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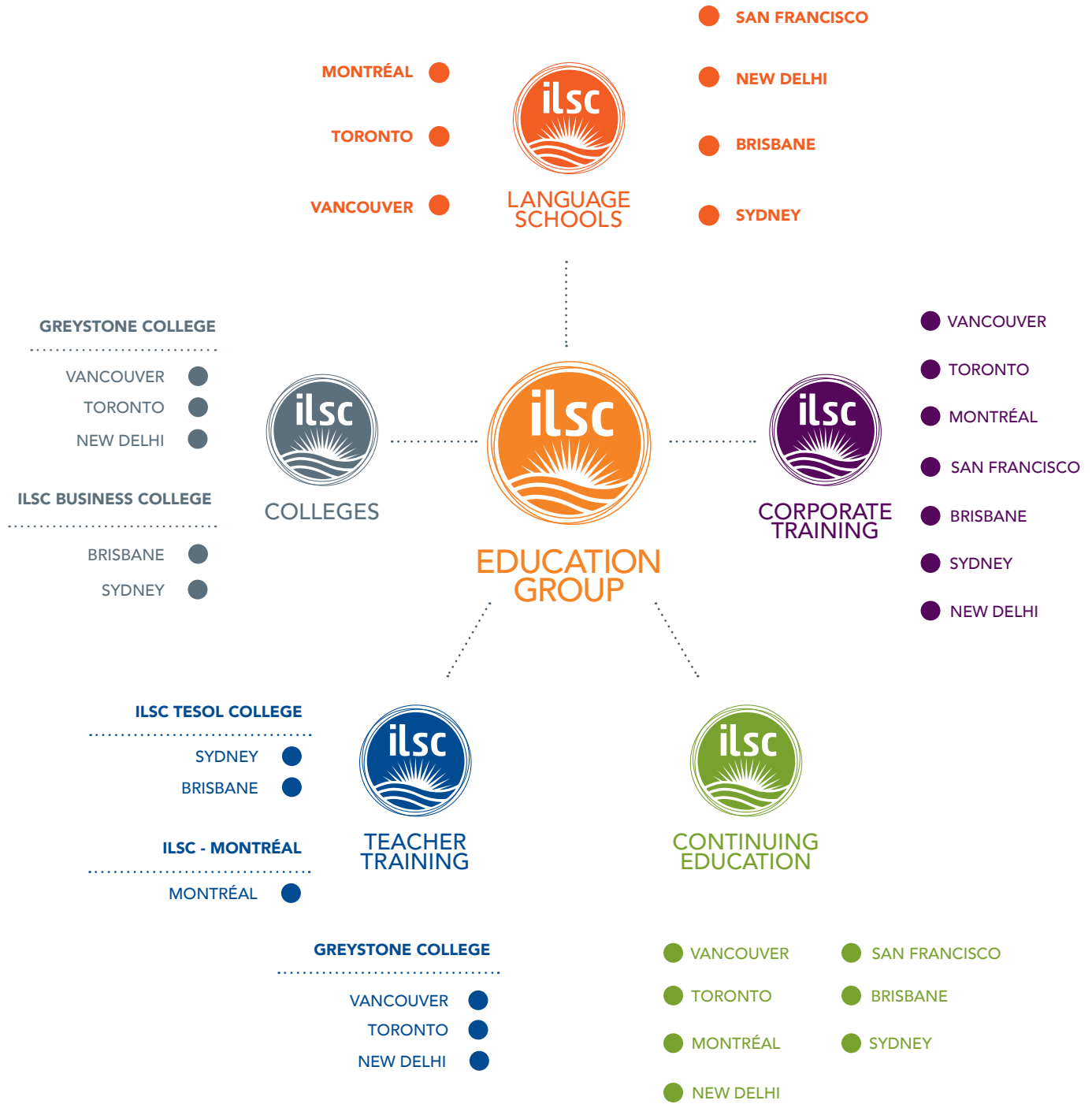

CORE ENGLISH/FRENCH PROGRAMS

ILSC's core English and French courses will help students improve their skills in specific areas. Communications programs provide intensive language immersion and an excellent opportunity to quickly improve speaking skills. Academic and Test Preparation courses will ensure student success in standardized English or French Tests and help students prepare for post-secondary education. Business courses at ILSC can be used to complete several different Business English Certificates. Humanities courses help students master the language of self-expression and human behaviour.

PAID & UNPAID INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS

VOLUNTEER INTERNSHIP PROGRAM (VIP)

*FORMERLY KNOWN AS THE COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAM

ILSC's Volunteer Internship Program is an innovative model of enriched education combining English and/or French language studies with a volunteer apprenticeship in a local workplace. Working with a vast and ever-growing network of partner companies, Internship Coordinators are dedicated to placing students in an organization that reflects their interests, work experience and educational background. Internship students will be able to perfect their language skills in a real-world situation while at the same time, adding valuable career experience to their resume.

WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAM (WEP)

WEP is a specialized program combining intensive English and/or French study with a paid practicum in the local workplace. Begin by studying English or French through a variety of courses in order to reach a specific language level. Once the target level is achieved, take on internship preparation courses such as Business Writing, Interview Skills or Job Opportunities & Business Success (JOBS) or Job Ready for WEP fast. These are designed to make you highly employable in the job market.

