Intensive topics are offered in some postgraduate programs, enabling you to complete a topic in a short amount of time and submit assessments from home. Some postgraduate study can even be undertaken by distance education or flexible delivery, making it accessible from anywhere in the world – whether you're overseas or just around the corner.

Postgraduate study at Flinders is not just about lectures and tutorials, and our research

programs are not just about books and theory. Depending on your course, you may also have laboratory or practical classes, fieldwork or work placements.

The postgraduate programs in Groundwater Hydrology offered at Flinders University have opened up a huge array of job opportunities for me. When I started studying at Flinders I was given the option to first enrol in the Graduate Certificate, which is a six-month course. I enjoyed the course and decided to progress to the Graduate Diploma in Science (Groundwater Hydrology). The diversity of subjects offered is great and you have the choice of focusing on areas of Hydrology that are of particular interest to you. There is a great balance between spending time in the classroom for lectures and actually getting outside and conducting field work. This balance played a key role in preparing me with the skills and training necessary for when I began working in the industry. Your postgraduate study program can be undertaken by coursework, research or a combination of the two.

Coursework: where you usually attend lectures and tutorials, with assessment and possibly some practical work throughout the course.

Coursework with a research component: where research is only a minor part of a coursework program.

Research: where your degree is awarded primarily on the basis of a thesis embodying the results of a unique research project.

Research with a coursework component: a research degree where coursework is only a minor part of the research program.

Postgraduate programs by coursework

A number of qualifications may be offered in each study area. There are minimum entry requirements for each course, however a variety of entry pathways are available. Applicants who do not meet the requirements may also be admitted subject to specific conditions.

Most Graduate Entry Professional Conversion Courses, Graduate Certificates, Graduate Diplomas and Masters degrees require a threeyear undergraduate degree from an Australian university.*

*Applicants with overseas qualifications require equivalent qualifications to those above as well as English language proficiency.

Graduate Entry Professional Conversion Courses

Graduate Entry Professional Conversion Courses require you to already hold an approved undergraduate degree or equivalent and are designed to give you the qualifications required to enter professional fields. They are available in a wide range of study areas and normally take less time to complete than a first degree.

Graduate Certificate

Graduate Certificates are designed as an introduction to a new area of study or to enhance the skills and knowledge gained from an undergraduate degree. They normally take one semester to complete, but can be completed parttime over two years and may provide a pathway for further studies.

Graduate Diploma

The Graduate Diploma is a more specialised course designed to provide an introduction to a new area of study, a professional qualification or to enhance the skills and knowledge already gained by completing a Graduate Certificate. The Graduate Diploma normally takes two semesters to complete if studying full-time and may provide a pathway into a Masters degree.

Masters degrees

Masters degrees have been especially designed to cater for busy professionals and provide the opportunity to study and network with other like-minded people. They comprise two thirds or more of coursework and may include a research component. Masters degrees normally take one to two years to complete and can generally be undertaken part-time.

Research

Getting into research

Flinders offers research degree studies in the Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) and Masters degrees. The minimum requirement for candidature is normally a four-year Honours degree or equivalent, with Second Class Honours (2A) or higher, or a coursework Masters with a distinction average.

Today, many employers recognise the value of skills and experience gained through research and may support you in undertaking postgraduate study while in your current job. So postgraduate study is not just a way of beginning a career as a researcher, but an opportunity to enhance and improve your career options in a wide variety of fields.

If you wish to embark on higher degree study in a different field from that of your Honours study, or feel that you may not meet all of the entry requirements, you should contact the University to discuss the various pathways available.

Postgraduate research at Flinders

At Flinders, we believe investigation and enquiry are essential to an academic institution. We have a high research profile and consistently rank among Australia's top universities on a per capita basis for research spending and for the citation of our work in professional journals.

