In 2009 Richmond, the American International University in London partnered with the International Academic and Soccer Academy to form a joint venture known as Richmond International Academic and Soccer Academy (RIASA). RIASA brings together the best in American business education and British sports training. It offers students with a keen interest and skills in soccer to undertake a strong academic program, assisting them to achieve professionalism in their chosen sport. Successful completion of the program will enable graduates to find careers as professional sports persons, coaches and in associated business professions. Today, soccer is above all, an international business and this joint program is the stepping stone to a great future.

Richmond's home campuses are located in two of London's most appealing communities: Richmond upon-Thames and Kensington. RIASA is located in Leeds, which is in close proximity to the other major UK cities of York, Bradford, Manchester, and Sheffield. It lies on an easy rail route half way between London and Edinburgh, Scotland.

Fundamental to the University's mission is the theme of internationalism, this is evident in the teaching philosophy and classroom dynamic. Richmond is regionally accredited in the US, by Middle States Commission on Higher Education, Richmond's American education in a British setting offers a comprehensive and profoundly awakening university degree experience, for a global future.

He held presidencies at North Carolina Wesleyan College (2001-2007) and at Mount Allison University in New Brunswick, Canada (1991-2001). In 1999 he was elected a Fellow of the Roya Historical Society of Great Britain.

Dr. Newbould received his Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Western Ontario (Canada), his Master of Arts from the University of Guelph (Canada) and his PhD. from the University of Manchester (England).

WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN AREA

RIASA is located in Leeds, in the Metropolitan Area of West Yorkshire and near the major cities of Bradford, Manchester, and Sheffield. It is considered one of the top university areas in all of the UK with over 100,000 students calling the area home. It lies halfway on the train route between London and Edinburgh, Scotland.

The Metropolitan Area of West Yorkshire has well over a million inhabitants and is a thriving cultural destination. Leeds is a city rich in culture, architecture and attractions. It is consistently ranked by popular culture magazines as one of the UK's favorite cities is packed with museums, shopping centers, restaurants and a busy night life, which combine to enhance the students' university experience.

There is a vibrant feel to the modern Yorkshire cities of Leeds, Bradford, Sheffield and Doncaster, with Leeds now firmly established as the UK's second commercial centre after London. All have their attractions, such as the Royal Armouries in Leeds, the National Media Museum, IMAX and Alhambra Theatres in Bradford and Salts Mill in nearby Saltaire, superb sporting facilities in Sheffield, and Doncaster's Dome and racecourse.

The coaching staff will be under the direction of Mark Ellis, a Professional Soccer player for Bradford City for over 14 years who will oversee the player development program at RIASA. Mark has also worked at several UK professiona clubs as a coach, Leeds Utd, Huddersfield Town FC. He has also coached stints in South Africa and the USA. His coaching qualifications are up to the UEFA "A" licensed standard. Mark's professional contacts span the world and he will seek players from aboard to play at RIASA.

Mark will be responsible for not only developing players to move to the next level but will oversee the relationship that RIASA has developed with professional clubs not only in the UK but in the European leagues too.

The qualification for an RIASA coaching staff member is a UEFA "A" license. There will be two full time UEFA "A" licensed coaches working with Mark.

SOCCER PROGRAM

RIASA allows students the best of both worlds: a top quality academic program while living and playing in a true soccer culture. The UK is a natural fit for the North American soccer players, both culturally and for exposure to the best league in the world. It may provide an exit route into the professional game, for students, as they will be continually showcased against top professional academies.

US college soccer provides a very limited experience and developmental opportunity for students to reach their true potential. NCAA and NAIA rules restrict the playing season and times players can play, be coached, and develop their game. At Richmond International Academic and Soccer Academy, UK students can fully develop their playing potential and still receive a top quality professional education.

Students should be of a good playing standard either coming from a top premier select program or be an all-regional or state player. Each player will be considered on an individual basis; the program is open to those who are willing to learn and improve their game and who are looking for an international student experience.

The program is open to all students who wish to pursue an American degree while playing in a top quality soccer academy with professional coaching and playing opportunities. Students must meet the admission requirements of Richmond, The American International University in London.

RIASA will be using the total athlete development system developed by Scouting Solutions. www. scoutingsolutions.com/soccer.

This system allows coaches, professors and staff to monitor all aspects of a students' progress; academic monitoring, diet, nutrition, mental, technical and physical training. It also serves as an overall communication tool between all concerned in the development of the student athlete. It is a total all round development program that helps the player take their game to the next level and reach their potential.



SHOWCASE OPPORTUNITIES

The RIASA players play against Premier League, Championship League and One & Two Professional Youth Academy Teams throughout the year. RIASA has developed links with the following teams for its teams to play against: Manchester United, Carlisle United, Middlesboro, Shrewsbury Town, Nott's County, Leeds United, Doncaster Rovers and Sunderland; representing teams from the Premier League to League Level.

