Highbury Campus

Student learning at the stunning new Campus is enhanced by the latest resources, which include an Internet café with high-speed wireless access, refectory, games area and sports centre. Additional facilities include a 160-seat performing arts theatre, library, and an IT Flexi Centre.

Practical learning environments include a high-definition television studio, art and design studios with specialised areas for screen printing, textiles, jewellery and 3D design, motor vehicle workshops, commercial hair and beauty salons, digital recording studio, Macenabled classrooms for games design and music technology, specialist areas for floristry and animal care, science and electronics laboratories, Cisco Academy network training rooms and a purpose built flat for use by students on our Independent Living and Work Skills courses.



Highbury City of Portsmouth Centre

At Highbury City of Portsmouth Centre (HCPC) you can develop your talents in a range of areas including hospitality and catering, travel and tourism, health and social care, childcare and early years, retail and visual merchandising, and English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL).

Specialist, real-life work environments give you hands-on experience in your chosen career. Facilities include student-run commercial eateries, professional training kitchens, a simulated aeroplane cabin, nursery, healthcare and dental suites, and a full-size shop window for retail training.

Additional facilities include a library, IT Flexi Centre and student recreation areas.



Highbury Apex Centre

Highbury Apex Centre in Leigh Park offers first-step training in construction skills. The Centre is primarily for pupils from local schools who come to the College to study construction alongside their GCSEs.



Highbury Northarbour Centre

Highbury Northarbour Centre is one of the top training facilities in the country for construction and the built environment, with dedicated workshops for each discipline and the latest work-related teaching environments. Additional facilities include a student recreation area and a specialist construction library.

Trafalgar Wharf, the waterside home for Highbury's marine technology courses, is nearby.

Careers Academy

This scheme, which involves employers, schools and colleges, works to raise the aspirations of young people who are considering a career in business by providing an alternative pathway to success. At Your Service

College Library Service

The College Library Service operates from Highbury Campus, Highbury Northarbour Centre and Highbury City of Portsmouth Centre. Library staff are always available to help with research queries.

Online material is available through the Virtual Library, which can be accessed from any College computer, or from home via the Internet. This provides a gateway to subscription services such as online dictionaries, encyclopaedias, newspapers and subject-specific resources. You can also access resources to help with literacy, numeracy and study skills.

The Library Service also sells a range of stationery at competitive prices and has a book ordering service which offers a 10% discount on recommended retail prices to all students.



Community Sports Centre

Join the Community Sports Centre to enjoy a wide range of activities and facilities, including a sports hall, gym and fitness classes. The Sports Centre is fully accessible and has specially adapted sports equipment. Sports on offer include badminton, mini tennis and 5-a-side football.



A confidential interview can then be arranged with a specialist member of staff to discuss your individual support needs.

All our Centres are accessible and include specialist equipment.

Learning support

Our Learning Support specialists will assess your needs and talk to you about how they can help. We can provide specialist support and equipment for students with identified needs, including:

- Support in class
- Mentoring through the Support to Achieve programme
- Assessment by specialists for specific learning difficulties such as dyslexia or dyspraxia

Please let us know at interview or induction if you have additional learning requirements, so we can ensure you get the right help from the start. An informal interview will be arranged with a specialist member of staff to discuss individual support needs.

Tutorial support

You will have a tutorial session each week, covering a range of subjects like planning your career, managing money, health and fitness, personal development and study skills.

Counselling

Financial support

16-19 Bursary Fund

You can apply for an annual bursary of £1,200 if you are aged 16-19 and are:

- In receipt of Income Support
- In Care or are a Care Leaver
- Receiving Disability Living Allowance or Employment Support Allowance

Other students aged 16-19 can apply for help with the cost of travel, equipment, kit, uniform and other expenses associated with coming to the College

Financial Support for Students Aged 19+

Students aged 19 and over can also apply for help with the costs of childcare, travel, kit, uniform, equipment and other expenses associated with the cost of coming to College.

Help with Full Level 2 or Level 3 Training for Adults

If you are over 19 and want to study for your first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification you may be exempt from paying tuition fees.

You may be entitled to study for free or at a reduced cost if you meet one of the following criteria:

- You have been referred to the College through your local Job Centre Plus office
- You have recently been made redundant or are under threat of redundancy

- You wish to study an essential skill literacy or numeracy
- You are in receipt of an 'active' benefit such as Jobseekers Allowance
- You are in receipt of 'inactive' benefits such as Income Support and wish to study to gain employment
- You are an asylum seeker and have been here for six months or longer
- You wish to achieve your first full Level 2 or Level 3 qualification
- You are aged under 19 on 31 August 2012
- You are aged over 60 at the start of the course

Options For You at Every Level

At Highbury we provide a broad range of courses ranging from Foundation Learning programmes through to Level 3 Diplomas, A Levels and Apprenticeships. We also offer Access to Higher Education programmes and Foundation Degrees, so whatever your level of ability or experience, we have a course to meet your needs.

