WELCOME TO LIFE AT RICHMOND

Richmond welcomes parents to stay current on campus affairs and communicate with University officials on any matter of interest. Whilst we always encourage that students take responsibility for issues concerning their academic or personal matters, we understand that in certain situations parents may seek additional discussion or clarification with University staff.

This Parent Handbook provides a reference of people, places and telephone numbers as well as information about our facilities on campus and our residence halls. Please keep it near to your telephone, fax or computer and you will find it to be a good friend as you share advice with your son or daughter whilst at Richmond.

A large part of a student's transition to university is growing as an adult. We hope that you agree with us when we say that being an adult means that students take responsibility for their own issues, instead of asking mom or dad to do it for them! We ask you to encourage your student to speak directly to staff and faculty on campus first. Richmond happily operates a mainly open-door policy, allowing students easy access to most of the administrative offices on campus during office hours. If your student cannot solve the issue, of course we are always available to answer enquiries from parents regarding your son or daughter's welfare or progress. (Please note that we are not able to release certain information to parents/guardians without written consent from the student). Student Affairs staff is in communication with faculty and other staff members and can help you with almost any request. Staff who provides specific student services may also be contacted directly about special matters with the information included in this document. The University switchboard can put you in touch with any administrator or faculty member at either campus (Richmond Hill or Kensington).

Please note that this Handbook is distributed only to parents of new students. It is the intent that you keep it for the entirety of your son or daughter's time as a student at Richmond, The American International University in London. We may update this document from year to year, so please contact us if you would like an updated copy.

CONTACTING STUDENTS AND UNIVERSITY OFFICIALS

There is a direct line (+44 (0) 20 8332 8200) to the switchboard in the University's Main Building on campus which serves as the largest residence hall. If your son or daughter plans to have a mobile phone while on campus, please obtain this number from your student. If you do not have their number, the University switchboard will take a message from you and attempt to contact your son or daughter via a RA/RD or via email. There are also direct lines (+44 (0) 20 prefix) for many offices on campus. Calls to offices may also go through the University switchboard. After-hours calls are handled by the University's Security Office.

RESIDENCE LIFE STAFF AT RICHMOND HILL CAMPUS

Residence Life staff at the Hill Campus report to Katherine Wells, Residence Life Coordinator. Her office is located next to the Student Affairs reception on the ground floor. Katherine is supported by a number of staff who live in the University residences. These staff members should be the first point of contact after office hours.

Two Resident Directors (RDs) serve the residential students living in the Main Building. Reporting to Resident Directors are Resident Advisors (RAs). RAs are assigned to specific corridors in the building and are the first point of contact for

students in a particular area. One RD serves the residents of Red House as well as Longley House. One RA is assigned to the Lower and Upper Cottages.

One RD serves the residents of Richmond's newest satellite building, Park View. One RD along with the Residence Life Coordinator also live in a second satellite building, Montford House, located just down Queens Road from the main campus.

BUILDING PROFILES ON THE RICHMOND HILL CAMPUS

Main Building

The Main Building can accommodate over 190 students. The facilities in the Main Building include 24-hour security, cafeteria, computer labs, mailboxes, a coffee shop, a fitness centre and a common room with cable TV. The Main Building also houses most classrooms and administrative offices. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Red House

Red House can accommodate 17 students in single and shared rooms. It offers shared toilets and showers, key code access and CCTV (Closed Circuit Television). Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Longley House

Longley House is home to just 5 students--all in single rooms. It offers shared toilets and showers, key code access and CCTV. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

The Cottages

The Upper and Lower Cottages house a total of 13 students in single and shared rooms. Both cottages offer shared toilets and showers, key code access and CCTV monitoring. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Montford House

Montford House is a satellite residence located on the corner of Queens Road and Marlborough Road, and houses 40 students. There are 10 flats for 4-6 people each with a kitchen and bathroom. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Park View

Park View is a satellite residence located on Queens Road--just a short walk from the Main Building and next door to Montford House. It houses 30 students in shared rooms with shared facilities including a common area with a kitchen. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

SUPPORT STAFF & SERVICES AT RICHMOND HILL CAMPUS

Counselling and Health Services

A professional mental health counsellor is available by appointment for all Richmond students. This service is offered for free, and each student is allowed a maximum of eight sessions per term. Students can contact the counsellor directly by obtaining thei contact details from the University website. Alternatively, students can book an appointment with the assistance of Student Affairs.

Students are covered for medical treatment under the National Health Service (NHS) and are encouraged to seek help at the local doctor's surgery. Student Affairs liaises

with Seymour Surgery and can help students book appointments for minor illness and injury. Pharmacies can also help in diagnosing minor problems such as colds or flu.

In all cases of severe injury or illness, students are advised to seek immediate help at the Accident and Emergency department at either Kingston Hospital or Middlesex Hospital. University staff will call an ambulance in case of emergency and are trained to handle these types of situations.

Security

The Richmond Hill campus offers 24-hour security in the Main Building, and the staff-team includes:

Geoff Piper, Security Manager and several additional Security Officers staffed on a rota.

