

Off-Campus Registration

Consult the list offerings to determine the courses available. You may register for courses to be taught at the centers and/or the Montgomery campus. Contact the director of each center in the Office of Graduate Studies, Council Hall 201, (334) 229-4275, for further instructions.

POLICY OF STUDENT WITHDRAWAL FROM A COURSE (Effective Fall 2010)

A student who chooses to withdraw from a course after the last day of the drop/add period may do so without the approval of the course instructor or the dean. This action will result in the student receiving a "W" for the course. A "W" denotes an official withdrawal from the course and is not calculated into the cumulative grade point average (GPA). A student may withdraw from a course up through the week of midterm exams. The deadline date for withdrawing from a course (usually the Tuesday after midterm week) is stipulated in the academic calendar. All official withdrawals must be made through the Office of Records and Registration.

When a student, as a result of emergency circumstances is forced to withdraw from a course after the established withdrawal date for the term; the student may petition, in writing, the dean of the school in which the course is offered for approval to withdraw from the course. A student may not withdraw from a course after the deadline if he or she is failing. The dean will contact the student's instructor to determine the student's scholastic standing at the time

of the request to withdraw.

If a student registers and stops attending a course; the course must be officially dropped through the Office of Records and Registration or a grade of "WF" will be recorded by the instructor.

If a student registers and never attends any class sessions for a particular course, a grade of "X" will be recorded for the course; unless the student officially withdraws through the Office of Records and Registration. A grade of "X" may result in the reduction of a student's aid award and/or the creation of a financial balance on the student's account.

If the student improperly adds a course and does not process a schedule change form through the Office of Records and Registration, no credit will be allowed and he or she will not receive a grade for the course.

2011 SUMMER DEADLINE FOR WITHDRAWAL FROM A COURSE IS WEDNESDAY, July 6, 2011.

VERIFICATION OF NONATTENDANCE

Students who drop courses that they never attended or withdraw from the university without having attended classes, and subsequently request a reduction in charges, must do the following:

1. Pick up the request for nonattendance form from the Office of Records and Registration;
2. Complete the request for nonattendance form. It is important that you obtain the instructor's signature for all courses for which a fee reduction is being requested; and
3. Return the form to the Office of Records and Registration.

If the instructor verifies nonattendance, the form will be submitted to the Office of Student Accounts.

Requests for nonattendance for the 2010 Summer semester will not be processed after midterm – July 1, 2011.

Remember: If a student registers and decides not to attend class(es) or stops attending class(es), the course must be officially dropped through the Registrar's Office, or a grade of "WF" may be recorded by the instructor.

Deadline: End of midterm of the term in which the

course is being offered.

GOOD ACADEMIC STANDING

A student is in good academic standing if he/she is not on academic probation, suspension or dismissal.

POLICIES ON ACADEMIC SUSPENSION AND DISMISSAL

RETENTION

Academic eligibility requirements for continuation in residence are calculated on Alabama State University course work. Academic probation is a scholastic warning, indicating that the student is in danger of being suspended. A student on probation can continue his/her enrollment without interruption.

Academic suspension is a status that bars a student from continued enrollment at the university for one regular semester. That is, students placed on academic suspension at the end of the spring semester are not eligible for re-enrollment for any term, including the summer term, until the next spring semester.

ACADEMIC PROBATION

A student (including a freshman) will be placed on academic probation whenever his/her cumulative grade point average at Alabama State University is less than the grade point average identified below for the applicable level of cumulative graded hours:

0 - 31	1.50
32 - 62	1.81
63 - 92	1.87
More than 92	2.00

¹Cumulative graded hours include hours attempted at ASU and hours transferred from any other institution(s).

²Only the cumulative GPA earned at ASU will be used to determine the probation and suspension status (regardless of what the overall GPA may be for transfer students).

CLEARING PROBATION

A student may clear probation by elevating his/her cumulative grade point average at ASU to a level equal to or greater than those identified above for the applicable class level. Credits and grades earned at another institution

may not be used to clear probation.

Students with academic deficiencies are encouraged to enroll in the summer term.

ACADEMIC SUSPENSION

A student (including a freshman) will be suspended for a regular semester if his/her cumulative grade point average at the end of a term places him/her on probation and that probationary status is not cleared at the end of the next term enrolled. A student will not be suspended at the end of a term in which he or she completes a full-time course load and earns a 2.0 ("C") term grade point average, but will be continued on probation unless his/her probationary status has been cleared. Upon returning, their academic status will be determined by the aforementioned probationary standards.

