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
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



With the business world and financial district on your doorstep and surrounded by the history and culture of London, LSBU offers the perfect base to study and experience the city.




We have designated student halls, so that you will be living with other students in the same stage of their University experience. For example, we have designated halls for postgraduates or first year students.

The SU Sports Office can help you with enquiries regarding a sports team or an activity, and will be able to tell you what you need to know, or at least point you in the right direction.



Erasmus programme

Erasmus is the European Commission's flagship educational exchange programme for Higher Education students. It was introduced with the aim of increasing student mobility within Europe.

It is an exchange programme that LSBU has been involved with for many years, whereby students from LSBU are sent to our partner institutions, and in return we receive international students to study here in London.

Students who take part in the programme do not pay additional fees; nor do they gain an award (e.g. Bachelor) from the receiving institution.

If your University takes part in this programme, you would study for one semester or one year in London following a programme of study deemed equivalent to that of your home university. The marks obtained during your Erasmus period of study will count towards your degree in your home university.

Professor Taylor is an internationally renowned expert in social development, poverty reduction and environmental issues, with particular reference to China, and East and Southeast Asia. Professor Taylor has undertaken research for the UK's Department for International Development (DFID), the World Bank, GTZ, Aus Aid,

UNICEF, United Nations Development Programme, Governments and Non-Governmental Development Organisations. Some of his past research activities include: managing environmental and social development projects in China, notably in Wuhan, China, on a three year project funded by the UK Government's Global

Environmental Change Program.
In East Timor, Dr Taylor worked for several years for UNICEF and UNDP, as a senior development advisor to the Government. Currently, Dr Taylor is working with a team from the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences on the National Poverty Assessment in China.

LLB (Hons) Bachelor of Law

Entry requirements

Our LLB course is relevant to a broad range of careers and is not just for aspiring lawyers. On this course you will adopt an analytical and critical approach to the content and operation of the law.

Career and progression opportunities

The LLB is a Qualifying Law Degree validated by the Law Society and the Bar Council (the professional bodies governing solicitors and barristers in England and Wales) and is therefore ideal for international students looking to become UK-based lawyers.

The LLB course is also relevant to jobs where the skills of analysis, clear communication, efficient organisation and reasoned persuasion are valued.

Students are encouraged to undertake a placement in their second year of study to develop their practical legal and professional skills. The Law Department has professional links with London-based legal firms and the South London Law Society.

Entry requirements

This course responds to the latest developments in international film practice; explores new connections between the creative, cultural and intellectual demands of filmmaking; incorporates the latest technologies and techniques to enable the next generation of filmmakers and digital media producers to combine their passion for filmmaking with their degree ambitions.

Career and progression opportunities

The course is designed for those who want to go into fiction, documentary or experimental film production, but also commercial video, video art, postproduction, video editing, scriptwriting, and directing within the advertising, television, film and online industries. Student films have been screened at film festivals from the: 1st Annual Hackney Film Festival, to the Cinemagik Short Film Festival in Malta.

Graduates have gone onto jobs with the BBC, post-production facilities, and film and video production companies.

Professional and industry links

The teaching team have contacts with key production and postproduction facilities and organise master classes with industry professionals. Recent students have done work experience for Saatchi and Saatchi, the BBC, The London Studios and various independent film and TV production companies.

With a common first year, this degree enables you to select one of these specialist routes that map onto particular career paths. The first route specialises in travel and tourism management (for those interested in tour operations, travel agents, destination management and marketing). The second specialises in leisure and events (for those interested in managing mega events, promotions, logistics, regeneration and events policy, and business conferences). The third route specialises in food and hospitality management (for those interested in hotel management, food management in restaurants, bars and catering, design, marketing and product development).

Our graduates go on to work with employers such as Disney, country clubs, integrated resorts, international hotel chains, airlines and tour operators. Many also start their own businesses in the sector. Startup businesses have included web-based tour operations, restaurants and events management companies.

This full time masters programme will offer you the opportunity to study journalism at postgraduate level in the context of a department (Culture, Writing and Performance) that provides a rich portfolio of arts and humanities courses.

The course draws from a range of multimedia journalism practices within the creative media industries. Additionally you will have the opportunity to acquire and develop key journalistic skills (writing, research, multimedia production) and put those skills into practice in two core modules: Professional Practice and in Major Project. Within the project module you will choose to submit work for either a multimedia

production, feature writing portfolio, investigative journalism package or video news/audio production.

Top-up course to BA Business Management

This direct entry, one year Honours degree is offered to help suitably qualified applicants, both home and international, to become full UK graduates in business and management.

This degree is a bridge to the range of masters courses within the Business Faculty. Demand for this course is high, and early application is recommended.

Applicants must have successfully completed at least two years on a relevant undergraduate business course.