Functional Skills

equipped with the necessary skills in English, Maths and IT in order to fulfil their potential. Functional Skills are taught at a level appropriate to the individual student and help you succeed in the world of work. They are delivered as an essential part of Young Apprenticeships and Foundation Learning and also across the majority of Level I and Level 2 courses.

Higher National Certificates/ Diplomas (HNCs/HNDs)

These are work-related university-level qualifications. Study is full- or part-time over one or two years. You will normally need a previous qualification and have reached a supervisory level of

Moving On

Not sure what option is right for you? This one-year course is suitable for students who are not quite ready for vocational programmes or are returning to learning. Moving On provides you with the opportunity to take part in a community project, undertake work experience and achieve English, Maths and IT qualifications. You will also take Personal and Social Development (PSD) units, such as team building and preparing for the world of work. Moving On enables you to improve your skills and confidence and gain formal qualifications to progress to further study or work.

Parenting Futures

This 8-week course is designed for mums and dads to be, and parents of young children. It offers a wide range of support skills and education to improve life styles and parenting skills. You will develop your citizenship skills, gain confidence and achieve formal qualifications to progress to further study or work.

Vocational Qualifications (VQs)

VQs are for people who want practical training to gain a particular skill to take them on into the world of work or advance their career. Examples of VQs are BTECs, City & Guilds, NVQs, Apprenticeships and HNCs. They cover a broad range of subjects and can be studied full-time at College or while in work.

Edexcel BTEC Firsts and Nationals

These highly regarded qualifications are normally studied over one or two years. They are a mix of theory and practical skills and are available in a wide range of vocational areas.

The BTEC First can be taken as an extended Certificate (equivalent to two GCSEs) or a Diploma (equivalent to four GCSEs).

BTEC Nationals are available as a Subsidiary Diploma (equivalent to one A Level), Diploma (equivalent to two A Levels) or an Extended Diploma (equivalent to 3 A Levels). At Highbury you can create your own programme and take BTEC Nationals alongside traditional A Levels (see page 19).

A Levels

A Levels are usually taken over two years. They provide an academic route to higher education in the form of a degree or nigher level qualifications. A Levels can be combined with other qualifications at Highbury, such as Edexcel BTEC Nationals, to prepare for work or university (see page 19 for the full range of A Levels at Highbury).

GCSEs

You can study GCSE Maths and English at Highbury as part of a broader programme if you have not already achieved these qualifications at grade C or above. Most employers and universities want students to have both these GCSEs at grades A*-C, so it is advisable to consider this as an extra option.

Foundation Degrees

Foundation Degrees are work-related nigher education qualifications that equip you with the skills and knowledge employers need Foundation Degrees are offered on a full-or part-time basis. On completion of a Foundation Degree you may progress to a full Honours Degree at university.

Access to Higher Education

Access courses are for students who want to go to university or move on to university level courses but do not have the qualifications. You study for a year and can work for additional qualifications, including GCSEs in English and Maths (see page 18 for the full range of Access courses at Highbury).

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships are work-based training programmes that allow you to get a Level 2, Level 3 or Level 4/5 qualification for the practical experience you gain on the job. Apprenticeships enable you to 'learn while you earn'. Training typically lasts between 12 months and 3 years (see page 20 for the full range of Apprenticeships at Highbury).

Highbury College Portsmouth: The 6th Form Academy

Our new 6th Form Academy is a great place to study. Highbury College has outstanding success rates, first-class learning resources and a wide range of courses. This gives you a head start when applying for university and employment.

There are more than 25 A Level subjects on offer (see page 19). You can choose to study a full A Level programme or create your own mix of A Levels and work-focused BTEC Level 3 National Diplomas. We also provide opportunities for stretch and challenge through additional studies such as the Extended Project and enterprise activities.

This means you have the flexibility to take an academic, vocational or mixed approach to your studies, gaining the

skills and grades needed to achieve your personal and career goals whether these are higher education or a job.

So why not create your own programme? You could combine a BTEC media course with an A Level in English, engineering with physics, computing with maths, fashion with business or health and social care with human biology. The choice is yours.



Access to Higher Education

Our Access courses are specifically designed for students aged 19+ who require extra support to prepare for higher education. Courses are taken over one year.

Students from Highbury's Access to Higher Education courses have progressed to universities both locally and throughout the country. They include London SOAS, Warwick, Southampton, Sussex, York, Edinburgh, Portsmouth, Brighton, Manchester as well as the Universities of Chichester and Winchester.