Flinders offers research degree supervision across all disciplines and our size and compact main campus make meaningful collaboration between disciplines a reality. The University's research effort is supported by around 850 academic staff, as well as full-time research staff, general staff and about 900 higher degree research students along with research facilities at our main campus in Adelaide and our sites in Port Lincoln, Darwin, Alice Springs, Mt Gambier and Warrnambool.

Flinders provides a stimulating and supportive environment for higher degree research in all faculties and across a broad range of disciplines. You will have access to high quality facilities and be supervised by academics with proven track records in attracting research funding and producing quality results. We encourage student involvement in research by providing scholarships, supporting individual projects, and providing travelling awards, conference travel assistance and funding for research field trips. Postdoctoral research

Research Training Scheme

Commencing domestic research higher degree students receive places under the Commonwealth Government's Research Training Scheme for up to four years fulltime equivalent study for a Doctorate or two years for a Masters degree.

Accounting

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. Standard and advanced streams available.

The Master of Accounting offers the right balance of practice and theory to prepare you for a successful career as an accounting or business professional. Graduates are eligible for membership with CPA Australia and the Institute of Chartered Accountants in Australia.

Graduates are suitable for careers such as auditor, budget accountant, bursar, cost accountant, finance manager, forensic accountant, investment analyst, liquidator and receiver, management accountant, systems accountant, and taxation consultant.

Aged Care Administration

GC: 1 year PT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent and 2 years professional experience in the health sector.

The Graduate Certificate in Aged Care Administration provides students working in health and aged care with the opportunity to acquire deeper knowledge and enhanced skills in aged care management. The course builds on current workplace experience and promotes the application of management theories to existing problems.

Graduates are suited to careers in health and aged care organisations.

Archaeology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in archaeology or closely related discipline.

Our postgraduate programs in Archaeology aim to increase your theoretical knowledge and applied skills to give you an appropriate depth of understanding in a number of related specialisations in archaeology.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas such as the government sector, private consulting, museums, and research institutions.

Asian Governance

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our postgraduate programs in Asian Governance introduce you to contemporary theories and practical examples of social, economic and political change in Asia as well as developing your understanding of conceptual skills and regional knowledge concerned with governance in the Asian region.

Graduates are suitable for careers as diplomats or risk analysts with employers such as local government, AusAID and international nongovernment organisations.

Audiology

M: 2 years FT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent with a GPA of 5.0 or higher plus interview.

The Master of Audiology prepares you for clinical practice as an audiologist in a range of urban, rural and remote settings, to be a well-informed health professional, and to acquire critical skills in appraising scientific and clinical information that will assist your professional development.

Graduates are suitable for careers in the public and private sectors, in both diagnostic and rehabilitation practices, and in hospitals, education settings, special schools, early intervention centres, universities, research facilities and hearing aid companies.

Biotechnology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in biological, agricultural or medical science with a GPA of 5.0 or higher.

Our postgraduate programs in Biotechnology provide you with research training across a variety of specialist areas in medicine and science, enabling you to develop your scientific, entrepreneurial and research skills.

Graduates are suitable for careers in medical, pharmaceutical, agricultural, industrial and environmental applications of biotechnology.

Business Administration

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) MBA: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) MBA (Advanced): 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent or relevant work experience.

Our postgraduate programs in Business Administration provide you with an understanding of the context in which organisations operate. The Master of Business Administration (MBA) is also available in the following specialisations: Health, Education, Biotechnology, International Business, Finance, Tourism.

The Master of Business Administration is reserved for people with significant work experience.

Business and Technology

M: 2 year FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree in business, engineering or science from Flinders or equivalent. Not available to graduates of the Flinders Bachelor of Business and Technology.

The Master of Business and Technology equips you with strong business, entrepreneurial, management and communication knowledge and skills. You will also gain practically oriented skills through a significant period of work experience/practicum, which aims to increase your ability to manage projects in a scientific, medical and/or engineering environment.

Graduates become key drivers of innovation and commercialisation in existing enterprises and can play an instrumental role in creating a new company or venture.