No credit earned at another institution by a student on suspension from ASU will be used in clearing a suspension or in meeting requirements for an Alabama State University degree.

ACADEMIC DISMISSAL

A student who receives a second suspension will be subject to academic dismissal.

Academic dismissal does not imply future reinstatement; nor does academic dismissal mean that a person is forever barred from attending Alabama State University. Students may apply for reinstatement after remaining out of ASU for a minimum of two regular semesters.

Dismissed students are not eligible to apply for readmission for summer terms until they have remained out of ASU for two regular terms.

The application for readmission must be accompanied with evidence that the student is likely to succeed upon readmission.

An academically suspended or dismissed student who has incomplete or other deferred grades that could, when cleared, remove his/her suspension or dismissal will be given until the end of the program change period of the next semester to remove his/her suspension or dismissal.

No credit earned at another institution by a student on academic suspension or dismissal will be used in clearing a suspension or dismissal or in meeting requirements for an ASU degree.

Probation, Suspension and Dismissal

A student who preregisters and is placed on academic probation when grades are received must report to the Office of Records and Registration to have his/her class load reduced, if necessary. If a student preregisters and is

subsequently found to be eligible for academic suspension or dismissal, he/she will be administratively withdrawn from the university.

VETERANS SERVICES

Veterans receiving benefits, who are enrolled on the main campus and at the centers, must take courses in their academic programs, complete the veteran's registration information form each semester and notify the veteran's services officer, located in Councill Hall 127, immediately of any schedule changes.

Readmission After Dismissal

A student who desires to return to ASU must petition the Academic Standards Committee, outlining the steps that have been taken to correct the difficulties. Petitions for readmission must be made to the Academic Standards Committee through the Office of Records and Registration.

Applications for readmission may be picked up from the Office of Records and Registration. The application and petition must be submitted at least 30 days prior to the term in which the student seeks readmission.

Accurate Address Information

A student must provide the university with a current local and home address at the time of registration and complete a change of address form whenever the address(es) change. It is a student's responsibility to make certain that accurate address information is on file at all times. You may update your address at the Office of the Registrar in person, by letter, by fax: (334) 834-0336, or on the web.

Different addresses can be maintained on your electronic file. However, you must provide specific address data and instructions to ensure accuracy of this information. The most commonly used addresses are:

LOCAL: This is your address in the Montgomery area. Semester-specific mailings are sent to this address (e.g., financial aid disbursement checks, bills, registration information).

HOUSING (local): This is the residence hall address if you are living on campus.

PERMANENT HOME: This is your address to which semester grade reports and bills will be sent. In some cases this may be the same as the local address.

PARENT/GUARDIAN: Specific mailings are sent to this address.

Posting, Mailing and Correction of Grades

Student grade reports are no longer mailed to the

student's home after the end of each term. All students can access their grade reports via "Hornet's Web" approximately one week after the end of term. If a student has an outstanding balance of any kind, grade reports will not be accessible. It is the student's responsibility to immediately check his or her grade report for accuracy and report discrepancies. Any discrepancies should be reported on an Omission/Correction of Grade form. **DO NOT COMPLETE THE FORM FOR "I" GRADES RECEIVED.** Grades will be posted on the transcript approximately one week after the end of each term.

Procedure for Viewing Academic Record/Transcript (On Campus)

The Office of Records and Registration will make available as a continuing service the official academic record or transcript and its supporting personnel folder to the student making the request, upon presentation of the proper identification (student I.D. card). The folder will be available for viewing within a reasonable time following the student's request, except during rush periods such as registration and grade reporting, not to exceed seven days.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

There is no charge for the initial copy. The appropriate fee must accompany each request thereafter (cashier's check, bank draft or money order only). Personal checks will not be accepted.

If you have an outstanding balance, the university will withhold academic transcripts until the delinquent amount is paid in full.

Transcripts and grade information will be released according to the guidelines of the Family Rights and Privacy Act.

ACADEMIC AND SOCIAL DISMISSALS AND SUSPENSIONS

No student is eligible for admission to ASU who is under academic or social dismissal or suspension from another university. Likewise, no credits earned by ASU students while on either academic or social dismissal or

suspension from ASU will be accepted from another institution..

COURSE CONFLICTS

A student cannot register for courses that conflict in time, days, overlapping time, etc. The computer will not print a schedule with such conflicts.

Student Responsibility

While ASU will endeavor to provide timely, helpful and accurate advisement, it is the responsibility of the student to know and to satisfy the degree requirements of his/her academic program.