Access to Higher Education Diploma Level 3

Entry requirements

There are no formal entry requirements for these courses. However, GCSEs in English and Maths are preferable and you are required to be working at Level 2 or above for both literacy and numeracy. If English is not your first language, language support is available to ensure success in your studies – students must reach a minimum of IELTS 5.0 or equivalent prior to the start of the course.

The Access to Higher Education Diploma offers a range of pathways that could lead to a degree of your choosing, such as Nursing, Engineering, Teaching, Social Work, Maths, Physics and English. You will study different subject combinations according to the university entry requirements.

Access to Higher Education

A Levels

A Levels are one of the main routes into higher education. They can also lead to a better job as they show employers that you can study an academic subject at an advanced level.

At Highbury there are more than 25 A Level subjects on offer. You can choose to study three or four A Levels or create your own mix of A Levels and vocational qualifications to prepare for university or employment.

There is also an option to complete an Extended Project to further develop your knowledge and skills, and gain additional university entrance points.

There are four main routes available to you to combine A Levels with BTEC vocational qualifications at Level 3 (see *below*).

If you gain top marks in everything you could gain 440 UCAS points!

What are A Levels?

A Levels are divided into two courses, AS and A2. An AS is studied in the first year and A2 in the second year. Combined together, they equal a full A Level.

A Levels can be studied on a modular basis, which means that you are assessed as you go along, rather than in one exam at the end of the second year.

To study A Levels you will normally need a minimum of five GCSE grades A*-C including English and Maths. Some subjects require specific GCSE grades or a GCSE in a particular subject area.

Apprenticeships

Enjoy the best of both worlds with work-based training that provides real career opportunities and a full-time wage.

As an apprentice you will gain valuable work experience and a real wage. At the same time you will benefit from high-quality training and support to boost your career prospects.

We offer apprenticeships in a wide range of areas. All apprenticeships include knowledge (theory) and competence (practical) elements that are relevant to your work. This will ensure that you gain the skills and knowledge employers need. In addition you will complete transferable skills in Literacy, Numeracy and sometimes IT, study employment rights and responsibilities (ERR) and develop your personal learning and thinking skills (PLTS).

You will be assessed at work and may attend College to study the theory, which you can then put into practice in the workplace.

Funding is available to fully cover fees for students aged 16-19 and we can help you to find a suitable employer. For apprentices aged over 19 these are co-funded by both the government and the employer.

Apprenticeships can be taken at three levels - Intermediate (Level 2), Advanced (Level 3) and Higher (Level 4/5). They take between one and three years to complete. The type of programme you choose will depend on your intended career and any experience you may have already gained.

Apprenticeship (Level 2)

- Equivalent to five GCSEs at grades A*-C
- Takes between one and two years to complete, or quicker depending on skill level
- Study for a Level 2 NVQ Diploma in your specialist area
- Develop transferable skills in literacy, numeracy and possibly IT
- Option to progress to an Advanced Apprenticeship

Advanced Apprenticeship (Level 3)

- Equivalent to two or more A Levels or an Edexcel BTEC National Diploma
- Training usually takes between one to three years, or quicker depending on skill level
- Study for a Level 3 NVQ Diploma in your specialist area
- Prepare for a technical, supervisory or junior management role
- Option to progress to university-level studies or Higher Apprenticeship if available

Higher Apprenticeship (Level 4/5)

- Equivalent to higher education and university level studies
- Takes up to two years to complete, or quicker depending on skill level
- Study for a Level 4/5 NVQ Diploma in your specialist area
- Develop transferable skills in literacy, numeracy and possibly IT

Animal Studies

At Highbury you can develop the skills and knowledge you need to work with animals. We provide an exciting range of courses to help you gain animal care skills, including handling. You will come into contact with a variety of animals, such as companion animals, reptiles, birds and livestock, including horses.

As well as enjoying a range of practical and theory tasks during the course, you will go on work placements in veterinary surgeries, rescue centres,

pet shops and other animal centres. We also arrange visits to the Blue Reef Aquarium, Longleat Safari Park and Marwell Zoo, which are informative and great fun. You will see a variety of fascinating animals, such as birds, fish and other wildlife, and learn about their requirements and habitats.

We regularly invite specialist guest speakers from a range of organisations including the RSPCA, PDSA and dog agility teams, and maintain links with other land-based colleges.

Entry Level

Animal Care NPTC Certificate in Skills for Working Life I year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

Through this course you will find out about animals and the correct way to handle, restrain and feed them.

What will I study?

You will learn about animal care, including parts of the body, checking animal health, grooming and showing people around an animal enterprise. You will also learn how to work safely, lift and handle equipment and improve your CV.

