MSc Programme Structure

Key Features

Our MSc programme has a number of features that make it attractive to prospective students. These include:

- Final cash prizes of £1,000 to the best students on the MSc courses
- Individual internships available to high performing students
- Opening up recruitment opportunities through direct interaction with businesses and access to careers service.

The overall aim of our postgraduate MSc programme is to develop the next generation of managers through the provision of skills and competencies that are highly valued by leading contemporary firms.

The programme structure has a common first semester, where students are required to take four core modules. These modules will incorporate three core aspects of business management: Human Resource Management, Financial and Managerial Accounting, and Principles of Marketing.

Students then specialise in the second semester in one of the following MSc courses:

- MSc Management
- MSc Marketing and Management
- MSc Finance and Management

The programme is intended to meet the needs of graduates who have not previously specialised in management, or who have studied the subject in a non-UK context.

We pride ourselves on being able to offer excellent career prospects to our students. The programme provides students with a strong foundation in management with an emphasis on development of skills and employability. The theme of employment skills runs throughout the courses and graduates will build a portfolio of transferable skills.

Teaching Methods

Assessment

Students are required to complete a combination of compulsory modules and specialist optional modules to gain the degree of Master of Science (MSc). Assessment may incorporate written examinations, presentations and coursework.

This programme is designed to provide students with a good foundation and understanding of the accounting and finance principles.

The taught modules will give students a clear understanding of the role of accounting, finance and other general management disciplines to ensure successful operations in a range of business settings, including financial, nonfinancial and public sector organisations. It is designed for candidates wishing to acquire expertise in accounting and finance, whilst developing the necessary skills for general management roles as well. The course builds on the Business School's existing partnerships with Norwich's Financial District, which is one of the largest in the UK.

MSc Entry Requirements and How to Apply

Academic Entry Qualifications

Applicants should have a good first degree in a non-business related subject or any subject studied in a non-UK context.

English Language Requirements

We welcome applications from those whose first language is not English or those whose degree was not taught in English. To ensure such students benefit fully from postgraduate study, we require evidence of proficiency in English:

IELTS/or equivalent qualification 6.5 (minimum 6.0 in all components)

Internet-based 92-94

TOEFL

minimum 20 in all components

In certain circumstances we may require the applicant to complete a Pre-Sessional English, Graduate Diploma or English for Postgraduate Study course prior to beginning their Masters programme. For further information on these courses see pages 9-13 or www.intohigher/uea-london.

How to Apply

ALL applications need to be accompanied by certified transcripts and the final graduation certificate (if available) from the candidate's earlier university, setting out examination results to date and the official results of IELTS (or equivalent) English tests where applicable. Applications should also include two formal academic references.

Application and Reference forms may also be downloaded from the individual course pages of the UEA London website.

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MSc Fees, Scholarships and Funding

Fees

Full details of the fees for the Norwich Business School are available from www.uea.ac.uk/nbs.

Fees include tuition costs, supervision and access to the library and computing facilities. In addition to tuition fees there will be the costs of, for example, accommodation, food, general living costs and where applicable medical insurance, return air travel to the UK, and if applicable, pre-sessional courses.

Funding

Funding for postgraduate study is available both from the University and from a number of external schemes. Applicants should note that many award schemes have early closing dates and may require the acceptance of the offer of a place as a condition of eligibility. If you wish to apply for funding, you are therefore strongly advised to apply to the Norwich Business School as early as possible in the year of entry. Please indicate in your application that you wish to be considered for an award.

To be successful in masters degree level study students should have a good academic background, a strong understanding of the study skills required for postgraduate study at a UK university as well as a very good command of English.

For students coming from overseas to study our London masters degrees we offer a number of preparation programmes to ensure that students are equipped with all the skills they need to be successful in their masters studies.

For students who need additional academic preparation, the Graduate Diploma provides an introduction to business related academic subjects in the English language. It also develops skills needed for successful independent study and research.

For students who don't yet have the required level of English language, the INTO UEA London language preparation programmes have flexible start dates and study durations to ensure students receive the right amount of English language preparation prior to commencing their masters.

The English language programmes focus on English for academic purposes and as such concentrate on equipping students with the type of language skills needed specifically for degree level study.

If you have a recognised undergraduate qualification, or a high grade in your 3-5 year Diploma course, but do not meet the minimum requirements for direct entry, you can use the Graduate Diploma as an extra year of academic study to provide a pathway through to a Master's course at the University of East Anglia in London or Norwich.

The Graduate Diploma is a nine-month programme that prepares international students from various disciplines for postgraduate study in Management in London, or Business and Economics in Norwich.

Successful completion of the Graduate Diploma programme leads to the award of the University of East Anglia Graduate Diploma; Level 6 on the National Qualification Framework (NQF). The course is a first step towards obtaining a postgraduate qualification.

Key Features

The programme focuses on:

- Improving your English language skills for postgraduate study
- Improving your knowledge and understanding of the subject you wish to study at Postgraduate level
- Developing your skills for postgraduate research.

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English for Postgraduate Study

English for Postgraduate Study is a year-round course of intensive academic English language study, which prepares international students, whose first language is not English, for study at postgraduate level at the University of East Anglia in London or Norwich; or for entry to the INTO Graduate Diploma. The course covers English language, academic study and subject specific postgraduate research skills needed for successful study at postgraduate level.

The course will help interested students adjust to the demands, challenges and expectations of UK higher education. You will also be able to practise your developing language skills in a vibrant study environment, where you can take advantage of the additional learning facilities and mix with a wide variety of British and international students. Students can enrol on the English for Postgraduate Study course at the beginning of each term. The course is suitable for students of different language levels. At the end of each term, your skills and language will be assessed to give a clear indication of your progress.

Course Content

The English for Postgraduate Study course will enable students to develop their knowledge, ability and confidence in a variety of skills essential for postgraduate study. These include team work, problem solving, critical thinking, and time management.

As your level of English increases, you will also focus on research projects, research methods, and quantitative and qualitative data analysis. Through studying a range of modules, you will develop a greater command of written and spoken English, as well as the academic study skills that are critical for successful study at postgraduate level.

Pre-sessional English

This 20 hour per week course is suitable for students who are academically qualified, hold an offer from UEA London, and need to improve their English language level before starting their postgraduate degree at UEA London.

Depending on your language level and degree programme requirements, you may take a 12, 8 or 4 week course. To apply for the Pre-sessional English course you must have a valid IELTS or TOEFL test result and a conditional offer of a place at UEA London.

Course aims

The Pre-sessional course is a high quality academic English course which prepares international students for academic study with the University of East Anglia, London. It will enable you to improve your English language proficiency in the core skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing, and to develop the academic study skills needed for successful study at postgraduate level.

You will also focus on subject related work to help you learn how to study independently using online and self-access materials, helping you adjust to the demands, challenges and expectations of UK higher education.

You will be internally assessed to evaluate whether you have reached the appropriate level for entry to your degree course. Acceptance on a UEA London course is at the discretion of the University.

Assuming you have already met the University's academic entry requirements and any other outstanding conditions, students who complete the Pre-sessional English course and meet the minimum English language requirement for entry to their chosen degree course, are guaranteed entry to UEA London.
