### Terms used in this brochure

<b>Access Scholarship:</b>	Support provided to a student who can demonstrate they need financial support.
<b>Award:</b>	A general name for scholarships or bursaries.
<b>Bursary:</b>	The same as an Access Scholarship.
<b>Commencing student:</b>	Commencing university for the first time, including: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• HAP students who are continuing in the bachelor-level course to which they are admitted as a HAP student;</li><li>• Associate degree students transferring into bachelor-level study;</li><li>• UTAS College students commencing first year.</li></ul>
<b>Current student:</b>	Already completed one or more years of an undergraduate degree.
<b>Endowed Scholarship:</b>	A perpetual scholarship paid from income on a trust fund usually held by the University.
<b>Scholarship:</b>	A payment provided to a student to study, usually determined on academic merit.
<b>Sponsored Scholarship:</b>	A payment provided from a company or individual to a student (which may be in an area of interest to the company).

### Frequently asked questions

*Q. How many scholarships can I apply for?*

A. You may apply for all the scholarships that you believe you are eligible to receive. You are advised to carefully read the criteria/eligibility of each scholarship before applying.

*Q. Can I defer my scholarship?*

A. The University of Tasmania will not, in general, defer a scholarship unless there are exceptional circumstances. This can be discussed with the Tasmania Scholarships Office after you receive an offer.

*Q. Do I have to submit an application for every scholarship I want to apply for?*

A. Unless otherwise stated, submitting one online application is all that is required by ticking the box of each award you are eligible for.

*Q. I am an International Baccalaureate student. Can I apply for a scholarship?*

A. Yes, you may apply for as many scholarships as you believe you are eligible to receive by checking the criteria/eligibility of each.

*Q. I am an international student. Can I apply for a scholarship?*

A. Only international students who have completed Years 11 and 12 in Australia, and who have a tertiary entrance score, can apply for scholarships for 'commencing students'.

Current UTAS international students may apply for most scholarships listed under 'current students'.

*Q. When is the closing date for applications?*

A. Unless otherwise specified, applications for undergraduate scholarships close on 31 October 2010.

## TEN REASONS FOR CHOOSING THE UNIVERSITY OF TASMANIA

### 1. Tasmania Scholarships Program

The Tasmania Scholarships Program is one of the most extensive scholarship programs offered anywhere in Australia. It provides significant financial and academic support to study with UTAS at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. These scholarships are offered in all courses and selection is based on various criteria such as merit and/or financial need. They are available for Australian students and international students who have either completed their secondary schooling in Australia, or completed at least their first year of university study in Australia.

### 2. Strong sense of tradition

UTAS is Australia's fourth oldest university and one of the most distinguished in the country, with an outstanding record of academic achievement and leadership.

### 3. Unique course offerings

With a commitment to achieving excellence in teaching, learning and research, UTAS offers an extremely wide range of study areas, including many distinctive programs taught by academics who are leading researchers in their fields. UTAS currently offers over 100 bachelor degrees including combined degrees.

### 4. Smaller and friendlier

UTAS is the State's only university, with campuses in Hobart, Launceston and Burnie. With approximately 21,000 students UTAS is small enough to provide a unique environment and offers smaller classes, with friendly interaction between staff and students and a strong focus on the individual.

### 5. Affordable cost of living

UTAS students at Hobart, Launceston and Burnie campuses can live within walking distance (either on or off campus) of the University and have an affordable lifestyle.

### 6. Outstanding services and facilities

UTAS offers a wide range of services to help students in their initial transition to university and then to meet their ongoing needs throughout their degree, including student counselling, career development and employment services, child care, health services and disability services.

### 7. Strong international focus with opportunities to study overseas

UTAS provides opportunities for international study experiences through our Student Exchange Program. UTAS has exchange agreements with 60 universities in 31 different countries and students can earn credit towards their degree while experiencing a different country and its culture. The University also offers a number of Overseas Scholarships to help with the cost of the exchange.

Student organisations on campus offer a full range of student-focused facilities and activities, including entertainment, clubs and societies, legal and welfare advice and campus catering and retail services. All students are encouraged to participate and become involved in the vibrant, cultural and social environment at UTAS.

Students at the University of Tasmania enjoy the best of both worlds – excellence in academic teaching and research and a campus life free from overcrowding and access difficulties suffered at many larger universities.

