

What do Art and Design graduates do?



- Creative industries are a growing and innovative sector of the economy with burgeoning opportunities in Bristol and further afield. 'Employment in the sector has grown at double the rate of the economy as a whole' (Department for Culture, Media and Sport).
- Art and design graduates enter a wide variety of careers. A high proportion enter employment directly related to their degree subject such as fashion, animation, graphic design, illustration, photography and the arts. Many use their key transferable skills to enter a diverse range of graduate careers within the wider creative industries and also sectors of employment open to any degree subject including marketing, retail, event management, cultural heritage, education, media and research.
- Graduates secure jobs with top national and regional public and private sector organisations across the country. Small to medium sized enterprises are also regular recruiters of art and design graduates. Freelance and self employment is a popular option although it may take several years to establish a business. Graduates may combine freelance work with regular paid part-time employment initially; therefore being able to manage multiple commitments is an important skill to master.

Response rate - 88.9%

- Since career entry in the creative industries is not clearly structured, it is important that students begin to develop their career ideas and enterprise skills throughout their studies and make the most of opportunities to gain real-world experience. Engaging in work placements, competitions, small commissions, live projects and exhibitions enhance students' understanding of the commercial sector. Networking to build a portfolio of contacts can significantly enhance graduate success in the creative industries.
- Employers value art and design graduates' ability to think and problem solve creatively, communicate visually, work independently and in teams, research, and critically evaluate their own work and that of others. Graduates also develop technical skills and specialist knowledge which are highly valued in relation to a wide variety of career opportunities.
- Postgraduate study is an option for graduates wishing to specialise in a particular area of work such as costume design, art direction, curating, or train for a profession such as teaching or arts organisation and management.