The aim of this course is to provide a creative and design focused education that emphasises the considered design of our environment through an engagement with contemporary material, social and environmental issues.

Design project work is the focus of our studio culture. You will develop a wide range of skills which teach you how to draw both by hand, and use digital media. History and theory units will develop your understanding of the subject of architecture whilst technology units will teach you about structures, materials and how architecture is made. Focus on China: The Confucius Institute



Furthermore the Confucius Institute at LSBU runs courses in Traditional Chinese Medicine. This is a joint initiative with Heilongjiang University of Chinese Medicine, Harbin Normal University and the Office of Chinese Language Council International, China (OCLCI, commonly known as Hanban).

Our newly validated course in Chinese Medicine: Acupuncture aims to enable successful graduates to practice in the UK or China and is subject to accreditation by the British Acupuncture Accreditation Board (BAAB).

In addition to the taught courses, the Institute is also targeting those

at the start of their academic career, designing a Chinese wellbeing curriculum for Key Stage 2 pupils. The resources are designed to help schools meet both the citizenship and foreign language requirements of the National Curriculum, and will give pupils a grounding in Mandarin Chinese.

In the summer, some 40 students and staff spent time in China at Harbin Normal University, while LSBU sports ambassadors were trained in coaching traditional Chinese exercises and sports

BSc / M.CMAc Chinese Medicine: Acupuncture

Entry requirements

- 200 UCAS tariff points
- English proficiency at IELTS level 6.5 or equivalent. See page 66 for equivalent qualifications.
- Chinese students should have a pass in the State Entrance Exam with a score of at least 550 to 600 points.

As well as an excellent grounding in the theory and application of acupuncture, the course provides a firm foundation in Chinese language and culture, extensive clinical experience, a thorough understanding of western biomedical sciences and research methodology, and the skills to be a reflective and professional practitioner.

Teaching is delivered by both experienced lecturers from China and practitioners based in the UK.

This course is run through a partnership between London South Bank University, the Confucius Institute at LSBU, Heilongjiang University of Chinese Medicine and Harbin Normal University and currently holds Stage 1 accreditation from the British Acupuncture Accreditation Board (BAAB).

Please note the main delivery of academic content for this course is at the weekend and evenings. Students will be expected to attend clinic on weekdays.

Career and progression opportunities

This four year degree (3 years for BSc) programme enables graduates to work as professional acupuncturists. A typical graduate will be a highly professional clinical practitioner in acupuncture.

MSc Research and Evidence-Based Practice for Chinese Medicine

Entry requirements

- Applicants normally require a bachelors degree in Chinese Medicine
 / Acupuncture equivalent to UK second class honours or above
- English language proficiency at IELTS level 6.5 or equivalent. See page 66 for equivalent qualifications.

The field of acupuncture is being researched to increasingly high standards and its renewed credibility is creating more interest in the field. It is therefore vital that we support this growth – the future of the profession is reliant upon it.

This course is primarily for practitioners of Chinese Medicine who trained in the Far East. It provides a thorough understanding of a variety of methodologies for collecting and analysing data, whether it is patientcentred qualitative reports or quantitative biochemical data. Students will develop a wide variety of skills such as critical thinking and the ability to communicate your findings in the international language of science – English.

Career and progression opportunities

The objective is that you gain the skills to be involved in research, whether at home or abroad. You will have the ability to publish research papers in peer-reviewed journals and present at research conferences. In addition you will be ideally placed to continue to practise in the West.

MSc Public Health and Health Promotion

Entry requirements

- Applicants normally require a bachelors degree in a health related discipline - equivalent to UK second class honours or above
- Experience in the field of public health / health promotion / community health in a paid or voluntary capacity.
- English language proficiency at IELTS level 6.5 or equivalent. See page 66 for equivalent qualifications.
- If you have extensive professional experience but do not hold a degree, you are encouraged to make an application, or contact us to discuss your suitability for the course.

This is a vocational course aimed at producing practitioners who ask questions and know how to set about answering them through critical thinking and reflective practice.

The central theme is a commitment to the process of enabling people and communities to increase control over their health and wellbeing. This approach provides you with the tools and knowledge to tackle inequalities in health and work towards combating social exclusion. The course provides an opportunity to examine concepts of health, illness and disease in a social context, the social construction of health, social patterning of health, illness and disease, and the effectiveness of interventions. The course has a longstanding reputation and links to the field of health promotion and health improvement. The University has a Memorandum of Understanding with the Royal Society of Public Health and the course team is closely

involved with the UK Health Promotion Academics Forum, and informal links with the Faculty of Public Health. HSC has close partnerships with local health and social care providers.

Career and progression opportunities

Previous students have had a range of opportunities made available to them on completion of the course, and have extended and developed their public health roles and/ or their strategic functions.