Showcase games are organized against professional youth academy teams; in addition to regular Saturday league games. RIASA players will play for UK Richmond, in the top amateur tier of English soccer, which is part of the 'soccer' pyramid system. RIASA players will also be eligible to play in the English College League during the week.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

THE CORE PROGRAM

The Richmond Core Program is based on the highly regarded American Liberal Arts educational philosophy that the most important aspect of becoming well-educated is to have a broad base of knowledge. Thus, Richmond's first three semesters encourage exploration of a wide range of subjects and skills – all of them key to the success of leaders in virtually every professional field.

The themes of globalization and leadership are central to the fabric of the learning experience at Richmond. Both the coursework and the institutional culture, in and out of the classroom, support the University's long-standing commitment to helping students become competent on the world stage.

THE FIRST YEAR PROGRAM

Richmond's faculty and student affairs professionals help students through the transitional period of their first year. Whether a student has lived and studied in a number of different countries or this is the first time that they have studied abroad, whether they come to Richmond with many transfer credits or

none, the university recognizes the importance of the "First Year Experience".

Richmond has designed a program to help all new students adjust successfully to the academic, social and cultural demands of university life. Students work closely with the faculty in the First Year Seminars where they gain knowledge and develop skills that will serve them well into their futures.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM

The degree in international business provides a multidisciplinary approach to managing in the global economy, including understanding cultural diversity, the theory and political economy of international trade and foreign investment, the global monetary system and the strategy of international business.

Whether the aim is to acquire specific technical skills, crucial transferable ones or a combination of both, the teaching approach at Richmond stimulates students to read, think, explore ideas, question, debate and bring their excitement and ideas into the classroom.

ACADEMY ADMISSIONS

Gaining Admission

To gain admission to the academy, students will be evaluated academically and athletically. All applicants must contact the RIASA first before making application to Richmond, The American International University in London.

All applications will be reviewed holistically, that is, each individual application is not examined solely upon the academic achievements of the applicant, but key to the evaluation is the way in which the student demonstrates an ability to participate and contribute in his or her current spheres of influence. This ensures that the decision that the University makes in supporting the admission of a student, is based on a clear and detailed impression as to whether or not the applicant is well-matched for the academic rigors, as well as the international social demands, of life at Richmond.

To be considered for admission, students should have completed 11 or 12 years of schooling, depending on the education system in their country, with a minimum of C+ (2.5 out of 4.0) in the American high school grading system.

The average RIASA GPA is 3.25 (out of 4.0) on

the American scale.

If applicants have one of the qualifications listed immediately following, they will be considered as advanced students. This may entitle them to university credits, which will reduce the number of courses they need to complete in order to graduate.

- International Baccalaureate
- Advanced Placement Examinations

When to apply

Due to the academic structure of this program, students report to the academy in August with classes commencing the first week in September.

Priority deadline for application is: 1 March for the Fall Semester (the deposit deadline is 1 May).

How to apply

Step 1:

Complete the application form or apply online at www.richmond.ac.uk/riasa

Step 2:

Send official transcripts of secondary and postsecondary school results/records.

Step 3:

Provide the academic reference from a teacher or guidance counselor.

Step 4:

Write a personal statement (details are on the application form).

Step 5:

Include SAT or ACT scores (optional).

VISAS, PROGRAM COSTS, FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE AND HOUSING

Applying for a Visa

Upon receipt of the confirmation deposit, the Admissions Office will issue a certificate of acceptance for studies (CASes) which can be used to apply for a student visa. All students should check with the nearest British Embassy or High Commission for visa requirements for the United Kingdom. For online information look at www.ukcosa.org.uk and www.ukvisas. gov.uk. Those requiring a visa to enter the UK should apply as early as possible. Visa applications can take time and some students may be called to the Embassy for an interview.

Program Costs

Financial Assistance

US citizens and eligible permanent residents of the US are eligible for Federal Stafford and PLUS loans.

These loans may cover expenses beyond institutional charges i.e. assist with living expenses. To access the US Federal programs, students must file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). This can be completed on-line at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Richmond's US Title IV code is G10594. All of the Federal loan program costs, attendance, satisfactory academic progress, and disbursement dates for example are associated with the academic program exclusively. These conditions being the same as any other similar Richmond degree program.. A complete list of financial aid options are available at www. richmond.ac.uk/riasa.

Housing

Students will be placed in studios in the vicinity of Headingly, Leeds; a major location for Leeds University students. Standard accommodation will have twin rooms (singles available at extra cost), kitchen, living room and laundry facilities.

Richmond's degrees are designated by the Department for Education and Skills (DfES) of Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom (Recognized Awards) Statutory Order 2006 (SI 3121) dated November 23, 2006.

Richmond, The American International University in London has been awarded an "A-rated" Tier 4 (Students) Sponsor's Licence by the United Kingdom Borders Agency (www.ukba.homeoffice.gov.uk). This Sponsor's Licence permits Richmond to issue Certificates of Acceptance for Studies (CASes) to prospective students. A CAS is required by the UKBA for any non-EE A international student seeking

to obtain entry clearance to the UK.

Richmond is independent and not affiliated with other institutions including The American University, the University of Richmond, The American University in London, The American Intercontinental University in London nor with other American Universities throughout the world.
