Located in one of the great world capitals, Richmond distinguishes itself as a truly international University by enrolling students from over 100 countries.

The University's academic programs, which encompass business, communications, international relations and the arts, reflects the American tradition of the Liberal Arts Core Curriculum.

Internationalism is fundamental to the mission and teaching philosophy of the University. Richmond has campuses in two of London's most appealing communities: Richmond-upon-Thames and Kensington. Upper-division students typically relocate to the campus in Kensington, Central London, where graduate studies are also pursued.

Richmond is accredited in the US and validated in the UK. Offering a unique American education in a British setting for a comprehensive and profoundly awakening university degree experience.

#### Richmond's Mission

Richmond educates a multi-cultural student body in the American Liberal Arts tradition, and provides its students with the intellectual and personal skills that will enable them to exercise influence and succeed in an increasingly interdependent and evolving world. The University prepares to graduate students who possess a world perspective and awareness that includes an understanding of cultural distinctions. #### Meet the Founder



SIR CYRIL TAYLOR

A history honors degree graduate of Trinity Hall, Cambridge, with an MBA from Harvard University, Sir Cyril is the founder and chief executive of the American Institute for Foreign Study which annually serves over 50,000 students. Sir Cyril served in various senior positions on the Greater London Council and was High Sheriff of Greater London in 1996.

He was knighted by Her Majesty the Queen for services to education in 1989. He was awarded an honor for services to Education in the 2004 New Year's Honors' List as the Knights Grand Cross of the Order of the British Empire.

#### AN AMERICAN EDUCATION

Richmond's degree programs are built on the American Liberal Arts Core Curriculum model which is followed by all undergraduates, the broad based approach helps students develop a platform from which a successful career is launched.

Globalization is a long-standing academic theme at Richmond. A student is exposed to a globalized world by simply sitting in the classroom and interacting with a student body that is made-up of students from over 100 countries, ensuring that real life experience from all corners of the globe are brought into the classroom.



#### Meet the President



PROFESSOR JOHN ANNETTE

Professor John Annette held the position of Pro Vice-Master, Lifelong Learning and Engagement (2008) at Birkbeck College, University of London prior to taking up the post of President at Richmond. He holds a BA(Hons) in History and Philosophy from Fordham University and a PhD from the London School of Economics and Political Science.

In 1981 he moved to Middlesex University as a Lecturer in History and became a Senior Lecturer in 1983. In 1986 he was appointed Head of the History Division and between 1987 and 1990 held the post of Head of the Middlesex Polytechnic Summer School. He became Head of the School of History in 1988 and Head of the School of History and Politics in 1990. He was appointed Professor of Modern History and Politics in 1995 and became Assistant Dean/Director of Curriculum, Learning and Quality in the School of Social Science in 1997.

In 1998 he became Professor of Citizenship and Political Studies and was appointed Director of the Institute for Community Development and Learning in 2001.

## GLOBALLY MINDED EDUCATORS

Among Richmond's faculty are professors who have studied and lectured around the world. This makes them particularly responsive to a range of backgrounds, cultures and ideas. Well qualified and well informed, they bring their research interests into an intimate and dynamic classroom environment.

Each faculty member acts as an Academic Advisor to a number of students in their subject area. Advisors meet with students on an individual basis, and assist with course work and course selection, and place students in contact with leaders in their field of interest.

#### RICHMOND

The University's splendid six-acre site at the top of Richmond Hill is a five minute walk from the 2,500 acres of Richmond Park, famous for its herds of deer. It is also located in one of London's most attractive boroughs.

For hundreds of years, Richmond has been a favorite retreat of Royalty and the rich and famous. The River Thames runs through the heart of the borough for 21 miles, linking Hampton Court Palace, Richmond town center and Kew Gardens with central London.

Right on the University's doorstep is a living museum of historic houses, theatres, and galleries rich with exhibits. The town centers are bursting with shops, restaurants and a busy night life, which combine to enhance the students' university experience.

First – and second- year students reside and study at the University's Richmond Hill neo-gothic campus which dates back to 1843, when it was founded as Richmond College.

Also found at the Richmond Hill Campus are the science laboratories and auditorium, as well as student residences, a dining hall, and the student common room. The Taylor Library not only houses an impressive multi-level library, but also contains the university's lecture halls and a Starbucks Café.

#### KENSINGTON

Third-year, fourth-year and graduate students study at Richmond's central London campus in the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea. The buildings on the Kensington campus house a library, computing facilities and art studios. The Center for New Media incorporates a video studio with editing suite and a photography studio with darkrooms. Students live in University buildings or off-campus in housing of their choice.

Nestled in the heart of Kensington are world-renowned museums. In addition to its museums and galleries, opportunities abound in this area for other extracurricular learning experiences such as lectures, exhibitions, seminars and special interest group meetings.