## COMMENCING STUDENTS – TASMANIA SCHOLARSHIPS

### Don McNicol Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarship

This scholarship was established by the University Foundation to recognise the support provided to it by Professor Don McNicol while he was UTAS Vice-Chancellor.

**Value** Up to \$12,500 per year

**Number** 1

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** Available to students commencing study in any

academic area except for the Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery. Selection will be based on excellent achievement in studies at school and a high tertiary entrance score. International students who have completed Year 12 in a school in Tasmania or in another Australian state may apply for these awards. Students taking the International Baccalaureate are also welcome to apply.

### Premier of Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships

The Government of Tasmania, in partnership with the University, will offer these prestigious awards, in which the Premier takes great interest.

**Value** Up to \$12,500 per year

**Number** 3

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** Available to Tasmanian students commencing study in any academic area except for the Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery.

Generally one student from each region of Tasmania will be selected. Selection for the Premier of Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships will be based on the criteria outlined for the Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships.

Each scholarship provides a package of support to help with the costs of university study. What is included in the package will depend on your individual circumstances but may include a living allowance, course fees, support with accommodation, or an establishment allowance.

### Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships

The Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships are the most prestigious undergraduate scholarships offered by the University of Tasmania.

**Value** Up to \$12,500 per year

**Number** 6

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** Available to students commencing study in any academic area except for the Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery.

Selection for the Tasmania National Undergraduate Scholarships will be based on excellent achievement in studies at school and a high tertiary entrance score.

As this category of scholarship is very competitive, preference will be given to students showing evidence of a breadth of study, and the selection committee may look for success in subjects beyond those included in calculating your tertiary entrance score.

Each scholarship provides a package of support to help with the costs of university study. What is included in the package will depend on your individual circumstances but may include a living allowance, course fees, support with accommodation, an establishment allowance and an annual return airfare to Tasmania if you live interstate.

International students who have completed Year 12 in a school in Tasmania or in another Australian state may apply for these awards. Students taking the International Baccalaureate are also welcome to apply.

### Tasmania University Scholarships

Tasmania University Scholarships are available to students who have performed very well at school, TAFE or in the initial years of university study at another institution, and who are enrolling for the first time at the University of Tasmania.

**Value** Course fees (HECS)

**Number** Up to 50

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** As a general guide, Tasmania University Scholarships will only be offered to students achieving the highest tertiary entrance scores, or who have achieved at a similar high standard in a TAFE or university course.

Interstate students receive one return airfare per annum to their nearest capital city.

At least two of these scholarships will be provided in the Bachelor of Medicine/Bachelor of Surgery covering the cost of the HECS fees.

International students who have completed Year 12 in a school in Tasmania or in another Australian state may apply for these awards. Students taking the International Baccalaureate are also welcome to apply.





## COMMENCING STUDENTS – SPONSORED AND ENDOWED TASMANIA SCHOLARSHIPS

These scholarships are available for students commencing study in an undergraduate degree course at the University of Tasmania.

They are available through the University of Tasmania Foundation, which works with Tasmanian business, government and individuals to provide support for students at the University.

Many additional Tasmania University Scholarships are provided through the University of Tasmania Foundation to both commencing and current students. These are sponsored by individuals, Tasmanian and Australian industry, business and governments. Selection will be based largely on your school or university results and the quality of your application, although some scholarships in this category have other eligibility requirements specified by the donors.

Please include a CV or resume with your application. Make sure you cover in detail any work experience, sporting achievements, hobbies and interests, and take care with the accuracy (spelling, punctuation, grammar).

### Alumni Annual Appeal Tasmania University Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by the Alumni of the University through the annual appeal to members and graduates of the University.

**Value** \$3,000 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing any undergraduate course.

### Australian Croatian Social and Sporting Club of Launceston Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by funds made available by the Croatian Club committee when the club closed in 2004.

**Value** \$2,500  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** One year  
**Criteria** Available to a student of Croatian origin or a descendant of a person of Croatian origin, and who is preferably a Tasmanian resident. Open to both commencing and current students.

### Ball and Chain Grill Tasmania University Scholarship

This scholarship is offered by the Ball and Chain Grill, one of Hobart's best-known restaurants.

**Value** \$3,000  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** One year  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing in any undergraduate course.

In addition to academic achievement, the student should also demonstrate that they need financial support in order to study.

### BookEnd Environmental Scholarships

These scholarships are provided by private individuals and professionals to promote positive and cooperative environmental solutions and to provide inspiration and encouragement to students throughout our education system.

