Drama is a subject that involves imaginative and practical skills and creative collaboration - as well as the academic study of dramatic literature, performance theory and theatre practice. At Staffordshire University,

our two integrated courses have been designed to give students the opportunities to collaborate and take part in play productions, documentary and applied theatre projects, as performers, writers, designers, stage managers or lighting and sound designers. The 'technical' version of the course is designed for creative students who want to study Drama and pursue a career in the arts, but do not wish to perform.

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Choose how you study

At Staffordshire University, we believe that you should be able to choose the study method that best suits you. That's why our Drama and Theatre degrees can be studied full-time over three years, or part-time over a period of as long as six years.

Learn from experienced lecturers

Many of our tutors are theatre industry professionals who have extensive experience as directors, actors, performance artists, stage managers and lighting designers. In addition, teaching is supplemented by many visiting freelance theatre professionals who lecture and give practical workshops in essential skills such as acting technique, voice and movement. music-theatre, playwriting, costume and set design, lighting and sound design, and arts marketing.

Links with leading employers

To give you a real insight into the world of employment, we have extensive contacts in many professional theatres and with theatre industry employers nationwide. We also maintain professional links with the local New Vic and Regent Theatres and Reveal Theatre Company. Some former students have gone on to work for the theatres and schools where they did their final-year work-placements and they have strengthened our links with local industry, arts and education.

World of work facilities

Practical work takes place in the Performance Centre, which contains three rehearsal studios. two workshops, props and costume stores, a meeting room, a green-room with kitchen. The Centre also houses a large Drama Studio with state-of-the-art lighting and sound equipment and stage-management facilities. Studio One is a professional-standard flexible performance space where theatre productions can be performed in the traditional manner or in-the-round, in thrust-stage arrangement or traverse-theatre format.

Inspired ways of teaching

Although performance and technical theatre practice will be fundamental parts of your studies, these are not purely vocational acting or technical theatre courses. Academic modules are taught using lectures and seminars whilst training workshops and theatre productions will give you real-world skills and practical experience. You will be marked on your practical work and presentations and will also be expected to take part in seminar discussions and submit

written assignments such as essays. You will not be required to sit exams.

Career choices

Your studies will prepare you for many theatre and arts-related jobs. With a further year's postgraduate training, your course will serve as an exceptionally good foundation for a teaching or acting career. Many of our graduates have become successful arts professionals and teachers - some will go on to become industry leaders. The technical version of the course prepares students for careers in lighting and sound or stage management and theatre production. You may opt for a different career path, in which case these courses will equip you with confidence, an ability to communicate effectively and many of the key skills needed to compete successfully in the professional world.