The campus is also surrounded by places of enormous historical, architectural and cultural interest. Kensington High Street, with its lively mix of shops, restaurants, cafés, pubs, night clubs and cinemas, is just around the corner. And Knightsbridge, which is a short walk away, is home to the famous shops of Harrods and Harvey Nichols.

"Students can travel between the Richmond and Kensington campuses by "tube" – London's underground system."



## THE LIBERAL ARTS CORE CURRICULUM

## ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

The Liberal Arts Core Curriculum is based on the educational philosophy, that the most important aspect of becoming well-educated is to have a broad base of knowledge. Thus, Richmond's first three semesters encourage exploration of a wide range of subjects and skills – all of them key to the success of leaders in virtually every professional field.

The themes of globalization and leadership are central to the fabric of the learning experience at Richmond. Both the coursework and the institutional culture, in and out of the classroom, support the University's long-standing commitment to helping students become competent on the world stage.

#### The First Year Program

Richmond's faculty and student affairs professionals help students through the transitional period of their first year. Whether a student has lived and studied in a number of different countries or this is the first time that they have studied abroad, whether they come to Richmond with many transfer credits or none, the university recognizes the importance of the "First Year Experience". Richmond has designed a program to help all new students adjust successfully to the academic, social and cultural demands of university life. Students work closely with the faculty in the First Year Seminars and alongside fellow students involved in the Student Leadership Program, where they gain knowledge and develop skills that will serve them well into their futures.

The University's academic areas are divided into three departments: Arts and Sciences; Business and Economics; and, Humanities, Social Sciences, and Communications.

The degree programs reflect the main strands of the University's mission: its commitment to liberal arts, multiculturalism and to the employability of its graduates. In addition, each subject area teaches the students the concepts of leadership and globalization through an intercultural educational experience. By using London as the classroom, subjects such as: History and Art, Design and Media become alive in the museums that students visit. International Relations and Politics students spend time visiting NATO, the United Nations headquarters in Belgium and sit in on live Parliamentary discussions. These experiences combine to offer a view of the interconnected globalized world they will navigate after graduation.

Whether the aim is to acquire specific technical skills, crucial transferable ones or a combination of both, the teaching approach at Richmond stimulates students to read, think, explore ideas, question, debate and to bring their excitement and ideas into the classroom.

## UNDERGRADUATE DEGREE PROGRAMS AT A GLANCE

- BA Art, Design and Media
- BA (Hons) Creative Arts and Communications: Art, Design and Media with Combined Studies

Art, design and media play a crucial role in shaping the world's future. Against the changing international backdrop of rapidly advancing technologies and the constant influx of new ideas, the degree prepares the student for a creative career in one of the many branches of art, design and media. It is designed to reflect contemporary practice in which ideas, technical skills, and theory interact to produce original and creative work. The degree features a range of studio and digital courses including 2D, 3D, and still and moving image studies culminating in two Senior year exhibitions.

- BA Business Administration: Finance
- BA (Hons) Business Administration: Finance with Combined Studies

Finance is an exciting and fast-changing field, financial institutions are continually inventing new ways to manage and invest funds, and they are seeking talented graduates to meet the new demands. Successful financial experts are quantitative, competitive, and articulate. The degree focuses on concepts, principles and practices that investigate the ways in which risk, return, and value interact in the global business world. To attract investors, the company must create and increase its value. Finance includes the study of corporate financial management, as well as financial institutions and capital markets, and the raising and investing of funds.

- BA Business Administration: International Business
- BA (Hons) Business Administration:
   International Business with combined Studies

International Business prepares students for managerial positions in international profit and non-profit organizations. The degree addresses issues such as setting organizational mission and goals, how to allocate a company's resources, meeting business obligations and fostering social responsibility. It focuses on managing people, diversity in culture, and ways of conducting business in a global marketplace. Courses cover human and organizational behavior in the workplace, global financial markets, global marketing, entrepreneurship, social responsibility, and multinational management strategy.

- BA Business Administration: Marketing
- BA (Hons) Business Administration: Marketing with Combined Studies

Marketing outlines to the student that the long-term success of an organization depends on its ability to offer value in its products and services. The degree empowers the student with a strategic framework for organizational marketing decisions. Fundamental to the development of valuable exchanges are the abilities to match market opportunities to an organization's goals and capabilities; to understand and analyze consumer needs; and to design cost-effective delivery of value to the customer in a changing and competitive environment.

- BA Communications
- BA (Hons) Creative Arts and Communications with Combined Studies

Communications prepares students to work within the technologically driven, global, communication revolution of the 21st Century. The degree provides an interdisciplinary, multimedia approach to the study of communications through the study of the relationship between communications theory and its practice. The student will study the three main components of communication: personal, corporate and mass. This will be referred to through the concepts of globalization and intercultural issues.