Extra info

You will go on visits, get close to domestic pets and learn about exotic animals. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will have completed secondary education and be able to show that you have a keen interest in animals when you attend your interview. You will need two good references.

Leads on to...

You could progress to a higher level qualification, such as the Level | Diploma in Animal Care.

Level I

Animal Care Diploma in Land Based Studies

I year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This course is an introduction to handling, restraining and animal husbandry.

What will I study?

Units include animal handling, animal accommodation and working in animal care environments, such as pet retail, vet practices, kennels and the RSPCA.

Extra info

There is a mix of practical and theoretical work, and you will go on trips and visits. You will also gain qualifications in First Aid and Health & Safety and complete a period of work experience. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades C-E, including English and Maths. Alternatively you may have a full entry level qualification with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could move onto the Level 2 Diploma in Animal Care or go into employment.

Animal Care Diploma in Animal Care

I year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This is a good opportunity to gain more experience of working with animals.

What will I study?

You will learn about animal health and welfare, nutrition, animal housing and enrichment. About 40% of your time is spent on work placement. You will also get qualifications in First Aid and Health & Safety and retake your GCSE's in English and Maths if necessary.

Extra info

You will go on visits, get close to domestic pets and learn about exotic animals such as snakes and lizards. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English and Maths, and an interest in animals. Alternatively you may have a full Level I qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or a full Level I NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level. You will need two good references.

Leads on to...

You could progress to an advanced level qualification such as the Advanced Apprenticeship.

Level 3

Animal Management Diploma and Extended Diploma in Animal Care

I year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

You will gain a higher level of experience in animal care.

What will I study?

You will learn about animal science, advanced animal health and welfare, business operations and animal husbandry, and achieve qualifications in First Aid and Health & Safety. About 40% of your time is spent on a work placement.

Extra info

You will go on visits, get close to domestic pets and learn about exotic animals such as snakes, lizards and llamas.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English, Maths and preferably Science. Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level or a full Level 2 NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level. You will need two good references.

Leads on to...

You could progress to a higher level qualification or go into employment.

What next?

Further studies

Once you have qualified from Level 3 you may wish to continue your studies by applying for a qualification at university or one of the land-based colleges, such as Sparsholt College.

Career opportunities

There are many career opportunities for people with qualifications in animal care or animal management. Options include zoo keeping, veterinary nurse/assistant, kennel technician, dog groomer, pet shop/retail or equine management. You could also work at animal rescue centres and animal sanctuaries or as an animal welfare assistant for a charity such as the Blue Cross or RSPCA.

Wages for Animal Care workers start at around £11,000. Qualified and experienced animal technicians can earn between £15,000 and £20,000, and more if you become a senior technician.


Art & Design

Level I

Art & Design Edexcel BTEC Diploma in Art & Design

l year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This course will provide you with an introduction to a range of creative subjects in art. You will gain practical skills and knowledge in a range of traditional and non-traditional art and design practices.

What will I study?

You will explore and experiment with ideas, develop traditional skills, incorporate new technology into your work and produce creative products. This qualification takes a broad approach and in addition to art and design, you may have the chance to work with students from Performing Arts (e.g. drama, dance and music technology); and Media (e.g. film and television, radio, interactive media, animation, computer games and advertising).

Extra info

Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these. In addition you will complete a Level 1 project.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A^* -E or equivalent, including English, Maths and a creative/media based subject.

Leads on to...

You could progress to the Level 2 programme in Art & Design or Fashion & Clothing or enter the world of work.

Level 2

Art & Design Edexcel BTEC Diploma in Art & Design

I year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

If you are creative and would like to develop your talents in art and design so that you can move on to study at a higher level then this course is for you.

What will I study?

Topics could include drawing, painting, sculpture, set design, graphics, fashion and textiles. You will also have the opportunity to retake GCSE English and Maths.

Extra info

You can visit galleries and exhibitions and exhibit your own work at our end of year show. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English, Maths and a creative subject. Alternatively you may have a full Level I qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level or full Level I NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You can progress to an advanced level qualification such as the Level 3 Diploma in Art & Design or Fashion & Clothing.



Art & Design Edexcel BTEC Subsidiary Diploma, Diploma and Extended Diploma

2 year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This exciting course offers a wide range of art and design topics. The course allows you to develop your practical and intellectual skills in preparation for higher education or work. Highbury College has strong links with local art galleries and universities and frequently runs highprofile, live projects to support Level 3 learning. We also offer residential trips abroad and frequently visit shows and exhibitions in London and beyond.

What will I study?

