ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

You will be considered for entry on the basis of:

- performance in Australian Year 12 studies and/or
- higher education, tertiary or post-secondary qualifications and/or
- overseas qualifications considered equivalent to Australian qualifications as well as satisfying English language requirements and/or
- performance in one of the alternative entry schemes listed below.

The cut-offs published in the UAC 2012 Guide are to be used as a guide only.

You must also meet any additional selection criteria outlined under specific program entries in the UAC 2012 Guide or on UAC's website.

Music auditions

Applicants intending to apply for the B Music (480730) and the B Music/ B Arts (480740) are required to attend a compulsory audition. Applicants are required to submit an Audition Application form to the University by 4 May 2012.

The cut-offs listed in table 1 in the UAC 2012 Guide are a guide for Year 12 applicants. Cut-offs for non-Year 12 applicants may vary and may even be higher than the published cut-offs.

TAFE NSW students

TAFE students wishing to study at the University of Newcastle will need to study and complete at a minimum of Certificate III level to obtain an entry ranking sufficient for many of our programs.

Admission requirement for most programs is your ATAR or equivalent. You must also meet any program prerequisites and/or special admission

For most programs the University will accept previous university studies, studies in many TAFE courses, and completed accredited Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) courses from private providers, as a basis for admission. Other qualifications and vocational experience may also be considered for entry into some programs. For more information call the Enquiry Centre on (02) 4921 5000.

3 Overseas qualifications

Australian citizens or permanent residents of Australia with overseas qualifications are advised to inquire about eligibility for admission from the Admissions Centre at the University before applying through UAC.

If you hold overseas secondary or tertiary qualifications from countries where English is not the standard language of instruction, you must provide evidence of proficiency in the English language. For requirements read table 5 in the UAC 2012 Guide or visit UAC's website.

4 Alternative entry

If you do not have any of the formal educational qualifications specified in the above categories, you may seek admission to some University programs on the basis of your performance in one of the following:

- NSW Limited ATAR
- Open Foundation
- Special Tertiary Admissions Test (STAT)
- Post-secondary Vocational Education
- Newsten
- TAFE Tertiary Preparation Certificate.

RESTRICTIONS ON MID-YEAR ADMISSIONS

Only those courses listed in the table on pages 25-26 are available for mid-year admission.

EDUCATIONAL ACCESS SCHEME

If you have experienced educational or other disadvantage you may apply for the University's Educational Access Scheme. This Scheme awards up to four additional points to applicants who have demonstrated disadvantage.

Disadvantage may take the form of cultural background, low income, disability, health or family problems.

Applications for mid-year are made direct to the University using the Educational Access Schemes (EAS) application form contained in the EAS booklet produced by UAC. The booklet can be obtained from UAC or the University. Application forms should be returned directly to the University.

Applications need to be supported by relevant documentation – for example, medical certificates, principals' reports or proof of income.

Applications submitted after 8 June 2012 will not be considered.

COURSES AVAILABLE BY DIRECT APPLICATION

No direct applications are accepted for undergraduate programs available mid-year. All applications must be made through UAC.

ENROLMENT

Acceptance of offer

You will have seven days from the date of your offer to accept that offer.

To accept your offer you need to follow the instructions detailed in the information booklet that will accompany your UAC offer letter. If you do not comply with the requirements listed for your program, your offer may lapse and you may not be permitted to enrol.

Advanced standing/academic credit

If you have already successfully undertaken relevant study at another highereducation institution or at TAFE, you may be granted credit on enrolment in a program. You need to submit your credit application, with correctly verified copies of appropriate documentation such as academic transcripts and course content descriptions, to one of the Student Hubs.

Deferment of offer

You will have seven days from the date of your offer to defer that offer. Successful applicants are permitted to defer the commencement of most undergraduate courses for a period of one year. For further information read table 6 in the *UAC 2012 Guide*. If the University does not receive your request for deferment within seven days from the date on your offer letter, the offer may lapse, and you may be required to re-compete for a place.

Fees and charges

All students must pay student contributions for a Commonwealth-supported place – read section 7 in the $\it UAC 2012 Guide$.

Regular trains run from University Station Warabrook. Larger stations at Broadmeadow, Hamilton and Newcastle, have connecting trains to Sydney and the Central Coast. The Ourimbah station, a five-minute walk from the Ourimbah Campus, has frequent services to Sydney and Newcastle.

Car parking is available at both campuses for \$4/day at Callaghan and free at Ourimbah.