- BA Economics
- o BA (Hons) Economics with Combined Studies

Economics prepares the student for career opportunities as professional economist in business, banking and finance, public administration, government service, international financial institutions, and the NGO sector. This degree creates awareness in the student around important economic issues that have both national and international importance. The student will engage in a major individual research project.

- BA History
- BA (Hons) History with Combines Studies

History demonstrates how the past has impacted upon, and shaped, the present. The degree provides a broad base of historical knowledge in the first year, upon which is built a gradually more complex and more specific understanding of key historical themes and periods. The curriculum emphasizes varied methodological approaches to the discipline, ranging historically from the ancient and medieval worlds to contemporary political and cultural issues, such as imperialism propaganda, fascism, racism and nationalism. In doing so it strives to foster research and scholarship in historical enquiry.

- BA International Journalism and Media
- o Under Consideration

International Journalism and Media prepares the student to work within the technologically driven, global media environment of the 21st Century and helps the student to develop as a leader in their chosen career and community. The degree provides an interdisciplinary, multimedia approach to the study of several aspects of journalism, media and public relations, and through its core courses and special programs develops an intercultural and global awareness within the framework of the liberal arts tradition.

- BA International Relations
- BA (Hons) Social Sciences: International Relations with Combines Studies

International Relations prepares the student for careers in government, international organizations, business, finance and the media, which require articulate, clear thinking individuals with a grasp of contemporary political issues, succinct writing styles, and the ability to present complex arguments. The degree is built on three core areas of International Relations – theoretical and conceptual approaches, actors and institutions on the global stage, and engagement with issues and problems facing the world. Students also take a range of optional courses in regional studies or addressing thematic areas allowing specialization in the aspects of International Relations, allowing for specialization.

- BA Political Science
- BA (Hons) Social Sciences: Political Science with Combines Studies

Political Science prepares the student for work in government, international organizations, business, finance and the media, which require articulate, clear thinking individuals with a grasp of contemporary political issues, succinct writing styles, and the ability to present complex arguments. The degree is built on three core areas of political science: political thought, political systems and public policy. This is matched with a set of development politics courses, as well as focused courses in domestic and regional politics: American politics, British politics, and European politics. Students also take a range of optional courses in regional studies or addressing thematic areas, allowing for specialization.

- BA Psychology
- BA (Hons) Social Sciences: Psychology with Combined Studies

Psychology promotes the acquisition and demonstration of conceptual knowledge in the core areas of the Psychology discipline such as development, language, phenomenology, personality theory and individual differences, biological psychology, social and cross-cultural psychology and cognitive science. The student is expected to progressively integrate theoretical perspectives and empirical findings, use appropriately a variety of research approaches and apply psychological principles in a variety of professional settings such as clinical, counseling, educational and legal.

- BA Sociology
- Under Consideration

Sociology explores the culture of institutions from a distinctly 'social' point of view. The degree focuses on understanding of the meanings of culture and its roles in social life and the local, national and international social processes underpinning social change and behavior. The student will also develop sociological research methods and strategies to review their research. Sociology focuses on the relations that connect individuals, groups and institutions from an international perspective.

## INTERNSHIPS & SPECIAL PROGRAMS

#### Richmond International Internship Program

In an increasingly competitive world, a well-organized internship represents a major advantage in the graduate job market, especially when that experience is gained in London – the world's leading business and financial center.

At Richmond, internships combine an academic program with the opportunity to work in a major British or international organization, while also allowing students to earn academic credit towards graduation.

#### **International Study Centers**

Students can complement their studies in London with a semester, year or summer session in Italy at the University's international study centers in Florence and Rome.

Courses are offered in the Italian language, fine art, studio art, business and social sciences.

## Richmond International Academic Soccer Academy (RIASA)

RIASA is based in Leeds, UK, where skilled soccer players with a desire to achieve professionalism in the sport have the opportunity to gain a degree in BA International Business with Sports. Successful completion of the strong undergraduate academic program will enable graduates to either pursue careers as sports professional or gain employment in associated business professions.

#### Visiting Program for University Students

Visiting students thrive in Richmond's international atmosphere, with the opportunities that it offers to learn in a multicultural setting and experience London life. As the University is fully accredited, courses can be approved for credit transfer to home institutions. More than 350 students from various universities usually enroll for a semester, summer session or academic year.

#### **Summer Programs**

Richmond's summer sessions offer the opportunity to take extra courses. Students seeking to broaden their understanding of a particular academic discipline or explore an area of interest in greater detail are encouraged to enroll in the University's summer sessions. Summer sessions also permit students to accelerate their progress towards graduation.

#### Academic Literacies Program (ALP)

The mission of the ALP is to empower students to communicate effectively, proficiently and appropriately throughout their undergraduate studies and beyond. To achieve this, there is a strong emphasis upon critical thinking and reading, and analysis and evaluation. These core skills are essential for academic success irrespective of the students major.