Business (Research)

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT)

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Applicants with an undergraduate degree only must have a GPA of 5.25 or higher. Competence in your area of research must also be demonstrated.

The Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma in Research (Business) aim to develop your understanding of research issues and methods, including ethical responsibilities and regulations.

Graduates are suitable for careers in research within a wide range of business-related fields.

Child Well-Being and Protection

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor or Masters degree in social work, theology, teaching, nursing, allied health or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate in Child Well-Being and Protection is designed to enhance the knowledge and skills of social workers and other professionals who work with children and adolescents, especially in the child protection area.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide range of social work areas related to child well-being and protection.

Chronic Conditions Management

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent plus statement detailing reasons for seeking the qualification and relevant experience.

The Graduate Certificate in Health (Self Management) and the Graduate Diploma in Chronic Conditions Management meet the extended professional development needs of graduates involved in the policy, planning or delivery of services to people with chronic physical or mental health conditions.

A Master of Public Health (Chronic Conditions Management) is also available.

Graduates are suitable for careers in the government, private and community health sectors.

Clinical Education

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in healthrelated field.

Our postgraduate programs in Clinical Education are designed to provide health professionals with the advanced knowledge and skills required to deliver clinical education in health service settings.

Graduates are suitable for careers in clinical teaching in the government and private health sectors.

Clinical Rehabilitation

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in a healthrelated field.

Our postgraduate programs in Clinical Rehabilitation provide opportunities for health professionals from any field to enhance their knowledge, skills and attitudes in clinical rehabilitation. Masters can be undertaken by coursework or research.

Graduates are suitable for careers in the government, private and community health sectors.

Creative Arts

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent with major studies in the preferred stream. Statement, portfolio and/or interview also required.

The Graduate Diploma in Creative Arts and the Master of Creative Arts can be taken in one of the following streams: Creative Writing, Drama or Screen Production.

Graduates are suitable for careers in the creative arts and communication industries in areas such as writing, editing, publishing, arts administration, acting, directing, script writing, screen production and screen editing.

Cultural Heritage Management

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in archaeology, tourism or closely related discipline.

Our postgraduate programs in Cultural Heritage Management are particularly aimed at students with an interest in specialist areas of cultural heritage management, such as archaeology, cultural heritage consultancy, heritage tourism, interpretation and visitor management.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas such as the government sector, private consulting sector, museums and research institutions.

Development Administration

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate in Development Administration provides an introductory qualification to those wishing to undertake higher qualifications in public administration and international development.

Graduates are suitable for careers in the public sector and in a variety of development agencies. The program is of direct relevance to those who are involved in managing development programs and to those who wish to build a career in the development field.

Disability Studies

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our postgraduate programs in Disability Studies are professionally oriented and enable you to cover topics relevant to your area or specialty including autism, intellectual disability, Down Syndrome and dual disabilities.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide variety of fields supporting people with disabilities. The programs are designed to meet the needs of practitioners working in education, health and community services and of teachers seeking specialised education in this field.

Education

GC: 6 months to 1.5 years FT (OEPT), depending on stream M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

EdD: 3 years FT (OEPT)

Engineering (Electronics)

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in engineering with appropriate electronics content.

Our postgraduate programs in Engineering (Electronics) provide you with the professional skills and knowledge required for the systematic development of complex electronic engineering systems.

Graduates are suitable for careers as electronics engineers and can fill the increasing demand for electronics expertise across a widening array of applications.

Environmental Compliance

GC: 1 year PT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent or five years relevant professional experience.

The Graduate Certificate in Environmental Compliance has a strong industry focus aimed at equipping students with the necessary knowledge to apply environmental compliance theory and practice in workplaces. The course builds on your current workplace experience and exposes you to both the theory and practice of environmental regulation and investigation of possible regulatory breaches and enforcement of those regulations.

