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


Extended certification

Extended certification is a way of making candidates' certificates more meaningful and informative, by reflecting more precisely the correspondence between their Cambridge ESOL grade and the level of skills they have demonstrated in relation to the CEFR levels.

Each exam measures a range of abilities, and candidates who score sufficiently high marks to demonstrate that they fall into the CEFR band above the one targeted by the test (typically by getting grade A) can have this reflected on their certificate. Similarly, candidates who just fail to achieve a pass mark, but have demonstrated sufficient skills, can receive a certificate showing that they have achieved the CEFR level below the one targeted by the exam.

Candidates who achieve grade A in *Cambridge English: Advanced* (which assesses Level C1) receive a certificate showing that they have achieved Level C2. *Cambridge English: Key* candidates who achieve a narrow fail will receive Level A1 certificates, and *Cambridge English: Preliminary* and *Business English Certificate: Preliminary* candidates who achieve a narrow fail receive Level A2 certificates.

The table below demonstrates this concept.





Cambridge English: Preliminary, commonly known as *Preliminary English Test (PET)*, is an intermediate level qualification for learners who need to use English in a practical, everyday way to communicate.

Cambridge English: Preliminary is set at Level B1. This is the level of English required for practical, everyday use in work, study and travel settings.

Cambridge English: Preliminary gives learners the skills to: understand the main points of straightforward instructions or public announcements in English, deal with most of the situations they might meet when travelling, ask simple questions and take part in factual conversations in work settings, and write letters or make notes on familiar matters.

Teaching Knowledge Test TKT

Specialist modules

To extend the range of knowledge offered under the umbrella of the Teaching Knowledge Test (TKT), a flexible set of specialist modules has been created. TKT is both for experienced teachers and those who have not yet started teaching. There are three specialist TKT modules. TKT has been created so that the modules can be taken all together at the same time or separately, in any order, over a period of time.

TKT: Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL)

This module tests the knowledge of concepts related to content and language integrated learning. TKT: CLIL describes an evolving approach to teaching where subjects are taught and studied through the medium of a non-native language. In TKT: CLIL learning a second or foreign language and learning a curricular subject are given a joint role; for example, a non-native speaker learning geography in English. TKT: CLIL tests knowledge about content teaching in a second language and the learning, thinking and language skills which are developed across different curriculum subjects. It tests knowledge of how to plan lessons as well as knowledge of activities and resources used to support a CLIL approach. It also tests knowledge of teaching strategies and how assessment is carried out in CLIL contexts.

TKT: Knowledge about Language (KAL)


English teachers need to be both linguistically aware and able to understand the difficulties students may encounter in the language learning process. To help meet this need, TKT: KAL tests a candidate's knowledge of the language systems needed by teachers for planning and teaching their lessons.

It tests knowledge of how the different features of English work from a teaching perspective. TKT: KAL also focuses on the teacher's awareness of the language needs of learners, and the difficulties involved in learning a second language.

TKT: Young Learners (YL)

In January 2011, Cambridge ESOL is introducing a new module, TKT: Young Learners.

TKT: YL will test the background knowledge related to teaching young learners in the 6-12 age range and the practice of planning lessons, teaching strategies and assessing learning. It is suitable for international candidates teaching across the primary sector of education. Candidates taking the test are likely to have at least some experience of teaching English to young learners and will be familiar with the language of teaching as represented in the TKT glossary.