I Grade Policy

Effective 2004 Summer Term

An "I" (Incomplete) grade is assigned in instances in which a student is likely to pass the course upon completion of requirements to change the "I" grade. To yield credit for a course for which a grade of "I" has been assigned, course requirements must be completed by the end of the next semester of enrollment, not to exceed two calendar years. If the student does not complete assignments to remove the I grade during the next semester of enrollment, the grade of "F" will be the final grade.

Students receiving veteran benefits are required to adhere to the regulations of the Veterans Administration in addition to those requirements set by the university for all students.

UNIVERSITY ATTENDANCE POLICY **Effective Fall Semester 2009**

Each student is expected to attend all lectures, seminars, laboratories and field work for each registered class, including the first class session, in order to verify registration with instructors and to complete all work assigned for the course. Failure to observe this policy may seriously jeopardize a student's academic standing.

If a student does not attend class during the first week (first five instructional days) of the semester and does not give prior notification to the instructor of reasons for absence and intent to attend the class, the student will be dropped from the course.

A student is permitted one (1) unexcused absence for each credit hour generated by the class. For example, two (2) absences are allowed in a two-hour class. Excessive absenteeism, whether excused or

unexcused, may result in a student's course grade being reduced or in assignment of a grade of "F".

At the beginning of the class, the instructor is responsible for having listed on his or her syllabus the University Attendance Policy. The student will be held responsible for adhering to the University Attendance Policy. Instructors of courses are not obligated to provide makeup opportunities for students who are absent, unless the absences have been officially approved.

An officially approved absence, however, merely gives the individual who missed the class an opportunity to make up the work and in no way excuses him or her from the work required.

Official excuses are granted by the Office of Student Affairs for authorized university activities, verified personal illness or illness or death in the immediate family. Absences will count from the first day of registration for each course. Students receiving veteran's benefits are required to attend classes according to the regulations of the Veterans Administration in addition to those regulations set by the university for all students. It is the responsibility of the instructor to keep an accurate attendance record of all students enrolled. Students should understand that absences may jeopardize their grades. It is the responsibility of the student to withdraw from the university or drop a course.

FINANCIAL AID **(Summer Term)**

Undergraduate and graduate students must maintain the class load for which they initially registered as follows:

Undergraduate

Full Time - 6 or more hours
Less Than Half Time - 1-5 hours

The Pell Grant will be prorated based upon the student's enrollment status.

Graduate

Full Time - 6 or more hours
Less Than Half Time - 1-5 hours

All students must be enrolled for at least six hours to receive the William D. Ford Stafford Loan.

Students receiving federal funds under the Title IV programs (SEOG, NDSL, CWS and Pell Grant) are expected to make satisfactory progress as outlined in the Satisfactory Progress Policy, published by the Office of Financial Aid.

Withdrawal from the University

If you wish to withdraw from the university, you must file an official notice.

- A. Before the semester begins, write "withdrawn," sign your name and the date across the schedule, and take or mail it to the Office of Records and Registration, Council Hall 17.
- B. After classes begin, you may withdraw by picking up a withdrawal form from the Office of Records and Registration, Council Hall 17, and obtaining the necessary signatures. The withdrawal form must be returned to the Office of Records and Registration.
- C. If you are out of town/state or incapacitated and wish to withdraw, simply write a letter requesting withdrawal for a specific term. Sign the letter and include your Social Security number. Mail the letter to the Office of Records and Registration.

Withdrawal from the university must take place by the last day of classes.

ALABAMA PROSPECTIVE TEACHER TEST (APTT)

The Alabama Prospective Teacher Test (APTT) is scheduled to be administered during the Spring Semester. Test registration procedures and applications can be picked up from the Teacher Certification Office, Council Hall, Room 235. Test date to be announced.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY EXAMINATION (Suspended)

A student who is enrolled in a program leading to the bachelor's degree must pass the English Proficiency Examination before he/she can become a candidate for graduation. The examination must be taken prior to admission to a degree-granting program. It is administered each semester.

Students should arrange to take this examination in the semester following completion of the freshman English requirement. Transfer students are expected to take the English Proficiency Examination during their first semester of residence if freshman English has been completed.

All students who entered ASU in the fall quarter of 1984 and after must take the English Proficiency Examination before being transferred out of University College.

NOTE: SUSPENSION OF EXIT EXAMS

The ASU Board of Trustees at its May 9, 2002, meeting passed a resolution suspending the Baccalaureate Writing Competency Test (BWCT), the English Proficiency Examination (EPE), and the Nelson Denny Reading Test (NDRT) pending a full review of the policy and process of administering the same.