Successful completion of these steps results in a paid internship where you can put your skills to the test in an organization and gain work experience. Students may find placements in a number of industries including Tourism and Hospitality, Retail and Administration. Typical entry-level positions vary from customer service and clerical assistance to basic tasks. Average wages will vary depending on the country and the position. The path to real-world success starts here!

CAMBRIDGE EXAM PREPARATION

The ILSC Cambridge Mastery Program prepares and motivates students towards the Cambridge Main Suite Exams (FCE, CAE, CPE, BEC). The Cambridge exams are widely recognized in commerce and industry because of their high standards and strict regulations. Cambridge certificates fulfill English requirements for entrance into many universities, colleges and other institutions of further education.

CERTIFICATE AND MASTERY PROGRAMS

Students at ILSC may choose to focus their studies in a specific area such as Business, Marketing or Communication. Certificate and Mastery Programs require specific course combinations from our general course list and give students the opportunity to refine their English skills in an area that interests them, or compliments their career goals. Students will receive a document recognizing their successful completion of a Certificate or Mastery Program.

TEACHER TRAINING PROGRAMS

ILSC's Teacher Training Programs offer a variety of prepared curricula to help you fulfill your plans for the future. Join students with similar goals in taking a blend of courses with a single focus. Enjoy the fruits of your labour with a certificate or diploma and newfound expertise. 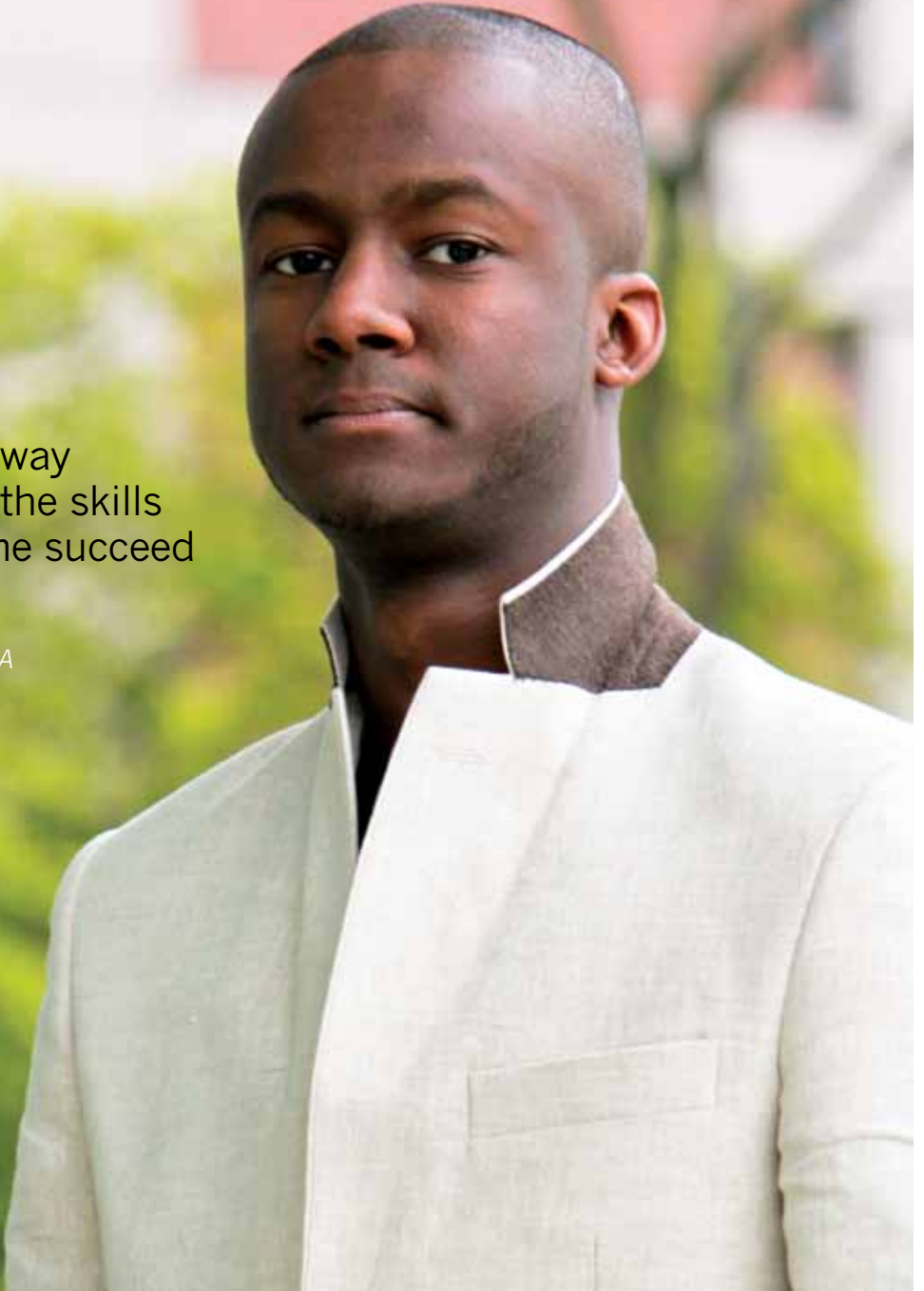