Environmental Health Practice

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in science with study in basic sciences (eg chemistry, physics, microbiology, physiology, life sciences).

The Graduate Diploma in Environmental Health Practice provides you with comprehensive training in environmental health relating to current and emerging issues.

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas including policy, research, planning and on-ground management.

Gender and Development

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Diploma in Gender and Development combines conventional women's studies with politics, sociology and broader issues of development and the rights of people in society (development studies, international relations and politics).

Graduates are suitable for careers in international development programs, non-government organisations, the public service, foreign affairs, journalism and teaching.

Gender Mainstreaming Policy and Analysis

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate in Gender Mainstreaming Policy and Analysis provides you with a comprehensive knowledge of gender mainstreaming and gender analysis, giving you the opportunity to focus on a specific policy area such as public health, education, economic management or human resources.

Our postgraduate programs in Applied Gerontology provide you with the knowledge and skills involved in social and clinical gerontology. The Masters program can include coursework, a project or research. A practicum is also included. Graduates are suitable for careers working in various roles in services for older people.

Groundwater Hydrology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in any relevant discipline of science or engineering.

Our postgraduate programs in Science (Groundwater Hydrology) provide you with an understanding of environmental hydrological processes and phenomena, including but not limited to groundwater. Masters students combine coursework with a significant research/industry training project.

Graduates are suitable for careers with government agencies, environmental consultancies, and water utilities.

Health Administration

GC: 1 year PT GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) MSc: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent and 2 years professional work experience in the health sector.

Our postgraduate programs in Health Administration give you an understanding of management theories and principles and their application in health service management. The programs prepare you with the skills required to meet the many complex challenges that leaders face in the modern health system.

Graduates are suited to careers in health care organisations.

Health and International Development

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. Progressive and advanced level entry also available.

The Master of Health and International Development has been designed for people working in government, non-government organisations or private consulting organisations.

Graduates are suitable for careers in health and development where they are able to plan, develop, manage, evaluate and implement health initiatives and development programs.

History and Heritage Studies

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma in Applied History and Heritage Studies provide you with training in applied history with an opportunity to specialise in genealogy, archaeology, museum studies or heritage studies.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a number of areas including genealogy, archaeology, research, and as practitioners in government or other public or private institutions.

Indigenous and Remote Child Health

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Medical degree and full or conditional registration plus internship.

The Graduate Diploma in Indigenous and Remote Child Health provides you with the opportunity to acquire advanced paediatric clinical knowledge/ skills and an understanding of community child health principles, values and practices that contribute to improving health access for children. It combines clinical and curative aspects of child health with a community focus on promoting and maintaining child health.

Information Technology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

International Law and International Relations

M: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: 4-year Bachelor degree in law, international relations, politics or equivalent; or 3-year Bachelor degree in related discipline with minimum 3 years FT or equivalent work experience.

The Master of Laws (International Law and International Relations) crosses disciplinary boundaries between the School of Law and the School of Political and International Studies and explores some of the most topical themes present in Australia and the world.

Graduates are suitable for careers in international organisations and government, business, and not-for-profit sectors.

International Relations

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) MA: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our postgraduate programs in International Relations cover key theoretical concepts, major historical themes and significant current issues and provide you with grounding in academic debates and research literature in international relations.

Graduates are suitable for careers in foreign affairs, defence, international trade and related areas.


GC: 1.5 years PT

GD: 3 years PT

E: Approved Bachelor degree or equivalent. Beginners and advanced level entry available.

The Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma in Language enable university graduates to take a language they have not previously studied at university level. They are designed to provide competence in French, Spanish, Italian, Modern Greek or Indonesian, increase cross-cultural understanding and provide the academic rigour of formal language study.

Language Studies

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

The Master of Language Studies provides you with an advanced level of understanding of Cultural Studies and/or Applied Linguistics relevant to French, Italian, Modern Greek, Spanish or Indonesian.