Students who plan to graduate should contact their advisors to determine the requirements regarding these exit examinations.

BACCALAUREATE WRITING COMPETENCY TEST (BWCT)

(Undergraduate students whose initial entry date is fall 1991 or a subsequent term)

The purpose of the Baccalaureate Writing Competency Test is to ascertain that ASU students are able to write with proficiency in their degree areas before they graduate.

Although students must pass the English Proficiency Exam prior to leaving University College, that test essentially only ensures that students are capable of producing a written document that conforms to the standards of basic written composition. The EPE does not measure any higher-level skills in writing.

The Baccalaureate Writing Competency Test calls for the student to write a reasonable, sophisticated essay on a topic from his/her academic discipline.

Students who fail the test must seek remediation to improve their skills before attempting the test a second time. This remediation must be documented. Students who fail the sentence-skills portion of the test will be referred to the program that addresses their demonstrated weaknesses. A student who fails the support section of the essay will be assigned to an instructor from his/her area of major study,

who will work with the student to help him or her develop support material for various topics. Students who fail the organization section will be assigned to an English instructor or to a writing laboratory where they will be required to develop and write practice essays.

The Baccalaureate Writing Competency Test is a graduation requirement. No student may receive a degree from ASU until he/she has satisfied this requirement.

Students must pass the English Proficiency Exam in order to be eligible for the Baccalaureate Writing Competency Test.

ENGLISH PROFICIENCY FOR GRADUATE STUDENTS

Applicants seeking admission to the Graduate School must take and submit a passing score on the ASU Graduate Writing Competency Test (GWCT). Graduates of ASU who passed the BWCT as an undergraduate do not have to take the GWCT.

Registration for a second term will not be permitted without having met this requirement. Each student is limited to three opportunities to pass this proficiency test.

ANNUAL NOTICE TO STUDENTS

Annually, ASU informs students of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. This act, with which the institution intends to comply fully, is designed to protect the privacy of education records, to establish the right of students to inspect and review their education records, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Students also have the right to file complaints with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the act.

Local policy explains in detail the procedures to be used by the institution for compliance with the provisions of the act. Copies of the policy may be found in the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs. The policy is also printed in the latest *Student Handbook*. Student Affairs also maintains a *Directory of Records*, which lists all education records maintained on students by this institution.

Questions concerning the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act may be referred to the Office of the Vice President for Student Affairs.

METHOD OF PAYMENT

Payment of tuition and fees, room and board may be

made by cash, personal check, certified check, money order, cashier's check, MasterCard or VISA (MasterCard and VISA are accepted at the cashier's window only). A service charge of \$30 shall be assessed on all returned checks. A returned check may result in the cancellation of registration. Payments also may be made through Western Union, Quick Collect and Bank Wire Transfer. Call (334) 229-4223.

All payments may be made at the cashier's window located in Council Hall during regular business hours: Monday through Friday, 8:15 a.m. - 4:45 p.m. Please review your registration instructions for extended hours during registration.

SOCIAL SECURITY RECIPIENTS

The Social Security Administration is authorized to collect information about your school enrollment under sections 202(d) and 205(a) of the Social Security Act. If you receive Social Security benefits, submit the Social Security enrollment form to the Office of Records and Registration for verification to the Social Security Administration. This is the only office authorized by the university to report enrollment to the Social Security Administration.

Public Notice Designation Directory Information

ASU hereby designates the following categories of student information as public or directory information. Such information may be disclosed by the institution for any purpose at its discretion.

CATEGORY I – Name, address, telephone number, dates of attendance, class.

CATEGORY II – Previous institution(s) attended, major field of study, awards, honors (including Dean's List), degree(s) conferred (including dates).

CATEGORY III – Past and present participation in officially recognized sports and other activities, physical factors (height, weight of athletes), date and place of birth.

Currently enrolled students may withhold disclosure of any category of information under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974. To withhold disclosure, written notification must be received in the Office of Records and Registration prior to the first day of classes of

the term you are enrolled at Alabama State University. Forms requesting the withholding of directory information are available in the Office of Records and Registration.

ASU assumes that failure on the part of any student to specifically request the withholding of categories of directory information indicates individual approval for disclosure.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Alabama State University complies with the provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, as amended.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) afford students certain rights with respect to their education records. These rights include:

(1) The right to inspect and review the student's education records within 45 days of the day the Alabama State University (ASU) receives a request for access.