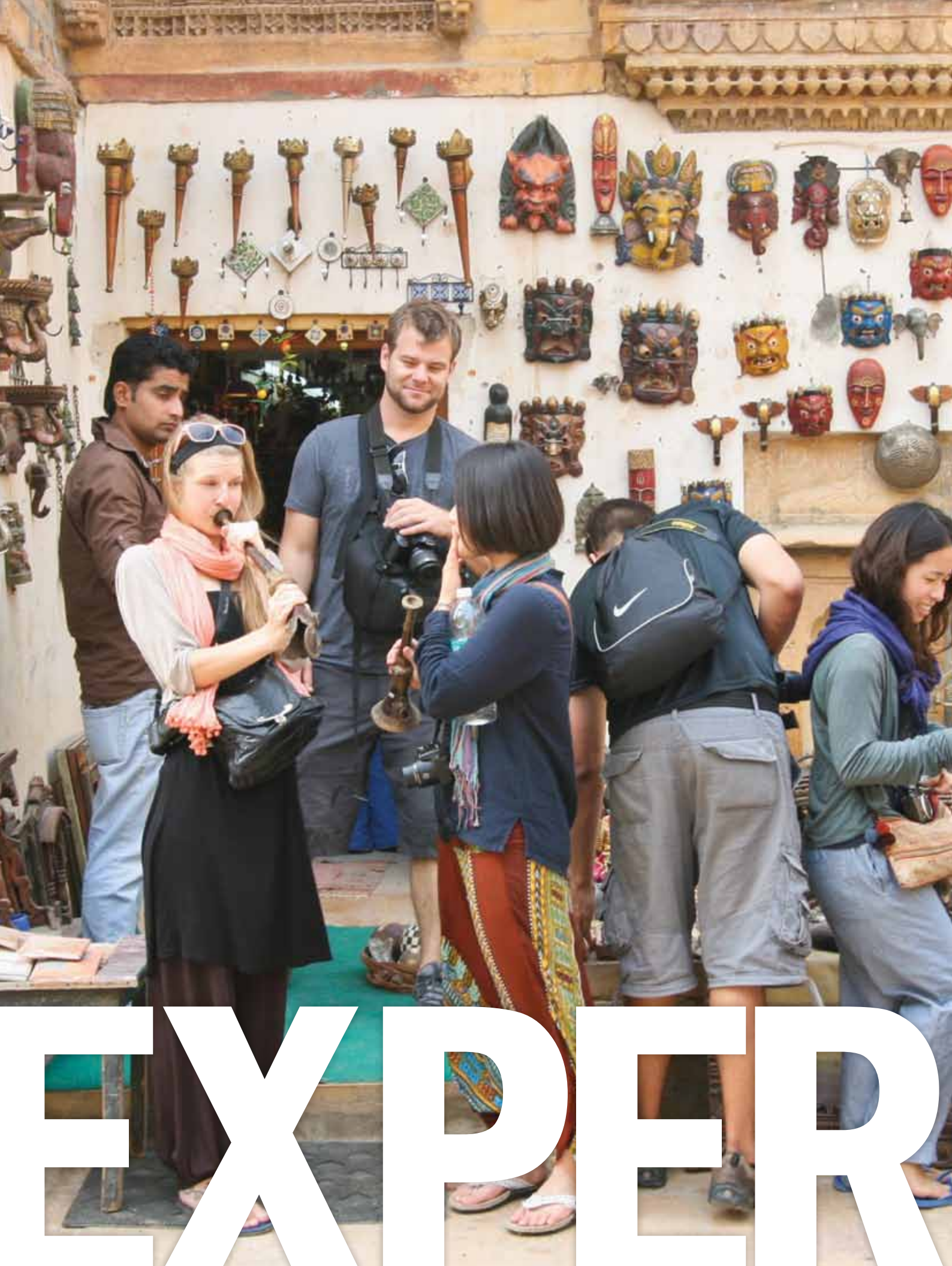

Homestay. Live like a local.

You'll be surprised how quickly your speaking improves when you're immersed in English or French from breakfast until bedtime. ILSC's integrated Homestay Program carefully selects families who provide a friendly, supportive and welcoming home environment for students. Homestay gives students a window into the unique culture and family life in their country of study. Some will discover friendships that last a lifetime.

HOMESTAY IS A WHOLE NEW DIMENSION OF LEARNING, ONE THAT TAKES PLACE NATURALLY OVER DINNER CONVERSATIONS, CARD GAMES AND MOVIE NIGHTS.

Most Homestay families live about 45 minutes from ILSC by public transit. Each family provides their student guest with a furnished private bedroom, a shared bathroom, and meals. ILSC's multilingual Homestay staff monitor each home to make sure it is appropriate, and are always available to help you if any problem or issue happens to arise.

In Montréal, ILSC provides English or French speaking Homestay families and, if necessary, bilingual (English and French) families. In New Delhi, students can choose to stay with an English or Hindi speaking household.

If you prefer another type of accommodation, we can provide referral and placement services. Options vary depending on which campus you will be attending, but may include, furnished apartments, hotels, hostels, and dormitories.



RESIDENCES AND STUDENT APARTMENTS

If you prefer to live more independently while you're studying at ILSC, our residences provide safe and economical accommodation. Residences are located within or close to the downtown area in each city, which means you can enjoy easy access to the school, as well as shopping, restaurants, and the city's vibrant arts, cultural, and tourist attractions. Share your living experience with other students from around the world.

