<u>Definitions of Instructional Delivery Formats</u>

Blended Courses

Blended classes are a combination of Internet and classroom learning. Students will complete some of the required work online and some in a classroom setting. If you are interested in enrolling in a blended class, please contact the academic department to inquire about course requirements.

DL Courses

Athens State offers credit courses that are available on Blackboard via the University's web site: www.athens.edu. An Athens State University faculty member serves as the instructor for the course, and upon completion of the course, the student receives credit equivalent to an on-campus course.

To take advantage of an online course, each student must have access to a computer with Internet access. The courses are delivered over the Internet and you communicate with your instructor via email. The content of the course and the workload are no different from that of regular on-campus courses. The classes meet in "cyberspace" via your computer and your Internet connection.

Traditional Courses

Meet in class according to the required number of hours with no additional work on the Internet.

Learning Management Systems Online Testing Technologies

Athens State University's *Distance Learning Policy (1600-0907)*, Part II, Section J, Testing Policies, requires the use of Acxiom by all instructors giving online exams, which adds a much more reliable level of security than the use of usernames and passwords only. The use of LockDown Browser and/or Tegrity's Remote Proctor as additional levels of security to ensure the integrity and protection of online assessments is presently considered optional and left to the discretion of each instructor.

In addition to the simple combination of user names & passwords to secure student accounts on the institution's Learning Management System (LMS), Athens State currently uses a combination of three additional technologies to ensure the integrity of all online testing through the LMS (**Blackboard Learn™**). Acxiom Identify-X[™] Verify

All instructors giving exams online are required to enable Acxiom on two (2) exams (normally the midterm and final exams) for each course they teach to verify student identities. Each student has a 50% chance of being presented with a list of 3-4 customized identity challenge questions based upon the name and address they provide upon clicking on the link to take their tests. Each question has a selection of five (5) possible multiple choice answers, including "None of the Above". Each question is composed from public records stored on the student inside Acxiom's database of more than 32 Billion records, the same technology used in the online banking industry to verify identities online. Examples of possible questions include "What month were you born in?", "What is your current Zip Code?", and "What year did you graduate from high school?". Any student failing the identify verification process automatically triggers a failure notice to their instructor as well as the Blackboard System Administrator. Website: www.Acxiom.com

Respondus LockDown Browser™

LockDown Browser is a custom browser students download from the Athens State University website which "locks down" the testing environment within Blackboard. Once inside LockDown Browser, students are prohibited by the software to print, copy & paste, go to external websites, or access other software applications during the examination process. Any open software applications which LockDown perceives as intrusive to the exam process (i.e. Skype, AOL Instant Messenger, etc.) are required by LockDown to be closed before the examination process is allowed to proceed. • Tegrity Remote Proctor

Tegrity's Remote Proctor feature captures all screen activity in Blackboard during an exam, as well as video of the student taking their exam. The student is required to show his/her student ID to the camera before taking an exam. This is to confirm their identity to the instructor who will later review the video in high-speed playback after the student uploads their exam upon completion. The software requires both a webcam and microphone to be operational on the student's computer and captures all activity during the examination process. The student cannot pause the recording during the exam. Website: www.Tegrity.com

- 3. Blended courses may require student physical presence on campus, mostly for test-taking purposes. However, instructors may arrange for online exams using available test-taking technologies. Refer to the current term's Class Schedule (not to be confused with the 2-Yr Master Class Schedule for Online Degree Programs) and your instructor for specific instructions regarding blended courses.