In Year I you will be taught all the fundamental and traditional fine art practices such as painting, printmaking, drawing and 3D, alongside specialist fields like textiles, interior design, digital photography, jewellery, metal work and design.

In Year 2 you will have projects that allow you the time to explore, develop and experiment with your own ideas and techniques and to follow an art or design pathway that suits you.

Topics include interior design, drawing, painting and 3D. You will build on your skills through workshops where you can experiment and develop your own ideas.

Extra info

You will visit galleries such as Tate Modern, Tate Britain and the V&A in London, as well as local galleries, sculpture parks and exhibitions. There are many opportunities to travel abroad on trips and even the opportunity to visit New York. You will be able to display your work at the end of year exhibition which is open to the public. There are also opportunities to gain experience working on live projects. You will also have the chance to study an additional A Level alongside this course.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English and an art-based subject and minimum of grade D in Maths. Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level or a full Level 2 NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

Most of our Level 3 students progress onto university but you could enter into a creative career.







Edexcel BTEC Diploma in IT (Business)

2 year

Leads on to...

Foundation Degree

FdSc Software Development Subject to validation

2 year

Is it for me?

What will I study?

This challenging course combines academic study with practical skills training. It is designed to produce graduates who have the skills to work at higher technician or associate professional level. The course will cover all aspects of website design, web server scripting, online databases, 'back office' technologies, graphic design and all associated Internet technology skills.

Entry requirements

You will need 120 UCAS points from a recognised and relevant Level 3 qualification, such as A Levels, Edexcel BTEC National Diploma, Advanced Modern Apprenticeship or AVCE, or to have successfully completed an approved Access or Link Foundation course. Applications from students with suitable overseas qualifications are welcomed.

Leads on to...

On completion of this course, you could study to become a Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer (MCSE) or progress to university to gain a full Honours Degree, or you could go into employment.

What next?

Further studies

Upon completion of a Level 3 qualification you could progress to complete a second year at Level 3 with the BTEC Extended Diploma alongside an Extended Project qualification, study for a Foundation Degree at Highbury College or an Honours Degree at university. You could also study to become a Microsoft Certified Systems Engineer or a Cisco Certified Network Professional.

Career opportunities

Computing and IT are global industries with many opportunities for people with the right qualifications. Starting salaries for IT support technicians are between £17,000 and £20,000. A software developer can earn from £28,000-£40,000 or more, and a network manager can earn in excess of £50,000.





I year

Highbury Campus & Northarbour Centre

Is it for me?

This course gives you the chance to explore the technical, design and practical aspects of construction projects and provides an insight into the broad range of opportunities there are in the buildings and services industries involved.

What will I study?

Through a combination of practical and theory sessions, you will learn how the industry is structured, health, safety and welfare and sustainability, the application of science and maths in the industry, drawing techniques and construction methods and operations. The course also includes workshop introductions to a range of construction disciplines such as plumbing, wall and floor tiling, electrical operations, bricklaying, and carpentry.

Extra info

Through our links with local employers you will experience the world of work in the industry by site visits, visiting speakers and learning activities that require you to explore the built environment. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

Usually we ask for GCSE at grade D-G including Maths, English and Science or an appropriate qualification at Level 1. You will learn how to work safely and apply scientific principles in the context of building services installations including hot and cold water systems, sanitation, central heating, refrigeration, air conditioning and the latest green technologies. You will also develop the knowledge required to meet the complex range of regulations that apply to the industry.

Extra info

PLEASE NOTE: To qualify for work in the range of building services professions (plumber, heating engineer, air conditioning, gas engineer etc.) you are required to complete an NVQ Diploma and further study as an apprentice or in a work position. The College will support you with applying for work and actively help you through a range of work experiences where these are available. The College will deliver a programme of learning at Level 3 but you must be clear that full qualification requires the relevant work experience. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

If you are seeking a career in plumbing or one of the allied trades you should complete our application form and come to meet us so that we can discuss your career opportunities. You will generally need 4 GCSE grades A*-D or equivalent including Maths and Science. However, all students who apply will be invited to take a series of tests and a workshop session.

Leads on to...

Employment in the building services professions where the Level 3 Diploma can be completed (see Extra info). Alternative progression opportunities include the Extended Diploma in Construction and the Built Environment or other study at Level 3.





Extra info

Scalp massage, customer service and ear piercing may also be available as additional qualifications. You will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English and a minimum of grade D in Maths, or a Level I hairdressing qualification with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or relevant work/life experience, plus a good punctuality and attendance record.

Leads on to...

Upon successful completion of the course you could progress to Hairdressing Level 3 or into employment.

Level 2

Diploma in Childcare & Education CACHE Diploma

2 year

Is it for me?

This course is for you if you would like to work with children and young people. You need to have a genuine interest in child development and supporting children in their care, play and education.

