240 UCAS points A levels: CCC

To include GCSE grade C in Mathematics and English. A range of qualifications, such as Access, are accepted, please contact us directly to discuss alternative qualifications.

To include GCSE grade C in Mathematics, English. A Science subject at either GCSE (grade C or above) or at A level is preferred.

Choose to study at Staffordshire University and you will enjoy ample opportunity to gain practical experience throughout Staffordshire and Shropshire.