She has since been offered a position within the UN organization.

Veronika commented that as an IR student the international student body was beneficial to her experience. She interacted with students and professors from different cultural background with a varying opinions and views on the same topic. This has helped her widen her global perspective. Richmond provided her with remarkable opportunities during her 1-year graduate program in London.

## UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS

#### **Gaining Admission**

All applications are reviewed holistically, that is, each individual application is not examined solely upon the academic achievements of the applicant, but key to the evaluation is the way in which the student demonstrates an ability to participate and contribute in his or her current spheres of influence. This ensures that the decision that the University makes in supporting the admission of a student, is based on a clear and detailed impression as to whether or not the applicant is well-matched for the academic rigors, as well as the international social demands of life at Richmond.

To be considered for admission, students should have completed 11 or 12 years of schooling, depending on the education system in their country, with a minimum of C+ (2.5 out of 4.0) in the American high school grading system.

The average GPA of Richmond Freshmen is 3.25 (out of 4.0) on the American scale.

If applicants have one of the qualifications listed immediately following, they will be considered as advanced students. This may entitle them to university credits, which will reduce the number of courses they need to complete in order to graduate. **Please Note:** If an applicant's qualification is not mentioned in the list below, he or she should contact the Admissions Office for more information:

- A-levels
- French Baccalaureate
- International Baccalaureate
- Advanced Placement Examinations

Notification of a decision should be received within approximately four weeks of a completed application and supporting documents being submitted to the Admissions Office.

#### When to apply

Each academic year comprises two semesters and two summer sessions.

The Fall semester is September to December. The Spring semester is January to May. Summer sessions are in May and June.

Priority deadlines for applications are: 1 March for the Fall semester (the deposit deadline is 1 May) 1 November for the Spring semester (the deposit deadline is 1 December).

#### How to apply

Apply direct to Richmond Or through UCAS (code R20)

- Step 1: Complete the *application* form or apply online at www.richmond.ac.uk
- Step 2: Send *official transcripts* of secondary and postsecondary school results/records, and copies of your TOEFL or IELTS scores. Official translations must be provided in English.
- Step 3: Provide the *academic reference* from a teacher or guidance counselor.
- Step 4: Write a *personal statement* (details are on the application form).
- Step 5: Include SAT or ACT scores (optional). Richmond's ACT code is 5244. CEEB/ATP code is 0823L.
- Step 6: Enclose the non-refundable application fee.

#### Language Requirements

Students must be proficient in university level english. If English is not the first language of the student, then a TOEFL or IELTS test result must be submitted. The Admissions Office cannot issue a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) unless the TOEFL or IELTS scores have been submitted. All students take the Richmond English Language Placement Test on arrival. Please contact the admissions office or view the website for more information.

#### Applying through UCAS

Richmond's UCAS code is R20.

The UCAS system allows candidates to apply to Richmond and up to five other British universities simultaneously. Students can apply online at <a href="http://www.ucas.com">http://www.ucas.com</a>. UCAS applicants will receive official notification of the admission decision through the UCAS system.

#### Applying for a Visa

Upon receipt of the confirmation deposit and a copy of the students' valid passport, the Admissions Office will send the Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number which is used to apply for the student visa. All students should check with the nearest British Embassy or High Commission for visa requirements for the United Kingdom. For online information look at www.ukvisas.gov.uk

#### Scholarships and Financial Assistance

#### Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded to Richmond students who qualify on the basis of academic ability. Consideration is given to those who demonstrate exceptional academic and extracurricular achievement. If applicants require scholarship assistance, they should contact the Admissions Office for further information. Scholarship Awards cannot cover accommodation, living expenses or travel. Students are advised to apply to the University before the priority application deadline, the 1st March.

#### Financial Assistance

Students may apply for scholarships or loans from external sources. Many governments provide some assistance for study at Richmond. UK and European Union residents are usually eligible for a partial tuition fee loan.

US citizens and eligible permanent residents of the US are eligible for Federal Direct, PLUS Loans, and also private loans. These loans may cover expenses beyond institutional charges i.e. assist with living expenses. To access the US Federal programs, students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This can be completed online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Richmond's US Title IV code is G10594. #### Academic Background

Applicants to the Master of Arts degree programs must have successfully completed a bachelor's degree in the related discipline. All applications will be evaluated individually and students without the requisite undergraduate major may be required to complete up to four undergraduate courses at Richmond before acceptance into the Masters programs, of their choice, can be granted.

#### **Professional Statement**

The graduate admission office seeks students who are committed to engaging in serious research and who demonstrate a curiosity and interest in inter-cultural issues. Therefore, all applicants must submit a Professional Statement of 1,500 words addressing their reasons for wishing to undertake a Masters Program at Richmond.