A student should submit to the registrar a written request that identifies the record(s) the student wishes to inspect. The ASU official will make arrangements for access and notify the student of the time and place where the records may be inspected. If the records are not maintained by the ASU official to whom the request was submitted, that official shall advise the student of the correct official to whom the request should be addressed.

(2) The right to request the amendment of the student's education records that the student believes is inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy rights under FERPA.

A student who wishes to ask ASU to amend a record should write the ASU official responsible for the record, clearly identify the part of the record the student wants changed, and specify why it should be changed.

If ASU decides not to amend the record as requested, ASU will notify the student in writing of the decision and the student's right to a hearing regarding the request for amendment. Additional information regarding the hearing procedures will be provided to the student when notified of the right to a hearing.

(3) The right to provide written consent before ASU discloses personally identifiable information from the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent.

ASU discloses education records without a student's prior written consent under the FERPA exception for disclosure to school officials with legitimate educational interests. A school official is a person employed by ASU in an administrative, supervisory, academic or research, or support staff position (including law enforcement unit personnel and health staff); a person or company with whom the ASU has contracted as its agent to provide a service instead of using ASU's employees or officials (such as an attorney, auditor, or collection agent); a person

serving on the Board of Trustees; or a student serving on an official committee, such as a disciplinary or grievance committee, or assisting another school official in performing his or her tasks.

A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review an education record in order to fulfill his or her professional responsibilities for ASU. Upon request, ASU also discloses education records without consent to officials of another school in which a student seeks or intends to enroll. FERPA requires an institution to make a reasonable attempt to notify each student of these disclosures unless the institution states in its annual notification that it intends to forward records on request.

(4) The right to file a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education concerning alleged failures by ASU to comply with the requirements of FERPA. The name and address of the Office that administers FERPA is:

Campus Security

The University makes available upon request to both currently enrolled and prospective students and in the case of the campus crime report prospective employees. This report includes statistics for the previous three years concerning reported crimes that occurred on-campus; in certain off-campus buildings or property owned or controlled by ASU; and public property within or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The report also includes institutional policies concerning campus security, such as sexual assault, and other matters. Concurrent Enrollment with Other Colleges and Universities

Students planning to register at ASU and simultaneously at any other institution of higher learning must receive written permission prior to actual enrollment. Failure to do so will jeopardize acceptance of concurrent credits by ASU. Applications for concurrent registration may be obtained from the Office of Records and Registration.

Applications are processed when the completed forms are received by the student's adviser and approved by his/her dean.

To receive credit for the courses taken, an official transcript must be sent by the college/university to the

Office of Admissions and Recruitment at ASU. This request must be made by the student.

A certified copy of the form will be sent to the institution named.

Transient Credit from Other Institutions

A student currently enrolled at ASU and planning to attend another institution as a transient student must receive written permission from his/her academic adviser, department chairperson and dean prior to actual enrollment. Failure to do so will jeopardize the acceptance of transient credits by ASU. To receive credit, a student must be in good academic standing.

To determine the acceptability of the credits, an official transcript must be sent by the institution to the Office of Records and Registration at ASU. This request must be made by the student. While approval may be given to enroll in the course(s), a candidate for the bachelor's degree must be in attendance at ASU the last two semesters, unless excused by the dean. Approval is given on a semester basis.

Transient credit forms may be picked up in the Office of Records and Registration, Council Hall 27.

Adviser Assignments Undergraduate Students

Freshmen, transfers and all other students who have not declared a major should contact the Academic Advisement Center, G.W. Trenholm Hall 200, for assignment of advisers.

Continuing and returning undergraduate students should consult the chairpersons of their major departments or curriculum advisers as shown in the Directory of Undergraduate Major Advisers.

Undergraduate special students (degree-seeking) should report to their academic advisers, complete the registration forms and proceed to the ASU Acadome to complete the registration process.

Transient and non-degree-seeking students should select courses from the class schedule, complete the schedule request form and proceed to the ASU Acadome for registration. An adviser's signature is not required for a visiting student. Such students are responsible for self-advisement.

Cancellation of Courses

The institution reserves the privilege of canceling any undergraduate course in which fewer than 10 students have enrolled and of closing or dividing sections whenever it is deemed that the interest of the students will be better served.

To curtail identity theft when using a student's Social Security Number (SSN) as the student identifier, the university is preparing to use an alternate identifier for use and disclosure of records, including transcripts, unprotected registration documents, grade posting, etc. Students will be notified when the switch is made. Procedures for making the change will be forthcoming.