Graduates are suitable for careers as language professionals. The course provides advanced practical language training and vocational knowledge and abilities in areas relevant to the language professional.

Language Teaching

GC: 1 year PT

GD: 2-3 years PT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. You must also be eligible for registration as a teacher in Australia, and have minimum 1 year of teaching experience in a school or other approved institution.

Our postgraduate programs in Language Teaching provide you with training in Languages other than English (LOTE) teaching methodology, the use of LOTE resources, and knowledge of the culture and society of your target language/country.

Graduates are suitable for careers as LOTE teachers of French, Italian, Modern Greek, Spanish or Indonesian in both public and private schools. This course is designed for the professional development of qualified teachers.

Laws and Legal Practice (Graduate Entry)

B: 3-3.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Flinders offers the Bachelor of Laws and Legal Practice as a Graduate Entry Professional Degree. The course enables you to acquire the essential foundational legal skills needed to practise as a solicitor or barrister.

Many graduates are employed by large firms or by government and private-sector organisations to assist with the legal complexities of modern business. Others work within policy development, administration or law reform.

Loss, Grief and Trauma Counselling

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate in Loss, Grief and Trauma Counselling provides you with an understanding of theories related to loss, grief and trauma experiences and the ability to counsel people in a culturally effective manner.

This is a specialised course for social workers, nurses, teachers, counsellors and other professionals who wish to gain the specific skills and knowledge required to assist people suffering loss, grief or trauma.

Maritime Archaeology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in archaeology.

Our postgraduate programs in Maritime Archaeology are currently the only active programs of their kind in Australia and provide you with a sound theoretical and methodological grounding in maritime archaeology.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas such as the government sector, private consulting, museums and research institutions.

Medicine/Surgery

B: 4 years FT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent plus GAMSAT and interview.

The Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery is an integrated program that provides an alternative to the traditional pathway from secondary school to an undergraduate medical course. Throughout the course there are 3 broad topics or themes: Doctor and Patient; Knowledge of Health and Illness; and Doctor, the Profession and Society.

In addition to clinical practice in a wide range of medical specialities, medical graduates may work in research, public health or community aid around the world or in health administration.

The Flinders Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery can be undertaken either in Adelaide or Darwin.

Mental Health Nursing

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT)

E: Nursing degree or equivalent and registered as nurse with current practising certificate.

Our postgraduate programs in Mental Health Nursing offer registered nurses the opportunity to study and develop skills in the specialist field of mental health nursing within a framework of primary health care. The Master of Mental Health Nursing is available in Clinical, Coursework or Research streams.

Graduates are eligible to apply for registration as a Mental Health Nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

Mental Health Sciences

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in a healthrelated area, minimum 2 years clinical experience in mental health plus a written statement and interview.

Our postgraduate programs in Mental Health Sciences equip people from a variety of health professions with knowledge and understanding of the theory, principles and practice of mental health sciences with an emphasis on cognitive behavioural therapy (CBT).

Graduates are suitable for careers as therapists, educators, clinical supervisors and researchers in mental health sciences and related areas, and as CBT specialists.

Midwifery

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Midwifery degree or equivalent and registration as a midwife with current practising certificate.

The Midwifery programs provide you with the opportunity to advance the discipline of midwifery, promote excellence in midwifery practice, participate in the delivery of midwifery care and plan, implement and disseminate midwifery research. Masters is undertaken by coursework with either a thesis or a project.

Graduates are suitable for a wide range of careers in midwifery, such as working in clinical practice in hospitals or in community, research, education or management roles.

Midwifery (Post-Registration)

B: 1.5 years FT (OEPT)

E: Applicants must be registered nurses and/or midwives with a current practising certificate. Fitness self-declaration, police check and immunisation record also required.

The Bachelor of Midwifery (Post-Registration) offers 2 pathways.

The Registered Midwife pathway is for registered midwives who would like to upgrade their qualifications to a midwifery degree.

The Registered Nurse pathway is for registered nurses who would like to become eligible to register with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia as a registered midwife.

