Over the last fifty years, the Cardiff School of Education has become one of the largest teacher training institutions in the UK. Situated in a beautiful location overlooking the city, it has around 50 full-time academic staff and more than 1,000 students. It has established an enviable reputation for quality and nationally recognized excellence. In 2004, The School was awarded top marks for the effectiveness of its teaching, training and assessment by Estyn, the Inspectorate for Education and Training in Wales.

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### Geography/Location

UWIC is in the heart of Europe's most exciting cities with first class sport, culture, entertainment and shopping facilities. Cardiff is friendly, affordable, and offers students a high standard of living at a relatively low cost. Cardiff has all the facilities and attractions of a large European capital city, but it remains small and intimate for students to quickly find their way around and make friends easily. The Post Graduate Certificate of Education (PGCE)  
 - Primary and Secondary options  
 Full Degree and Study Abroad options available  
 The 36-week program runs from September to June.

The PGCE program is delivered in conjunction with 299 primary and 126 secondary schools in South Wales. The strength of this partnership is a feature of which the School is justly proud. During the program, students undertake extended teaching placements in two different secondary schools amounting to 120 days in all (broadly equivalent to two thirds of the program). During these placements, students are supported and assessed by designated mentors within the school. Quality assurance of work-based learning is undertaken at school level and through University tutor visits.

The School of Education is committed to teaching in small class sizes ideally of approximately 20-25 students. The small classes ensure that the students enjoy quality contact time with their tutors. Significant individual support from tutors is also available.

PGCE students spend four days each week in schools and one day at the University. This structure enables students to stay in regular contact with their peer group and tutors, provides opportunities for the integration of University and school-based experiences and encourages reflective practice.