**Value** \$2,000 to \$5,000 per year  
**Number** Up to 3  
**Duration** Variable – dependent upon course  
**Criteria** Available to a student enrolled in any undergraduate, honours or postgraduate coursework study in any discipline (whether science, media, economics, law, etc.), provided there is an environmental angle and the above aims are met. ### Bruce Wall Estate Scholarships

These scholarships are provided from the estate of the late Bruce Wall, which supports a number of Tasmanian youth projects.

**Value** \$4,500 per year  
**Number** 2  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to students eligible to commence a course in agriculture or aquaculture/fisheries.

### Cynthia N Thun Scholarship in Music

The late Mrs Cynthia Thun, a former Tasmanian who lived most of her adult life in the United States, has endowed this award to support a talented music student.

**Value** \$2,500 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing study at the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music.

### Delta Hydraulics Scholarship in Engineering

**Value** \$2,500 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing an engineering course and interested in mechanical engineering.

### DJ Motors Tasmania University Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by DJ Motors, a leading Tasmanian car retailer.

**Value** \$3,000 per year (indexed annually by \$500 for high achievement)  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a commencing student studying in the science or engineering fields.

### Dr Peter Smith Scholarships in the Physical Sciences

These scholarships are provided by Dr Peter Smith to encourage students who intend to enrol in the Bachelor of Science degree and to study the physical sciences of chemistry, mathematics and physics (subjects often designated as the basic or enabling sciences) in their first year at university.

**Value** \$4,000  
**Number** Up to 4  
**Duration** Up to three years  
**Criteria** Available for students with academic potential who have the objective of completing one or more majors in the above subject discipline areas. Conditions apply.

### Dr Vivian Barlow Tasmania University Scholarship in Medicine

This scholarship is provided from the estate of the late Dr Vivian Barlow, who spent the final years of his life in Tasmania and wished to assist medical students with the costs of accommodation.

**Value** \$3,000 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to students commencing in medicine

who need to move away from home to undertake the course.

### Electrical Engineering Scholarships

Aurora Energy and Transend Networks, two of Tasmania's electrical power companies, will support students entering UTAS and interested in an electrical engineering career.

**Value** \$4,000 per year  
**Number** 2  
**Duration** Up to two years\*  
**Criteria** Available to students commencing an engineering degree and wishing to become electrical engineers. Vacation work experience may be available.

*\* Later year scholarships in engineering are listed on page 20.*

### Elizabeth Wade Tasmania University Scholarship in Music

This scholarship is provided from the estate of the late Elizabeth (Dora) Wade, who devoted her life to music education.

**Value** \$3,000 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to three years  
**Criteria** Available to a talented musician commencing a course at the Tasmanian Conservatorium of Music.

### Environmental Science Tasmania University Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by the School of Chemistry at UTAS.

**Value** Up to \$3,000 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to three years (subject to good academic achievement)  
**Criteria** Available to a student enrolling in the Bachelor of Environmental Science degree at the Launceston campus.

### Fairbrother Foundation Scholarship

The Fairbrother Foundation has funded this perpetual scholarship at UTAS for immediate family members of employees of the company.

**Value** \$4,000 per year  
**Number** Varies  
**Duration** Up to three years  
**Criteria** Available to an immediate family member of an employee of the Fairbrother group of companies commencing full-time study in any course.

### Gilbertson Family Scholarship

This scholarship is offered by the Gilbertson family to support a student with a learning difficulty who is studying any undergraduate course.

**Value** Up to \$5,000 per year  
**Number** Up to 2  
**Duration** Up to three years  
**Criteria** Available to a talented student with a diagnosed learning difficulty.

**Conditions** To be considered, students must register with UTAS Student Disability Services.

### Hilary and Alan Wallace Scholarship in Medicine

**Value** \$6,000 (paid towards JFH accommodation)

**Number** 1

**Duration** One year

**Criteria** Available to a student commencing the Bachelor of Medicine who was educated in the north or north-west of Tasmania.

### John C Bowden Tasmania University Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by John C Bowden, an American businessman who has a number of business interests in his second home, Tasmania.

**Value** \$3,000 per year

**Number** 1

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** Available to a student commencing study in the

Bachelor of Business or another degree course related to Tasmania's economic development.