Musculoskeletal Medicine

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) E: Applicants must be registered medical practitioners.

The Graduate Certificate and Graduate Diploma in Musculoskeletal Medicine are designed to provide medical practitioners with the scientific and biomedical bases to comprehend the functioning of the musculoskeletal system and the skills to diagnose, assess and treat musculoskeletal dysfunction.

Nanotechnology

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in relevant discipline of science or engineering.

Our postgraduate programs in Nanotechnology provide you with an understanding of the basic scientific concepts underpinning nanoscience and the properties of materials and biomaterials at the atomic/molecular level. Masters is undertaken by coursework with a significant research/industry training project.

Graduates are suitable for careers in industry, research institutions and government organisations. The cross-disciplinary nature of the degree opens up many possibilities.

Neuroscience (Learning)*

GC: 1 year PT

E: Approved Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Certificate in Neuroscience (Learning)* focuses on enabling you to apply principles of modern neuroscience to understanding how people learn in the classroom environment. This program is a joint initiative of the three South Australian universities and is managed through Flinders.

The program is designed to equip professionals working in a range of fields with a basic knowledge of modern neuroscience delivered in a context relevant to their professional teaching practice.

Nursing

GC: 6 months to 1 year, depending on stream GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Nursing degree or equivalent and registered as

nurse with current practising certificate.

Specialisations are available in the following streams: Aged Care Nursing Studies; Child and Family Health Nursing; Clinical Nursing; Continence Nurse Advisor; Critical Care Nursing; Diabetes Management and Education; Emergency Nursing; General Practice Nursing; Mental Health Nursing; Women's Health; or the non-specialised stream.

The Master of Nursing is available in Clinical, Clinical and Research, Coursework, or Coursework and Research streams.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide range of nursing-related fields.

Nursing (Graduate Entry, Post-Registration, Re-Entry, Registered Midwife Entry)

B: 1-2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Each pathway has specific entry requirements. Check the Flinders postgraduate course website or SATAC for details.

Flinders offers several pathways to the Bachelor of Nursing including Graduate Entry, Post-Registration, Re-Entry, and Registered Midwife Entry. These pathways enable students from a variety of backgrounds to become registered nurses.

Graduates are eligible to apply for registration with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.

Nursing (Nurse Practitioner)

M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT)

E: Nursing or midwifery degree or equivalent and registered as general nurse or midwife with current practising certificate plus minimum 3 years post-registration experience; recognition as advanced practice nurse/midwife and demonstrated excellence within that role. You must also submit a Statement of Clinical Support.

The Master of Nursing (Nurse Practitioner) meets the needs of extended practice nurses/midwives from a range of health care settings and helps them develop the skills and knowledge required to undertake the role of nurse practitioner.

Graduates are suitable for careers in specialist nursing fields and leadership roles in a range of clinical nursing settings.

Nutrition and Dietetics

M: 2 years FT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent, with a minimum GPA of 5.0 including at least 25% biochemistry and 15% physiology topics of a full-time load at 2nd-year level. A statement is also required.

The Master of Nutrition and Dietetics offers advanced studies in nutritional science and food science, pathophysiology of nutrition-related illnesses, health promotion, communication skills, and clinical/public health nutrition skills.

Graduates are suitable for careers in hospitals, community health centres, private practice and consultancy, the food industry and research establishments.

Organisational Learning

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent and minimum 2 years relevant work experience.

The Graduate Certificate in Organisational Learning is designed for professionals who aim to build the human capital of their organisation to achieve the organisation's mission and strategic goals.

This course would be attractive to knowledge managers, human resource managers, school principals, university administrators, and line managers with a strong focus in human resource and organisational development.