Topics covered include:

- Perspectives on promoting health and well-being
- Epidemiology and research
- Public health principles and practice
- Public health leadership and management
- Health promotion and health improvement practice
- Political and social context of public health and health promotion

MSc International Health Services and Hospital Management

Entry requirements

- Applicants normally require a bachelors degree in a relevant subject equivalent to UK second class honours or above and appropriate senior work experience in a health services setting
- · Senior level work experience in a health service setting, or
- English language proficiency at IELTS level 6.5 or equivalent. See page 66 for equivalent qualifications.

LSBU is one of the leading centres for management training in the public and health sectors in the UK. This course has primarily been designed for international clientele. It is run through a partnership between the Department of Management in the Business Faculty and the Faculty of Health and Social Care.

The emphasis of the course is on planning and managing health services, and the curriculum includes management theory and practice, strategic management, epidemiology, health policy and planning.

The course is characterised by an emphasis on practical skills informed by theoretical insights and managerial understanding.

Career and progression opportunities

The overall aim is to produce knowledgeable, competent senior managers with good interpersonal skills to operate efficiently and effectively in their health services.

Topics covered include:

- International Human Resource and Management
- Leading Public Health and Health Promotion
- Management and Leadership
- Research Methods and Strategy
- Health Economics in Developing Countries
- Management in Action (includes an observation experience in NHS Trust hospital or NGOs)
- Health Planning in Developing Countries

InHolland University

The Faculty has a 15 year history of working with colleagues at InHolland University. The partnership has yielded a number of large scale European Commission projects to develop aspects of education and training in imaging and radiotherapy. Preparation Programmes



English Language Preparation Programmes (ELPP)

IELTS score Minimum 3.0 or equivalent Mode / Length 1,2 or 3 terms

The ELPP programme is designed for students whose English language levels are not yet high enough for their chosen LSBU FoundationCampus academic programme at either undergraduate or postgraduate level.

The course is flexible and based around your needs. Depending on your level and speed of progression, you could be ready to start your LSBU FoundationCampus course within three months.

You will be trained in all four language skills (reading, writing, listening and speaking) to the level required for your course (IELTS 4.5 for Undergraduate Foundation or IELTS 5.0 for Masters Foundation).

Upon completion of the ELPP you should be able to:

- achieve an overall score of at least 4.5 (UFP) / 5.0 (MFP) in the internal mock IELTS test
- communicate successfully in common social settings
- understand basic business vocabulary and expressions

To ensure you get the results you need in your final IELTS exam we assess your progress throughout the course by means of full and regular mock IELTS assessments so that when you sit your final exam there won't be any surprises.



International Diploma Programme (IDP)

This is a comprehensive programme equivalent to Year 1 of an undergraduate degree for international students with additional English for Academic Purposes, offering progression to Year 2 of Business Studies.

This programme is aimed at students who do not quite have the academic grades and/or English level to start the first year of an undergraduate degree at university, but have a stronger profile than required for the international Undergraduate Foundation Programme.

The International Diploma Programme will give you a good grounding in your chosen subjects and will allow you to learn the study skills and research methods that you will need during your undergraduate degree studies.

To prepare you for the academic style of UK universities, your course

will be delivered using the methods you would expect to find at a high quality university. These include:

- classroom lessons
- lectures
- workshops/laboratory work
- seminars
- tutorials
- group work
- debating and
- · self study.

In addition to your English Language module you will be studying the following subjects:

Learning Support

Our Student Services Department has a network of services to help support international students during their studies. The Skills for Learning team offers support in English, Maths and study skills, such as essay and report writing, through a range of classes and workshops designed for all levels of learning. Workshops and courses to support students in developing their oral communication skills are also available.

Personal support

Our International Student Advice team in the International Office provides support and guidance to students. They can advise you on visa and immigration issues both before you arrive in the UK and while you are studying here. You can also speak to them about general welfare issues, such as settling into life in the UK, as well as any personal problems you may be facing. Additionally Student Advice Workers, based in Student Services, provide advice and guidance to help you adapt to university life. They are able to help you with a range of issues such as emotional problems, financial management, stress and well-being. Their services offered are free of charge and are confidential.

Multi-Faith Centre

The Multi-Faith Centre offers confidential pastoral care to students irrespective of belief and the Chaplaincy Service includes representatives from a diverse range of faith groups. London South Bank University also has a number of student societies representing a range of religions and denominations.

Employability and Careers

The majority of international students may work part-time during their studies. Students holding a visa should refer to the UK Border Agency regulations for clarification of their eligibility to work during study. The Employability and Careers service is a professional information, advice and guidance service designed to assist LSBU students and graduates in finding work experience and employment opportunities. The Employability and Careers Service deliver workshops and one-to-one advice sessions as well as collating lists of vacancies which are publicised through the University JobShop.