Beyond the Classroom

Getting outside to play and explore is a cornerstone of the ILSC experience. It's a chance to relax after class, and spend time with your new friends while practising English or French in the real world. 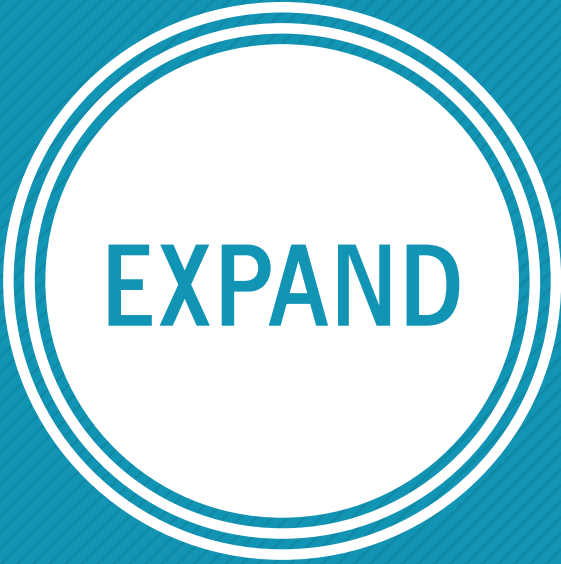

1 THE CANADIAN ROCKY MOUNTAINS

The Rocky Mountain range stretches more than 3000 miles (4,830 km) through BC into New Mexico in the USA. In Canada, there are 4 national parks where you can visit the Canadian Rockies and take in this stunning iconic landscape. If you're lucky, you might see a bighorn sheep!

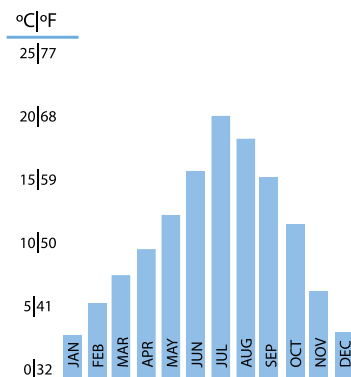

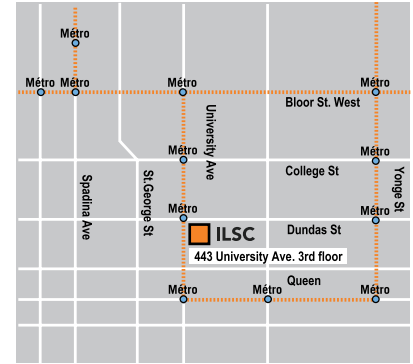

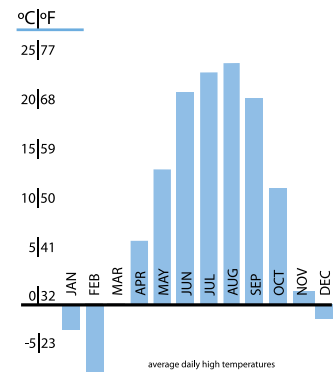
average daily high temperatures

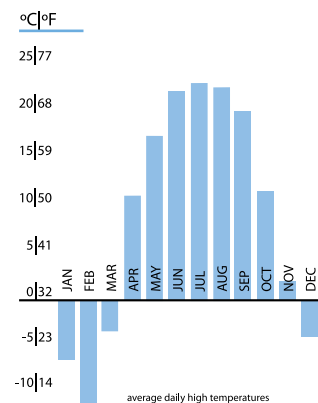

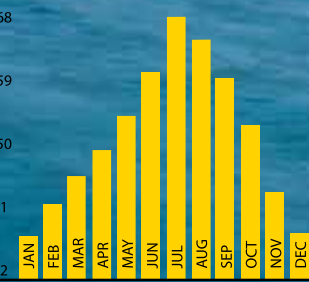

1 GREAT BARRIER REEF

Head North and visit the largest barrier reef in the world. Perhaps one of Australia's most well-known tourist spots, the Great Barrier Reef is a divers' wonderland. Don't miss the opportunity to explore Australia under the sea.

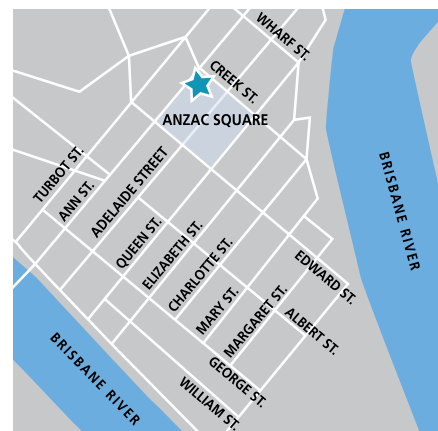

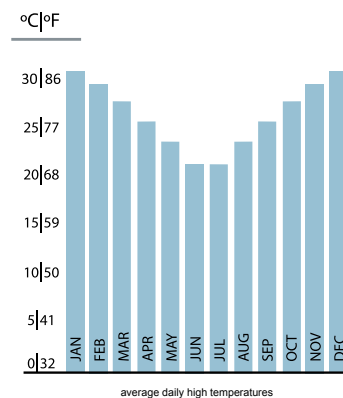
BRISBANE

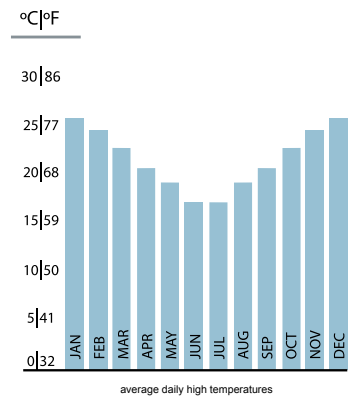

1 Rajasthan

Known as “The Princely State of India”, Rajasthan offers one of the most unique sightseeing experiences the world over. Visit the Ranthambore National Park to see Tigers in their natural state, or explore the rich and varied folk culture that exists among Rajasthan’s many villages.