RESIDENCE LIFE STAFF AT KENSINGTON

Kensington Residence Life staff report to Tracy Wills. A full staff of RDs and RAs also live on campus in each of the residential buildings.

Atlantic House has one RD and two RA's living on site. Ambassador House has one RD and two RAs, and Courtfield Gardens has one RD and two RAs. The Residence Life Coordinator is housed in Collingham Gardens and is available to assist students.

BUILDING PROFILES AT THE KENSINGTON CAMPUS

Atlantic House

Atlantic House is the centre for student activity in Kensington and is the main residence in Kensington. It can provide accommodation for 115 students. Single rooms are commonly allocated to RAs, MA students and graduating seniors. All rooms have sinks and there are shared shower facilities on each floor. The facilities in Atlantic House include 24-hour Security, library, computer lab, cafeteria, mailboxes, and a common room. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Ambassador House

Ambassador House is a five-minute walk from Atlantic House across Gloucester Road. The building provides accommodation for 73 students. Ambassador is full of character as all the rooms are of different shapes and sizes. Single rooms are normally allocated to RDs/RAs and graduating seniors. Ambassador has its own common room and traditionally develops a close-knit community. Wireless access is provided in all rooms and common areas.

Collingham Gardens

This residence currently provides room for 19 students in shared rooms. There are kitchen facilities and common spaces for students to enjoy. The building is about a 15 minute walk to Atlantic House with convenient transport links down the street. The neighbourhood, which is architecturally stunning, adds to the charm of this satellite building.

Courtfield Gardens

This residence currently provides rooms for just over 69 students in single and shared rooms. All rooms have en-suite bathrooms and small kitchens and have recently been refurbished to a very high standard. In addition, there is a shared common room with TV and wireless access in all rooms and common areas. As it is right around the corner from Collingham Gardens, the neighbourhood and surroundings are very attractive.

SUPPORT STAFF & SERVICES AT THE KENSINGTON CAMPUS

Health and Counselling Services

A professional mental health counsellor is available by appointment for all Richmond students. This service is offered for free, and each student is allowed a maximum of eight sessions per term. Students can contact the counsellor directly by obtaining thei contact details from the University website. Alternatively, students can book an appointment with the assistance of Student Affairs.

Students are covered for medical treatment under the National Health Service (NHS) and are encouraged to seek help at the local doctor's surgery. Pharmacies can also help in diagnosing minor problems such as colds or flu. Student Affairs liaises with Scarsdale Villas Surgery and can help students to book appointments for minor illness and injury. In all cases of severe injury or illness, students are advised to seek immediate help at the Accident and Emergency department at Cromwell Hospital or the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital. University staff will call an ambulance in case of emergency and are trained to handle these types of situations.

Security

Richmond operates 24-hour security coverage based in Atlantic House and carries out regular patrols of the other Kensington Campus buildings. Atlantic House offers 24-hour security.

GENERAL SERVICES FOR BOTH CAMPUSES

Dining and Catering Services

All students living on campus receive a University Identification card, which allows for meals to be taken in the dining hall if this is included in their housing arrangements. Students who do not live in University housing but would like to put money on their id card and use it on a pay-as-you-go scheme, are advised to see the Catering department on either campus.

[Please note that meal times may change to accommodate campus activities during the year or during study and exam days.]

Regular meal times are as follows:

Common Rooms

Some of the University's residences have their own common rooms. Common rooms are areas where students can socialise, relax, and watch TV or DVDs without disturbing the rest of the residents in the building. In the Main Building at the Richmond Hill campus, a coffee shop is open throughout the week and sells light

meals, drinks and snacks. Each of these common rooms are non-smoking facilities and are monitored by CCTV for security purposes.

Accommodation During Holidays and Break Periods

University residences do not close during Fall or Spring break or over the long Easter weekend. The University does close over the Winter break between the end of the Fall Semester and the start of the Spring Semester. Accommodation during this vacation period should be requested and paid for in advance as there will be an additional charge. There is no guarantee of accommodation to late applicants. As summer is a busy time at Richmond, students who will be staying in London are advised to seek holiday accommodation off campus. The office of Residence Life has information regarding seasonal accommodation for students.

Storage During Break Periods

No storage is available during breaks at the Richmond Hill or Kensington campuses. If your student has a large amount of items for storage, there are local companies that offer very reasonable rates and will collect storage and return it to campus. Further information on storage is available from Student Affairs.

Telephones

Outgoing phone calls via payphones are available to all students either in their residence or in the local vicinity. Increasingly these services are not being used as almost all (if not all!) students own mobile phones. We find that mobile phones and email are the best ways to contact students. Incoming phone service is only available in certain residence halls.

Atlantic House at the Kensington Campus and the Main Building at the Hill Campus have phone extensions in student room corridors. In order to minimise noise on residential corridors during Quiet Hours (between 12:00am and 8:00 am) calls will not be transferred to these corridor phones. Emergency calls between those times should be made through reception. Due to the limitations of the system, we cannot provide an incoming phone service in satellite residences.