What will I study?

There are 12 units delivered over two years including: Development from Conception to Age 16 Years, Keeping Children Safe, Play and Learning in Children's Education and Caring for Children. The course content is based on the principles that underpin working with children, including current legislation, initiatives and frameworks.

Extra info

You will attend a variety of work placements during the course such as a day nursery, preschool and school. This course includes a formal written examination.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C including Maths and English, or a full Level 2 qualification at grade C or above plus literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level. As you will be working with children you will need to undergo an enhanced police check (CRB).

Leads on to...

This qualification will enable you to embark on a career working with children in a range of settings, such as a nursery nurse in an early years setting or a teaching assistant in a school. The Level 3 qualification gives you the opportunity to progress to a supervisory/management role, or continue with study and progress into higher education, for example teacher education, a Higher National Diploma (HND) or university.

Extra info

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-E, including English and Maths, or a full entry level qualification with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level. A willingness to work in the industry and the ability to succeed are very important.

Leads on to...

You could progress on to a Level 2 Diploma, or the CACHE Level 2 Diploma in Childcare & Education, depending on your career choice.

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English and Maths, or a full Level I qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level. A willingness to work in the industry and the ability to succeed are very important.

Leads on to...

If you want to progress to the BTEC Level 3 Diploma/Extended Diploma you may need to resit GCSE English or Maths during this course. On successful achievement of a merit grade you could progress to the Higher Project and research a topic you have already studied or focus on something new. You may also choose to go into employment.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C in academic subjects including English and Maths, or a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could progress to university to study for a degree or move into the world of work

What next?

Further studies

Upon completion of a Level 3 qualification you could progress on to a higher level qualification, such as an HND or university degree in a related subject.

Career opportunities

Careers you might consider include working as a care assistant, nurse, social worker, nursery nurse, speech therapist or teacher.

Care workers can expect to earn around £12,000-£16,000 a year. Newly qualified nurses in the NHS earn around £21,000 a year. Starting salaries for social workers are around £19,500 to £25,000 a year. With experience, speech therapists can earn around £35,000 a year.

Leads on to...

Level 3

Project work is important and some projects are set by local employers so you get first-rate experience.

Extra info

You will get hands-on training in the College's digital studios and on location. Your work on the course could also be broadcast on Express FM. This course is delivered at Highbury Arundel Centre, home of Express FM. Within the course you will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-E, including English and Maths. Alternatively you may have a full entry level qualification with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could progress to the Level 2 Diploma Music Technology at Highbury.

Level 2

Music Technology Edexcel Diploma in Music Technology

Is it for me?

If you want to find out how to create CDs or record live music, this is the course you need.

What will I study?

You will learn how to plan and create your own music product, learn how to DJ and find out how to use computers to create your own music. You will record in our studios and find out more about the way the music business works.

Extra info

If you need to, you can retake your GCSE English and Maths at Highbury. You will also complete at least one Functional Skill.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English and Maths or a relevant Level I qualification. Alternatively you may have a full Level I qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or a full Level I NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

After this course you can move on to the Level 3 Diploma.







Music Technology Edexcel Subsidiary Diploma/Diploma/ Extended Diploma in Music Technology

2 year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This course is ideal for anyone who wants to work with professional musicians to help record and edit their CDs or work in a live music environment.

What will I study?

Working in Highbury's professional studios, you will learn how to manage a studio recording, record music, produce your own music on computers, learn about DJing, and create and record sound for multimedia, video and TV projects. If you need to retake your GCSE Maths you can do that too.

Extra info

Highbury's studio is used by professional musicians, and you will get the chance to help with their recordings.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English and at least a D in Maths. Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could move on to a job in the music industry or go on to university.

Career opportunities

Although there are no longer as many recording studios as there once were, there are still opportunities out there for anyone interested in music technology. Options include live sound and theatre work, music promotion and recording for TV and advertising. The lucky few can still obtain work in music production as a producer or engineer but expect to work long hours and be very, very keen.

Starting salaries for a studio sound engineer are about £13,000 a year. Experienced sound engineers can earn between £25,000 and £30,000. An experienced music producer can earn up to £50,000 a year, but this will depend on the area they are working in.

Performing Arts & Theatre

Highbury College has a wide range of acting courses to broaden your skills. You will have the opportunity to step into the spotlight in front of real audiences and gain experience through work placements in local theatres or on school tours. You could also get involved in the Highbury Theatre Company, which is open to students and staff from across the College.

We offer hands-on courses using naturalism, realism, physical theatre and drama, supported by a professional voice coach. We also offer TV drama experience in our high-definition TV studio, plus radio presentation on Express FM.