2 Agra - Taj Mahal

8 Varanasi

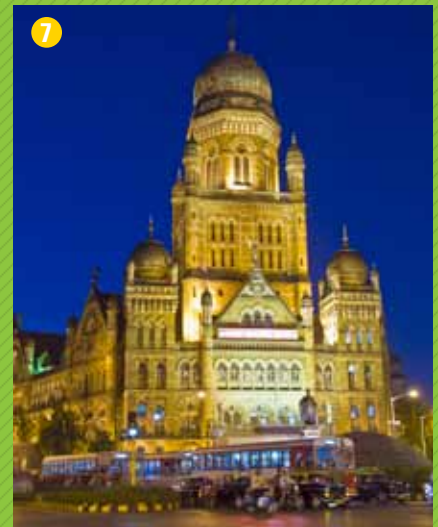

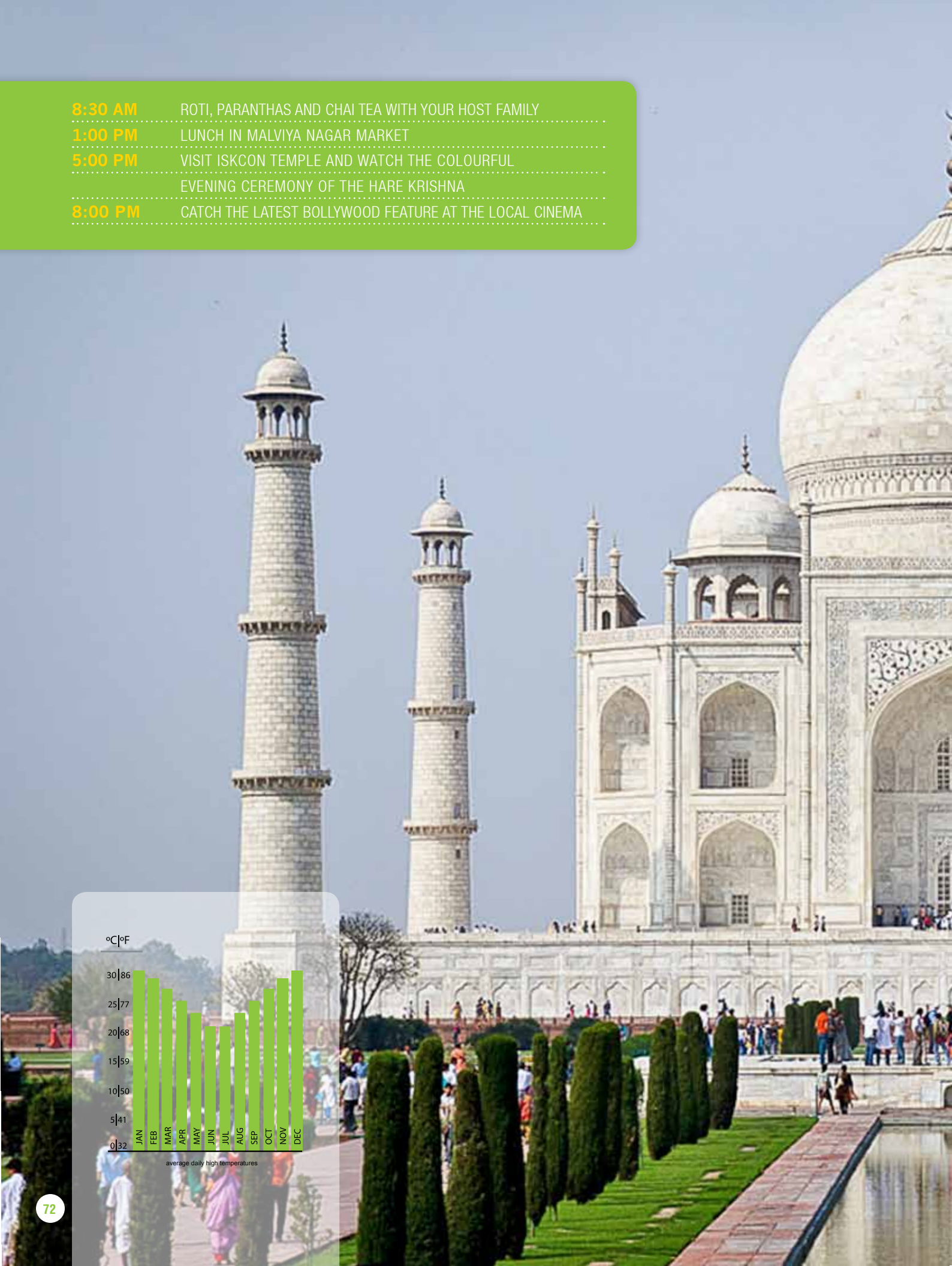
10 Rishikesh

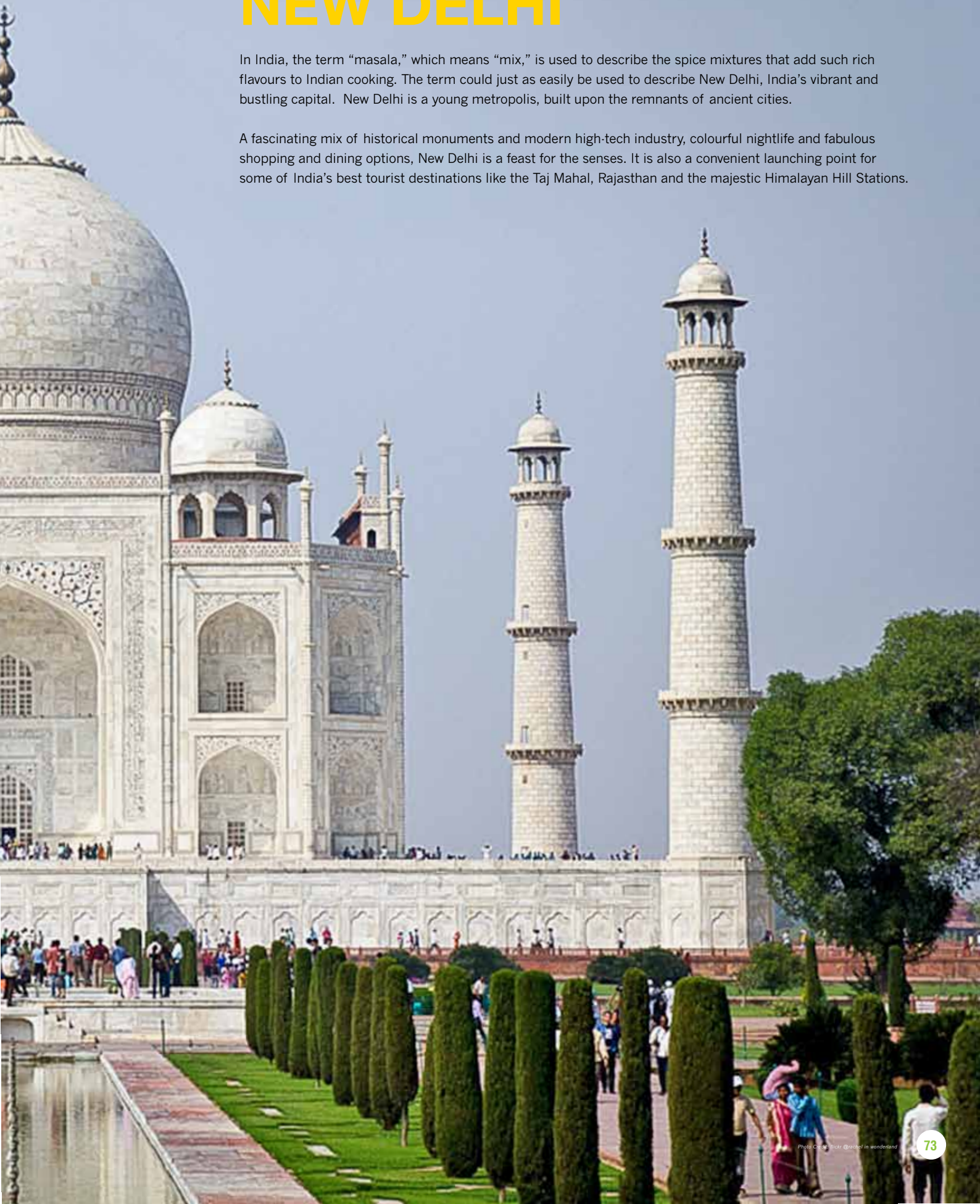

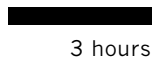

Greystone College's Hospitality Management Diploma program is an intensive diploma program designed specifically to meet the vast employment needs, both staff and managerial, in the global Tourism, Hospitality, Resorts and Conventions markets. The Hospitality Management Diploma is made up of two 12 week certificates, the International Hotel Management Certificate and the Convention Management Certificate. Students may take certificates individually or complete the whole program to receive the diploma.

INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS MANAGEMENT DIPLOMA **V**

The International Business Management Diploma is made up of three one-month certificates: The Business Management Certificate, the Business Communications Certificate and the International Business and Trade Certificate. Students may choose to complete only one certificate specialization or complete all three and earn the diploma. Upon successful completion of this twelve-week diploma program students will graduate with an excellent understanding of the essentials of business management. In addition, graduates of the diploma program are eligible for the Certificate in Supervisory Management from the Canadian Institute of Management.

CERTIFICATE IV IN INTERNATIONAL TRADE

B S

The Certificate in International Trade involves both Academic study and a hands-on Import Project. Students will cover a diverse range of skills and knowledge required for working in international trade/business across a range of levels. Topics include international transfer of services and international transport of goods: researching international business opportunities and markets; marketing goods and services internationally; obtaining specialist permits for import and export of goods, understanding international legal requirements for trade; forecasting international market and business needs; and promoting products and services to international markets.

