Life Story Work

One of the biggest challenges facing people who have dementia is the loss of identity they experience when moving into care, finding themselves being looked after by people who know little of their past, passions, interests, beliefs, relationships or achievements. Life Story Work (LSW) is one way in which this difficulty can be overcome. LSW involves working with a person and/or their family to find out about their life, recording the information and using this as the basis for care and support decisions and activities. Jane McKeown and Tony Ryan have been working with colleagues from around South Yorkshire on a series of projects aimed at establishing LSW. A University of Sheffield Knowledge Transfer grant helped fund a series of workshops to care staff, family carers and people with dementia and more recently they have had success in the award of a Foundation of Nursing Studies grant to conduct further implementation work in the NHS. Other work includes the use of film to explore the biographies of a group of older men from the Yemen and a web site which is being