Student Ambassador Scheme

International students are welcome to apply to become one of our Student Ambassadors. LSBU students are offered the opportunity to work for the University in a number of roles. Student Ambassadors are often the public face of the institution, representing LSBU at education fairs, Faculty open days and on the front desk in the Admissions and Recruitment Centre.

Disability and dyslexia support

Our team is based in the Perry Library and forms part of the Centre for Learning Support and Development. We are responsible for making sure that all students who are registered with us have equal access to their education. The University is committed to providing accessible education to all students.

To achieve this, we work with a wide range of people across the University, including lecturers, administrators, and accommodation and building services staff. Each student is met on an individual basis by one of the Disability Officers and they are welcome to make an appointment to see us when they need assistance or advice.

Library services

At LSBU, we have dedicated library support for international students. Our helpful team will ensure that you settle in and learn how to use the LSBU libraries effectively.

You can access help with your study and assignments, information on referencing and plagiarism, IT support and foreign language materials and collections.

We also provide guidance on other libraries in London that you may be interested in accessing whilst you study at LSBU.

Student Centre

In September 2012, a new Student Centre will open at LSBU. It will create a dynamic central location where students can easily access support services and find out more about employment opportunities, as well as providing a space where they can socialise and relax.

It will also be the new home for the LSBU Students' Union and advocacy and society services.

Learning Resource Centre (LRC)

The Learning Resources Centre (LRC) provides free computer access for all students and staff, as well as printing, scanning and photocopying facilities. Specialised facilities for Engineering and Language students are also available.

The Helpdesk on the first floor provides assistance for students of all abilities and information on our facilities.

At the beginning of semesters one and two, we provide free training sessions for IT and Information Skills. All training opportunities will be advertised across the University and online. Generally these 90 minute long sessions cater for beginners through to advanced level. The sessions cover:

- MS Office applications
- File management
- · Blackboard
- the University's email system
- Use of the Library Catalogue and Research Skills.

Blackboard

Blackboard is a virtual learning environment. The site, which is accessed via the Student Gateway, contains links to sites that support your learning. These will hold presentations, lecture notes, discussion boards, timetables and other materials to support your studies.

Fees and funding

A qualification from LSBU is an ideal investment for your future. An undergraduate, postgraduate or professional qualification from LSBU will give you an internationally recognised qualification which will provide a solid career foundation and excellent employment prospects.

When you are budgeting to study at LSBU you need to consider two different types of costs:

- Tuition fees
- · Living expenses

Tuition fees

These fees cover the cost of your learning experience at LSBU. If you are paying your tuition fees yourself, payment must be made when you enrol onto your course. If a sponsor is paying your fees then you need a letter of confirmation from this sponsor that your fees will be paid.

International student fees and financial support differ considerably from that offered to students defined as Home or EU. It is important to determine whether or not you are classed as a Home or EU student.

Tuition fee deposits

Students who need to apply for a student visa will require an electronic Certificate of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number issued by the University to support their student visa application. Before a CAS number can be issued students are required to hold a firmly accepted unconditional offer of a place at LSBU and to have paid a £2,500 tuition fee deposit. Full information regarding the deposit payment process and terms and conditions of the scheme is detailed on LSBU offer letters.

Living expenses

In addition to your tuition fees you will need to budget for living costs while studying in the UK. These costs will generally include your accommodation, food and drink, local travel, study materials and leisure activities etc.

Alternatively, if you are enrolling onto a course at National Qualifications Framework (NQF) Level 6 or above (degree level or above), and have one of the tests with appropriate scores accepted by LSBU this will be acceptable: www.lsbu.ac.uk

VISA information

It is important that you start your preparations to move to the UK as soon as your place at the University is confirmed. Many overseas students need to apply for a student visa and this process can be very time consuming. It is essential that you follow the application instructions carefully to ensure that all of the information and documentation required by the UK Border Agency (UKBA) is submitted in good time.

If you require a student visa you should begin planning your application for entry clearance at least four months prior to your course start date. It is your responsibility to ensure that you follow the current visa application regulations and submit the correct documents with the application. The documents/information required include: completed student visa application form; Confirmation of Acceptance for studies (CAS) number from the University and evidence that you meet the financial requirements (to support yourself during your first year of study and pay any remaining tuition fees). It is important to note that the visa requirements may be subject to change at short notice so it is important to check the UKBA website regularly to keep up to date with the regulations.

Working in the UK

International students who hold a valid student visa are usually permitted to work up to 20 hours per week during term time, and longer hours during the holidays. Students holding a visa should consult the UK Border Agency website for further information: http://www.ukba.homeoffice.gov.uk/

In London there is a wide range of part-time work available and the University supports students in identifying suitable work opportunities through the Employability and Careers Service. Work is generally available in bars, shops and restaurants and some students are able to secure part time employment in an area relevant to their study. There are also some opportunities to work for the University through the Student Employee scheme.

Working after completion of your course