Our specialist theatre, dance studio and TV studio are ideal for studying dance, choreography and movement, as well as other theatre techniques. We work on many different productions, experiencing all the real life day-to-day issues including finance and budgets, advertising and marketing and technical production.

We also offer a technical course covering the skills used behind the scenes of a production, including props, lighting and sound effects.

Level I

Performing Arts & Theatre BTEC Diploma

I year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

This course provides an introduction to a range of creative subjects and will develop your practical skills and knowledge of the performing arts industry.

What will I study?

You will explore and develop your skills in acting and dance, develop skills in technical aspects of theatre, find out about jobs and working in the industry and perform a showcase.

Extra info

Within the course you will improve your Maths, English and IT skills. In addition you will complete the Level I project.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-E or equivalent, including English, Maths and a performance based subject.

Leads on to...

You could progress to a Level 2 Diploma in Performing Arts or a similar Level 2 course or enter the world of work.



Performing Arts (Acting) Edexcel Extended Certificate and Diploma in Performing Arts

I year

Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

If you want to learn acting skills and develop production skills in a variety of performing arts areas but lack experience, this course is for you.

What will I study?

You will learn about the performing arts production process, performing arts business, acting, performing scripted plays, devising plays and make-up for stage performance.

Extra info

There will be many theatre trips in the local area and you will regularly perform in College and at public venues. You will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these and have the opportunity to retake GCSE English and Maths if you need to.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English, Maths and preferably Drama, or a full Level 1 qualification with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

When you successfully complete the course you could go on to Level 3 study at Highbury.

What will I study?

Extra info

You could visit New York's Broadway and London's West End as well as many theatres around our local area. You will also tour around local schools and community centres where you can perform short plays.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English, Maths and a performance-based subject. Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification, including NVQ, at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could progress to study at a higher level, including a Degree at university or study drama at a drama school.

Level 2

Performing Arts (Dance) Edexcel Extended Certificate and Diploma in Performing Arts

I year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

If you like performing and have good coordination and movement skills then this is the right course for you.

What will I study?

The course covers opportunities in the performing arts business, understanding and performing dance, a body workshop and a production project. You will also improve your Maths, English and IT skills and may gain additional qualifications in these and have the opportunity, if needed, to retake GCSE English and Maths.

Extra info

You could visit New York's Broadway and London's West End as well as many theatres around our local area. You may work alongside professional companies, and tour around local schools and community centres to perform your work.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-D, including English, Maths and preferably Dance. Alternatively you may have a full Level I qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or a full Level I NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could progress to Level 3 Diploma in Dance at Highbury.

2 year Highbury Campus

Is it for me?

Use your creative skills to explore new dance techniques.

What will I study?

You will study dance, choreography and movement, and other theatre techniques, including acting and voice production. The course involves performing in front of an audience, and includes a two-week work placement, trips to theatres, including West End shows, and an organised visit to New York.

Extra info

You can catch up on other skills and qualifications if you need to, especially if you need an extra GCSE or an AS Level.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English, Maths and a performance-based subject. Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or a full Level 2 NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could go on to university or dance school or use your skills and contacts to help you obtain a job.

Is it for me?

If you are interested in the theatre and want to learn about how a production is put together, then this is the course for you.

What will I study?

You will work closely with acting, dance, fashion and make-up students to put on a range of shows and will go on a number of visits and undertake work experience. You will have access to a new theatre incorporating the latest computerised sound and lighting facilities.

Entry requirements

You will need 4 GCSE grades A*-C, including English and Maths.

Alternatively you may have a full Level 2 qualification at merit grade with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level, or a full Level 2 NVQ with literacy and numeracy at an appropriate level.

Leads on to...

You could progress to a Foundation Degree, a degree at university or find work in the industry.

Apprenticeships in Creative & Cultural

Earn a real wage while gaining the benefits of high-quality training. Apprenticeships are offered in this area for anyone aged over 16. See page 20 for more details.

What next?

Further studies

Career opportunities

It can be hard to find full-time work as an actor, but there are still opportunities out there. As well as acting in theatre, film, TV and radio, you can also find work in education, voice-overs, commercials and interactive role playing for museums or corporate events. You could also combine a career in acting or dance with teaching, community arts, stage management or drama therapy.

Starting salaries for an assistant stage manager are about £16,000 a year. An experienced community arts worker can earn from £20,000 to over £25,000. Actors can earn as little as £6,000 a year, although some (the well-known ones) earn considerably more.

New training recruits in the Army earn around £13,400; Privates earn between £16,600 and £28,400. Starting salaries for a prison officer are around £18,000 a year. For a police officer the starting salary is between £20,000 and £23,000 a year.