DIPLOMA OF INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS **B S**

The Diploma of International Business provides students with a sound theoretical knowledge base in international business management. Students will develop a range of managerial skills to ensure that international business activities are conducted effectively in an organization.

DIPLOMA OF MARKETING **B S**

The Diploma of Marketing focuses on the skills required to research and analyse market needs, define target markets and develop marketing strategies. Students learn how to price and promote products and services, so they can produce a comprehensive marketing communications plan. Program includes an unpaid internship.

NIGHT TIME DOUBLE DIPLOMA PROGRAM: DIPLOMA OF INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS AND DIPLOMA OF MARKETING

B S

The double diploma program gives students a solid foundation in international business and the marketing knowledge and tools to complement it. On completing the program, students will have the knowledge to work effectively in the international business environment and have a solid theoretical understanding of what makes a business successful across borders. In addition they will have the ability and confidence to build a solid marketing strategy and the tools to adjust their business approach to respond to a dynamic and changing market.

VISAS AND IMMIGRATION

CANADA

The following is general information. Visa regulations are determined by Immigration Canada and are subject to change. Please verify visa information with the nearest Canadian Embassy or Consulate.

VISITOR VISA

International students who wish to study in Canada for up to 6 months may need a Visitor's Visa depending on the country for which they hold a passport. To see if this applies to you, please check the list of Countries and Territories Whose Citizens Require Visas in order to enter Canada as Visitors: <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp>

STUDY PERMIT

Students do not need a "Study Permit" for study programs that last 6 months or less.

If you plan to study in Canada for longer than 6 months, you must obtain a Study Permit. These are available through your local Canadian Visa Office. <http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/offices/missions.asp>

Students may apply for a Study Permit even if they are going to study for 6 months or less. If students are coming for less than 6 months and are thinking of possibly extending

their studies to more than 6 months, they should apply for a Study Permit in their home country. Students can extend their Study Permit from within Canada, but they cannot get a Study Permit from within Canada.

WORK PERMIT

For unpaid Internship Programs (VIP) of less than 6 months in total, students are not required to obtain a Work Permit or Study Permit.

For unpaid Internship Programs (VIP) lasting more than 6 months in total, students are required to obtain a Study Permit before entering Canada. A Work Permit is not required.

For paid work/internship programs, students should obtain a Study Permit before entering Canada. A Study Permit will allow the school to assist students in applying for a Work Permit after arriving in Canada. In some instances Canadian consulates provide a Work Permit along with the Study Permit.

USA

VISA INFORMATION

The following is general information. Visa regulations are determined by a department of the USA government called US Citizenship and Immigration Services and are subject to change. Please verify visa information with the nearest USA Embassy or Consulate.

VISITOR VISA

The visitor visa is a non-immigrant visa for foreign citizens desiring to enter the United States temporarily for business (B-1), or for pleasure or medical treatment (B-2).

If you are entering the United States primarily for tourism, but want to take a short course of study of less than 18 hours per week (Full-Time or Semi Full-Time schedule at ILSC), you may be able to do so on a visitor visa. If your course of study is more than 18 hours a week, you will need a student visa.

STUDENT VISA

The F-1 student visa is a non-immigrant visa for foreign citizens whose primary purpose of entering the United States is to study. Students enrolling in the Full-Time Intensive schedule at ILSC must obtain an F-1 student visa. Students applying for an F-1 student visa need to obtain a SEVIS* generated I-20 form from ILSC. In order to receive an I-20 form, please follow the admission instructions in ILSC Application Checklist.

The U.S. Department of State encourages students to apply for their visa as soon as they are prepared to do so to provide ample time for visa processing. First time student visa applicants are, in most countries,

required to appear for an in-person interview. However, each embassy and consulate sets its own interview policies and procedures regarding student visas. Students should consult Embassy web sites or call for specific application instructions.

*SEVIS is a system that maintains accurate and current information on non-immigrant students from the time a school issues an I-20 form for them. SEVIS enables schools to transmit mandatory information and event notifications via the internet to the Department of Homeland Security and Department of State throughout a student's stay in the United States.

AUSTRALIA

All students planning to study at ILSC-Australia will require an appropriate visa. The following is general information. Visa regulations are determined by the Immigration Department in Australia and are subject to change. Please verify visa information with the nearest Australian Embassy or Consulate. Please refer to the following website to determine what type of visa you will need to study at ILSC-Australia: <http://www.immi.gov.au/students/students/chooser/>

STUDENT VISA:

Students applying for a Student Visa must be enrolled for Full-Time study and submit an electronic confirmation of enrollment from the school, along with the appropriate visa paperwork. On approval from Australian immigration a Student Visa will be issued for the duration of your studies, and allows students to get permission to work 20 hours a week, with some restrictions.

WORKING HOLIDAY VISA

Students who apply for and receive a Working Holiday Visa can study for 4 months and can work full-time for a maximum of 6 months for one employer. Students on this visa are responsible for arranging their own health and travel insurance.

OTHER VISAS:

There are other visas that may allow study options as part of their conditions. Please check with the immigration link above or with the closest Embassy or Consulate. However, students with focused long term study needs should come on a Student Visa.

