

## **Entry Requirements**



#### Do I have the right qualifications?

Here at the University of Liverpool, we recognise a wide range of international qualifications. You will notice that our Undergraduate Prospectus lists the typical entry requirements for programmes in terms of A Levels. These are the qualifications that UK students usually take to enter university. Don't worry if you don't have A Levels. Our website www.liv.ac.uk/international/countries/ will give a better understanding of the international qualifications that are accepted as alternatives to A Levels.

## What if my qualifications are not acceptable?

Many countries have a different system to that of the UK. This means that some students may require further preparation before they start their undergraduate programme.

If you are in this position you may be eligible for the Foundation Certificate course at Liverpool International College, located on our campus.

#### **Liverpool International College**

The Foundation Certificate programme at Liverpool International College is designed to prepare you for entry to an undergraduate degree in a number of subject areas.

There are two pathways for the Certificate:

- Business, Law and Social Sciences or
- Science and Engineering

On successful completion of the programme, you are guaranteed progression to the first year of an appropriate degree programme at the University of Liverpool. Please see the Liverpool International College website for details: www.livic.org.uk

## **English Language Requirements**

To ensure that all students have the necessary communication skills to successfully complete an undergraduate degree, every student (UK or international) requires a suitable English language qualification for entry.

The level of English required is not the same for every programme - Medicine and Law, for example, require a higher level of English than Engineering.

The table opposite shows the main English qualifications we accept and the scores required for different types of programmes. If your qualification is not in this table it may still be acceptable – check the full list on our website at: www.liv.ac.uk/international/countries/

## How to Apply

All students applying for an undergraduate programme do so through UCAS (the Universities and Colleges Admissions Service).

This is a central online application system allowing students to apply for up to five courses in the UK via one application. Students would normally apply for a specific programme at five different universities, but you can apply for more than one programme at a specific university. For example, you could apply for Politics at Liverpool as well as International Politics and Policy at Liverpool.

### **Tuition Fees**

## All students are charged a fee to study at university in the UK.

British and EU students pay a 'home' student fee with the UK Government also providing funding to the University. International students pay an 'overseas' fee which will be higher than the home fee as the University does

#### **Fixed Fee Guarantee**

The University offers a fixed fee guarantee for all full time undergraduate students from outside the European Union (EU) (except those studying Medicine or Dentistry). This means that your tuition fees will not increase during your studies enabling you to plan your finances effectively. ## **Scholarships and Awards**

The University of Liverpool offers a range of scholarships and awards for international students. Our new Regional Awards are available to *all non-clinical* undergraduate students and offer a tuition fee reduction of £1,000. Some scholarships such as the Vice-Chancellor's and International Baccalaureate (IB) Scholarships are merit-based and unlimited. This means that all students that meet the criteria are guaranteed the scholarship and this will be confirmed in offer letters.

Other awards and scholarships have very specific eligibility criteria for students from certain countries or those applying for particular programmes. The table below outlines the details of all the scholarships available for undergraduate students at the time of going to print. ## **Living Costs**

#### **Living Costs Per Year**

We estimate that you will need between £5,500 - £7,000 per year for your daily living expenses including accommodation, food and local travel. Of course this will vary according to your lifestyle.

**Example of Approximate Weekly Costs** 

As an undergraduate medical student Koay Yee Mei from Brunei spent around £6,000 in her first year. She was in Liverpool for around 38 weeks and, on a weekly basis, she would spend around £111 on hall fees which covered 2 meals a day; around £11 on a weekly bus pass; £5-10 on study costs (photocopying, printing etc); £5 cell phone charges; £4 on laundry and between £10 and £30 on other food and entertainment costs (depending on how many social activities she got involved in). Mei also spent £92 on an annual sports centre membership and bought a number of key text books for £100 at the beginning of the year.

## **Careers and Employability**

## Careers and Employability Service for International Students

The University has a dedicated careers service which provides assistance to all students as well as specialised resources and workshops for international students. The Careers and Employability Service provides advice and guidance on:

- Career options
- Work experience
- Graduate opportunities
- Specialised help with job search techniq such as CVs, applications and interviews

The Careers and Employability Service won several major awards at the 2009 UK Conference of the Association of Graduate Careers Advisory Services (AGCAS), including the AGCAS International Award. This award was for demonstrating an outstanding commitment and contribution to working with international students, relevant employers and promoting internationalisation.

Dr Paul Redmond, Head of Careers and Employability, said "This is a fantastic achievement for the team and a great recognition of the many innovative and forward-thinking initiatives that we are currently engaged in at the University. We set out to be the best careers service in the country and, while we are not resting on our laurels, these awards suggest we're on the right track".