Palliative Care

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) MSc: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Health-related Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our postgraduate programs in Palliative Care provide professional development for practitioners from any related background who are working in or have an interest in palliative care. Graduate Diploma and Masters degrees are available in Palliative Care, Paediatric Palliative Care and Palliative Care in Aged Care. The Graduate Certificate is only available in Palliative Care.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas ranging from rural and remote acute/community/ aged care settings to palliative care units and hospice care.

Population Studies

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) MA: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our comprehensive program in Applied Population Studies draws on theories and material from social and health sciences including demography, geography, sociology, economics and public health.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas such as overseas development, health and family planning, development planning, statistical services, policy, research and teaching.

Professional Studies (Business)

GC: 1 year PT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. Applicants will be short listed based on their degree qualifications.

The Graduate Certificate in Professional Studies (Business) increases understanding of the legal and operational aspects of a professional workplace and develops work-readiness skills. The course focuses on applied learning through small-group seminars in intensive teaching mode and usually includes a significant work placement.

Psychology

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent with 1st-year Psychology. Qualifying studies also available.

The Graduate Diploma in Psychology enables graduates of programs other than psychology to become eligable for admission to Psychology (Honours) at Flinders without completing a second undergraduate degree. It may also be suitable for graduates who completed a psychology major seven or more years ago, or those who have majored in psychology at an overseas institution.

Graduates are suitable for careers in psychology. Many people with existing careers in human services such as nursing, teaching, the public service and human resources also undertake this course to better understand human behaviour and to add depth to their knowledge and work skills.

Psychology (Clinical)

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Approved Honours degree of 1st class or upper 2nd class in psychology or equivalent.

The Master of Psychology (Clinical) prepares you to become a clinical practitioner in psychology by gaining theoretical knowledge, research and clinical skills that lead to professional registration. The course is undertaken as a combination of coursework, practicum and a research project.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide variety of mental health service settings.

Public Administration/ Public Policy

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent work experience.

Our postgraduate programs in public administration and policy provide an introduction to the theory and practice of public policy and public sector management and are designed to develop the knowledge and skills of those seeking or consolidating careers in public administration, public policy and the management of public and non-government organisations. The Masters provides a thorough grounding in public administration either in policy or management.

Graduates are suitable for careers in management or administrative roles in public or non-government organisations.

Public Health

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) DrPH: 3 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Graduate Certificates are available in the Health Promotion, Primary Health Care, Primary Health Care in Developing Countries, Public Health Research and Evaluation streams. Masters can be taken in the Primary Health Care, Public Health, Public Health Research, Health Service Management, Public Health Nutrition, Cancer Prevention, and Chronic Conditions Management streams. The Doctor of Public Health (DrPH) provides an advanced degree for practitioners and leaders in public health through coursework and research.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide range of areas in the public health workforce.

Remote Health Management

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in a healthrelated field.

Our postgraduate programs in Remote Health Management are designed for managers and practitioners looking to add management expertise to their existing skills base. The programs have a particular orientation to Indigenous health management and are applicable to remote areas in Australia and overseas.

Graduates are suitable for careers as remote health managers and practitioners in government, private and community health sectors.

Remote Health Practice

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent in health-related field.

Our postgraduate programs in Remote Health Practice are available in a number of specialty streams, including: Community-Based Rehabilitation, Nursing, Nurse Practitioner, Medical, Allied Health, Management, Individual Practice, Remote Indigenous Oral Health, Remote Pharmacy, Remote Child Protection.

Graduates are suitable for careers as remote area practitioners in government, private and community health sectors.

Screen and Media Production

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Approved degree in archaeology, cultural heritage management, maritime archaeology or tourism.

Our programs in Screen and Media Production provide post-production skills, knowledge of screen and media production, and an understanding of issues and theory in a related field of study (Archaeology, Cultural Heritage Management, Maritime Archaeology or Tourism). You will learn skills in a range of commonly employed documentary production practices and develop the ability to collaborate with peers on basic screen-production projects.

