

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Admission requirements are the minimum qualifications you need before you can be selected for admission to a course of study.

As an international student attempting one of the following qualifications, you apply for admission through UAC International and will generally be selected on the basis of your performance in these studies (that is, your ATAR or equivalent):

- an Australian Year 12 qualification (either offshore or in Australia)
- an International Baccalaureate
- a New Zealand National Certificate of Educational Achievement Level 3.

When assessing your application La Trobe University may take any or all of your qualifications or attempts at study into account.

Limited ATAR

The University accepts the NSW Limited ATAR for admission purposes – read section 6.8 in Part 1.

Additional selection criteria

In addition to achieving the standard of performance required for admission, for certain courses you must also satisfy any additional selection criteria. These criteria may include portfolio, interview, audition, questionnaire or

test and are taken into account either instead of, or in conjunction with, your ATAR or equivalent.

Offers made to applicants who have an ATAR (or equivalent) below the cut-off

La Trobe University has a number of alternative pathways for admission that may allow applicants to receive an offer to a course even though they have an ATAR or equivalent below the cut-off. They are:

- guaranteed entry see below
- strong performance in Year 12 subjects relevant to the course of study applies to some courses; read course descriptions for details.

La Trobe University will guarantee entry into undergraduate places in selected courses in 2012 for all current Year 12 students who achieve the required ATAR (or equivalent) and meet any prerequisites and special requirements. Applicants who do not achieve an ATAR (or equivalent) that will guarantee them entry into a course will be considered through normal selection processes. Read individual course entries.

Strong performance in Year 12 subjects relevant to the course of study

Strong performance (Band 4 and above) in Year 12 subjects relevant to the course of study applies to some courses - check course descriptions for details (www.uac.edu.au/international/course-search/).

OVERSEAS STUDENT HEALTH COVER (OSHC)

La Trobe University currently has an agreement with OSHC Worldcare, a private health fund, for the provision of OSHC. Under this agreement, students pay an OSHC premium for the entire length of their course with the first instalment of tuition fees. This one-off payment saves students needing to renew their OSHC each year and avoids any price increases during that period. For more information visit www.oshcworldcare.com.au

Commencing students wishing to use another healthcare provider must make payment arrangements with the provider directly, as La Trobe can only accept payment for OSHC Worldcare. Students must provide proof of OSHC to the Department of Immigration and Citizenship (DIAC) before their eCOE is released and student visa is issued.

Acceptance

Successful applicants will receive information on accepting their offer by email or letter from our International Office. Deferment

Applications for deferment are considered on an individual basis. International students holding a student visa should note that deferral for more than six months usually results in cancellation of their student visa. Within 28 days of the date of deferral, a student is required either to leave the country or to apply for another visa.