### Kingborough Sub Branch RSLA Miss Cluny Portnell Memorial Scholarship

The Kingborough Sub Branch of the RSLA established this scholarship in 2006 to recognise the service of Miss Cluny Portnell to the Kingborough community.

**Value** \$5,000 (paid over 2 or 3 years)

**Number** 1

**Duration** Two or three years

**Criteria** Available to a Tasmanian student commencing nursing, preferably from the Channel area or southern Tasmania.

### Lady Gowrie Tasmania Scholarship in Early Childhood Education

Lady Gowrie Tasmania provides quality childcare opportunities across the State. It wishes to use this scholarship to encourage students to train as teachers of children in their early years.

**Value** \$3,000 per year

**Number** 1

**Duration** Up to four years

**Criteria** Available to a Tasmanian student enrolling in the Bachelor of Education (Early Childhood). Students should demonstrate an enthusiasm for this area of education in their application.

### Launceston Chamber of Commerce Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by the Launceston Chamber of Commerce, the oldest chamber of commerce in Australia.

**Value** \$3,000

**Number** 1

**Duration** One year

**Criteria** Available to a student enrolling in the Bachelor of Business in Launceston, and intending to major in one of the following: entrepreneurship, human resource management, marketing or international business.

### Launceston City Council Scholarship

This scholarship is offered by the Launceston City Council to residents of the Launceston municipality.

**Value** \$3,000 per year

**Number** 1

**Duration** Up to three years

**Criteria** Each college or school with Year 12 students will be

contacted by the Launceston City Council to nominate two students for consideration by the Launceston City Council for this scholarship. No other applications will be considered. ### Lech Kula Scholarship

The late Lech Kula, a Polish migrant to Tasmania, provided this scholarship to support Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students.

**Value** \$4,000 per year

**Number** 1

**Duration** Up to 4 years

**Criteria** Available to an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student who is enrolling in any undergraduate course at UTAS.

### Lester Franks Scholarships in Surveying and Spatial Sciences

Lester Franks is an innovative Tasmanian-based company involved in planning activities in the public and private sectors.

**Value** \$3,000 per year

**Number** 2

**Duration** Duration of course

**Criteria** Available to students in any year of the Bachelor of Surveying and Spatial Sciences degree.

There is a required annual vacation placement and six months of professional experience in the final year of the course.

### Medical Rural Bonded Scholarships

Medical Rural Bonded Scholarships (MRBS) are funded by the Australian Government as part of an initiative to improve health services in rural and regional communities. Neale Edwards' family, long involved in Tasmania's rural sector, has endowed this scholarship to encourage interest and involvement in Tasmania's rural sector.

**Value** \$7,500 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a student who is interested in Tasmanian rural industries and is commencing a degree in the agricultural or forest sciences.

### Nick Martin Tasmania University Scholarship in Surveying and Spatial Sciences

This scholarship has been endowed by Mr Nick Martin, a successful business operator in the electronics industry.

**Value** \$4,000 per year  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing study in the

Bachelor of Surveying and Spatial Sciences.

### North Eastern Art and Craft Association Scholarship

This scholarship is provided by the North Eastern Art and Craft Association to a student from the Dorset municipality.

**Value** \$1,000  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** One year  
**Criteria** Available to a student from the Dorset municipality enrolling in a course in fine arts in Hobart or contemporary arts in Launceston.

### Northern Florence Nightingale Bursary

The Northern Florence Nightingale Association has provided support for retired nurses for over 50 years.

**Value** \$500  
**Number** 1  
**Duration** One year  
**Criteria** Available to a student commencing the Bachelor of Nursing who has not received the support of another UTAS scholarship or bursary.

## COMMENCING STUDENTS – SPONSORED AND ENDOWED TASMANIA SCHOLARSHIPS

### Pipe Organ Scholarship

This scholarship has been established by Dr Peter Smith, a long-time academic in the School of Chemistry and supporter of students at UTAS, to encourage students to study and develop skills on the pipe organ.

**Value** \$3,000 for commencing students; \$5,000 for postgraduate students  
**Number** Varies  
**Duration** Up to four years  
**Criteria** Available to either commencing undergraduate or postgraduate students, eligible to enter the Conservatorium of Music to study classical performance in organ.

### School of Agricultural Science Scholarships

These scholarships are offered by the School of Agricultural Science in partnership with a number of Tasmanian agricultural businesses.

**Value** \$4,000 per year  
**Number** Varies  
**Duration** Up to four years