VISITOR VISA

TOURIST VISA

Students who plan to study for less than 6* months will require a tourist visa. Tourist visas are valid for single entry only and cannot be extended. Once you leave the country you must wait 2 months before you can reapply and you cannot extend your tourist visa in India or in a neighbouring country.

STUDY PERMIT

Students who intend to study in India for more than 6 months will require a Study Permit. Study Permits allow multiple entries, and are issued for the duration of your study, as per your letter of acceptance.

*The length of the tourist visa may vary depending on your country of origin. Please check with your local Indian Consulate/Embassy for current information, and to apply for visas.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

BRITISH COLUMBIA (ILSC VANCOUVER CAMPUS)

Please obtain private medical insurance for your first six months. You can purchase medical insurance through ILSC, please contact us for details.

ONTARIO AND QUEBEC (ILSC TORONTO AND MONTRÉAL CAMPUSES)

Please obtain private medical insurance before your arrival. Provincial medical plans do not cover international students. You can purchase medical insurance through ILSC, please contact us for details.

ILSC-SAN FRANCISCO

Upon arrival, all ILSC students must show proof of valid medical insurance for their entire term at ILSC. Students may acquire insurance from their own country through their agency, or on their own.

ILSC-AUSTRALIA

*Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) is a compulsory requirement for a student visa. ILSC can arrange the purchase of OSHC for all students enrolled at our school. Visit www.medibank.com.au for more information.

ILSC-NEW DELHI

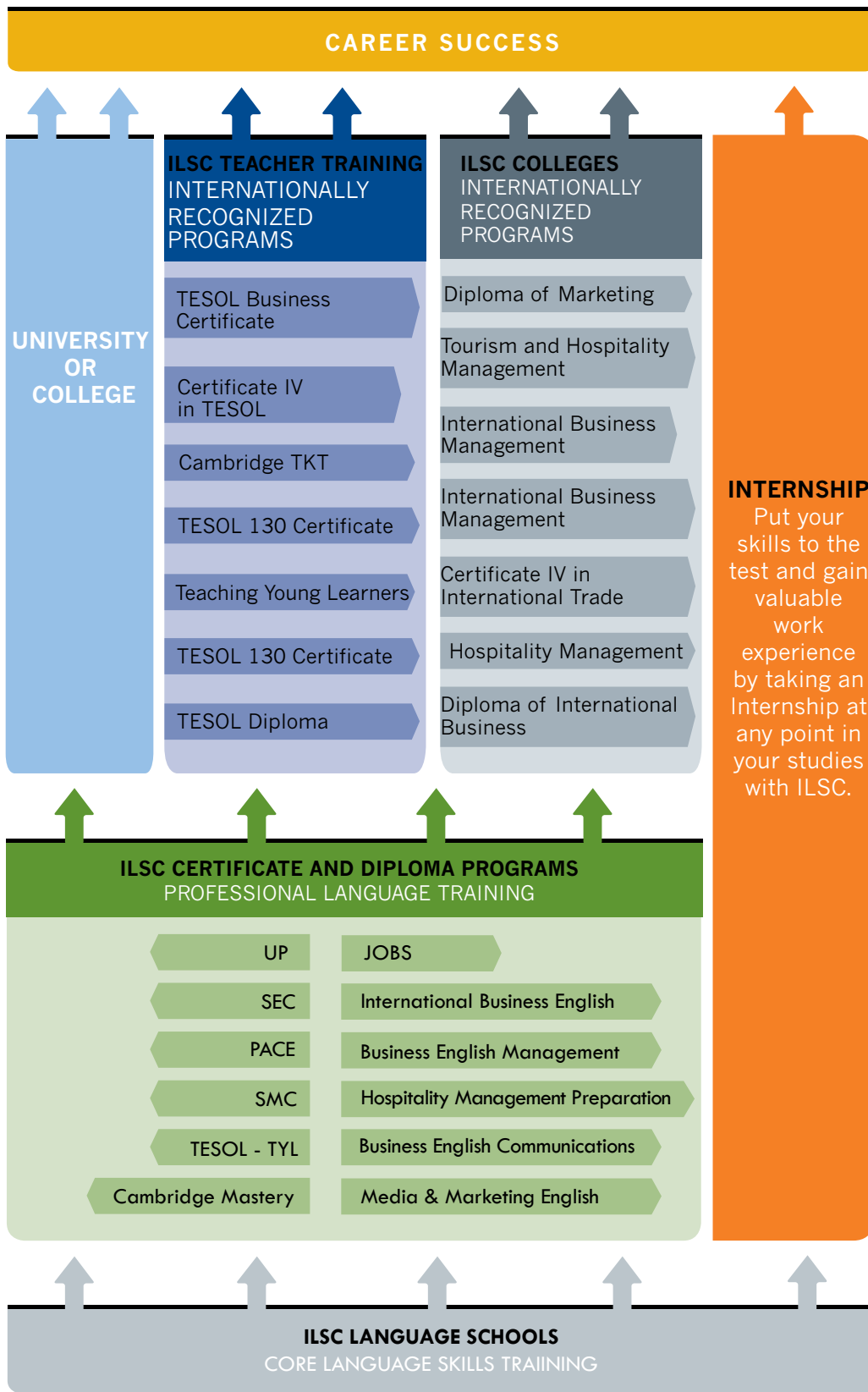