Employability for graduates from the University of Liverpool has been good, with over 90% of our graduates in employment or further study six months after graduation (Destination of Leavers from Higher Education Survey 2006/07). Of the international qualifiers, 97% of those in full time employment are working in a graduate level job. In addition, our graduate starting salaries are the highest in the north west of England, according to The Sunday Times University Guide 2008.

Employers regularly come to the University to talk about the opportunities they offer to University of Liverpool students and graduates. Some of the many companies who visit are Rolls Royce, KPMG, Corus, Toyota, Procter & Gamble, Atkins Global, PricewaterhouseCoopers, Arup, Ernst & Young, Deloitte and Airbus.

We also hold key employer events throughout the year to highlight graduate recruitment in our general career fair and 'Limelight' events when we focus on a particular sector, such as Engineering, Law, IT, Earth and Ocean Sciences and part-time jobs.

To ensure that programmes of study offered meet the needs of the commercial sector the majority of departments have strong relationships with industry. The nature of these links will vary. There is also a strong focus on networking and links with alumni. Many courses at the University will also include guest lecturers and students are taught by a mix of methods which in departments such as Engineering and the Management School will include case studies and working on real life projects.

## **Working while you Study**

International students are legally allowed to work for up to 20 hours per week during term time. However, the University recommends that students work a maximum of 15 hours per week to ensure that your studies are not affected. During University vacations you are allowed to work full-time.

#### How much can I earn?

The current minimum wage in the UK for people aged 18-21 is £4.77 per hour, with people aged 22 or over being paid £5.73 per hour. The following calculations give an indication of how much you could potentially earn during term time and during university vacations

#### **During term time**

Weekly income for an 18 year old working 15 hours per week for minimum wage:  $£4.77 \times 15 = £71.55$ 

Weekly income for a 22 year old working 15 hours per week for minimum wage:  $£5.73 \times 15 = £85.95$ 

#### **During agreed vacation time**

Weekly income for an 18 year old working full time (35 hours per week) for minimum wage:  $£4.77 \times 35 = £166.95$ 

Weekly income for a 22 year old working 35 hours per week for minimum wage:  $£5.73 \times 35 = £200.55$ 

It is important to be aware that any earnings you make in the UK through part-time jobs will supplement your living costs, but cannot be relied on as a source of financial support. You will need to prove that you have all tuition fees and living costs in your bank account before you apply for your visa, and this is especially true now under the new immigration rules. Employment in the UK as a student is mainly for experience and the opportunity to be involved with UK society.

#### Jobs and events

The University of Liverpool has its own 'Student Development Team' on campus to help students find part-time and voluntary work. This team manages the 'Jobs and Events' website which advertises part-time jobs available for students both on and off the University campus. #### International Student Ambassadors

Every year the International Office recruits around 20 students to work as Ambassadors. Ambassadors work alongside the International Recruitment and Relations Team to help provide advice and information to prospective international students. Ambassadors are given an opportunity to get involved in all kinds of interesting projects, including enquiry handling, welcome events, representing the University at exhibitions and events, and providing services for offer holders.

## Working in the UK after you Graduate

#### Tier 1 (Post-Study Work)

All international students who successfully complete their UK undergraduate or postgraduate degree courses are able to apply to stay in the UK for two years and work full-time. Most types of work can be undertaken once you have this visa. This scheme replaces the International Graduate Scheme. It is a points based scheme and in order to obtain the visa you must fulfil certain requirements.

## **Support and Facilities**

Alongside the services mentioned in this guide, there is an extremely wellestablished network of support and facilities available to our students.

#### **Library and Computer Facilities**

The University's libraries are open 24 hours on weekdays during term time and throughout the academic year.

You can also access the University's centralised IT network, and the software it provides, 24/7, either at home or via computers all around the campus.

#### Accommodation

If you're leaving home for the first time, don't worry, the Accommodation Office Team will make sure you have everything you need to feel right at home. You can choose from various Halls of Residence on three separate sites – on campus or nearby.

We guarantee to provide single international students with accommodation provided that they have applied online through the Accommodation website by 31st July 2010.

#### **Sport Liverpool**

One of the great things about going to university is the chance to take up new interests. Sports and leisure activities are a good example.

University sports facilities include:

- The Sports and Fitness Centre, which houses a 33-metre swimming pool, two sports halls, four squash courts and a dance studio
- 10 senior football pitches, four rugby union, one rugby league, and one lacrosse pitch