Social Work (Registered Social Worker Entry, Graduate Entry, Advanced Entry)

M/MA: 1-2 years FT (OEPT), depending on entry pathway

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. Entry requirements differ for applicants who have completed a Bachelor degree in an area other than social work. Qualifying studies available.

Flinders offers two distinct Masters programs in social work: the Master of Social Work which is a coursework degree and the Master of Arts (Social Work) which is a research degree. Different pathways are available depending on your prior educational experience.

Graduates are eligible for membership with the Australian Association of Social Workers.

Sociology

GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) MA: 1 year FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

The Graduate Diploma in Sociology and Master of Arts (Sociology) provide you with a solid introduction to sociological ways of thinking and an in-depth examination of social theory and social research methods essential to the practice of sociology.

Graduates are suitable for policy careers in the public service and non-governmental careers in the media, the arts and the technology sector.

Special Education (Graduate Entry)

B: 1 year FT (OEPT)

E: Successful completion of a 3-year teaching award or equivalent.

The Bachelor of Special Education provides additional specialist training for teachers at all levels of the school system. It allows teachers to prepare for work in special schools and special classes, for work as resource or support teachers in regular schools, or simply to extend their range of skills as regular classroom teachers able to cater for a wide ability range of students, including those with gifts and talents. The content of the program is appropriate for teachers at all levels from preschools through to TAFE.

Speech Pathology

M: 2 years FT

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent with minimum GPA of 5.0 plus an interview.

The Master of Speech Pathology prepares you to become a professional speech pathologist and uses best practice educational methods to develop graduates who are competent, reflective and innovative practitioners in the field of speech pathology.

Graduates are suitable for careers in a wide range of health and educational settings in both the public and private sectors in Australia and around the world.

Teaching

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

Our postgraduate programs in Teaching offer core topics in education studies, curriculum studies, and teaching practice as well as professional placements. Streams include: Early Childhood, Primary R-7, Secondary, Special Education (Primary R-7), Special Education (Secondary).

Graduates are suitable for careers as teachers in early childhood centres and schools, primary schools and secondary schools, and as special education teachers.

The Master of Teaching is a pre-service teaching degree and admission normally will not be granted to applicants who already hold a teaching qualification.

Teaching English as a Second Language

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Theological Studies

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent.

Our postgraduate programs in Theological Studies provide you with a sound understanding of contemporary theology and biblical studies with the opportunity to extend your investigations in your area of interest.

Graduates are suitable for careers as teachers of religious education and other professional positions in the field of religion.

Tourism

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 2 years FT (OEPT) E: Bachelor degree or equivalent with major in tourism or related discipline.

Our postgraduate programs in Tourism can be taken in the Festival and Event Design and Management stream or the non-specialised stream.

Graduates are suitable for careers in areas such as market planning, advertising and promotion, brochure production and tour planning. Employers include travel agencies, airlines, car rental companies, tour wholesalers, shipping/cruise lines, convention/exhibition centres and local government.

Water Resources Management

GC: 6 months FT (OEPT) GD: 1 year FT (OEPT) M: 1.5 years FT (OEPT)

E: 3-year Bachelor degree in related field with relevant experience.

Our postgraduate programs in Water Resources Management give you access to a wide range of expertise, resources and state-of-the-art research facilities to help you increase your knowledge and skills in water resources management.

Graduates are suitable for careers in government departments, consultancies, water management bodies, local government, aid organisations and agricultural organisations.

Women's Studies

M: 2 years FT (OEPT)

E: Bachelor degree or equivalent. Advanced entry also available.

The Master of Arts (Women's Studies) reflects the wide influence of gender issues on everything from political, cultural and social institutions to personal identity and relationships. By including social, cultural and political perspectives, the course helps you apply interdisciplinary approaches to feminist questions.

Graduates are suitable for careers in international development programs, non-government organisations, the public service, foreign affairs, journalism and teaching.

Flinders University's main campus is located in the suburb of Bedford Park, just a short drive south of Adelaide's Central Business District.

Public transport