We have two areas within our Independent Living & Work Skills (ILWS) department, both offering courses in interlinked areas of learning.

All our programmes offer teaching and learning with a difference - we take learning outside of the classroom and College Campus whenever possible. Our students are now succeeding at an amazing pace, gaining skills that help them to progress and move on to interesting lives away from College.

More about ILWS

All students are encouraged to focus on a life goal. Through discussion we work out subject targets, as well as personal and social targets, that will assist you in achieving large steps towards this goal. Regular meetings are held with you, your Tutor and your parents/carers to ensure that your support is in place both in College and whilst at home.

Our Independent Living Programme is supportive but challenging, with much of the programme delivered in a purposebuilt flat. You will also learn to use public transport and many community facilities to develop your skills and independence.

We are very proud of our highly successful Work Skills programme. We work closely with many local employers and some teaching takes place at work. This gives you regular experience of being at work and helps you to develop skills that will make you more employable.

Our Travel Training sets out to ensure that you become fully competent and able to travel independently using public transport.

Many of our students become fully independent travellers or progress on to work.

All our courses offer structured programmes. Staff are experienced in delivering sessions to suit the needs of individuals, using the appropriate communication style.

Timetables can be created to suit the needs of individuals through discussion with the ILWS team.

ILWS courses

Independent Enterprise

This course suits (SLD/SpLD) school-leavers and young adults who want to develop independent living skills at home and at work. The course focuses on increasing independence skills, while developing your confidence and communication skills.

Students on this course will probably live in supported housing or at home. You will have attended a special school.

This course is very much hands on and designed to make the most of your practical abilities and increase your understanding. Students are encouraged and supported to make the transition from school to College, by becoming familiar with, and working towards, an independent use of all College facilities.

You will have the opportunity to develop your skills while using our independent living flat and help to run a recycling enterprise. When ready you will progress to using public transport and local facilities.

English, Maths and Information Technology (IT), Cookery and Personal and Social Development will be embedded throughout the academic year. As part of the course you will also develop your social skills in everyday situations.

Personal care is available along with out-of-class support.

Greater Independence & Supported Work Skills (GISW)

This course is for adults with Mild or Specific (MLD/SpLD) learning difficulties, who are interested in learning the skills required to further develop their independence and where possible to progress on to supported work. This can be a one- or two-year course depending on your needs.

It is likely that you will always need support at work and would therefore leave College to gain either voluntary work or employment in a social enterprise environment.

While on this course you will learn the skills required to live with increased independence, learning about money and budgeting, using public transport and general household duties including cooking.

You will also learn the skills that will help you to obtain work in the future. These skills will be developed while working within a supported work environment. The course also offers the chance to improve your English, Maths, IT and Personal & Social Development skills.

Transition to Work 3 (19-24 years) (T2W3)

If you want to move into employment but do not yet have the skills or confidence, this course is ideal for you. This course runs for three days a week (16 hours).

You will work in a vocational setting (Horticulture and Hospitality) of your choice, acquiring and improving skills that will assist you in gaining employment. You will develop skills such as timekeeping, following instructions, working alone and within a team, communication and problem solving. You will also learn additional English, Maths and IT skills.

Learning to work by doing work

All of our students involved on our Work Skills programmes, GISW, T2W3,T2W2, Employability and VA, work within real businesses.

Students at the Acorn Community Centre assist in running the Aviary Café, cooking, serving and keeping the café clean.

Some students work in Sainsbury's doing a variety of jobs – serving customers, working in the restaurant, packing bags, replacing stock on the shelves etc.

There are a wide variety of job roles at Staunton Country Park including planting and growing bedding plants and vegetables, which are then marketed and sold.

Other in-house enterprises are also run at College throughout the year, including Recycling and Paper Dreams.



Transition to Work 2 (25+ years) (T2W2)

This course has the same content as Transition to Work 3 (see page 84) but runs over two days. It is designed for students who are aged 25 or over who need to prepare for the transition from College into employment. Please contact the College on (023) 9238 3131 for information about fees.

Employability

'Employability' is designed for young people (16-20) who want to learn the skills necessary to gain work. It is likely that you still require a high level of support when working and may lack the confidence to work unaided, though it would be anticipated that you will work independently in the future.

You will learn the main skills required by all employers, such as timekeeping, communication and team work. You will work in vocational settings gaining valuable skills that will help you secure employment in the future. In addition, you will develop your skills in English, Maths and IT.

This can be a one- or two-year course depending on your needs. During your time of study you will decide whether you wish to continue in education and gain a vocational qualification or move directly into employment. When assessed to be ready you will be given the opportunity to gain an independent work experience placement or try a course at College.

Travel Training will be an important part of your course if you are not an independent traveller.

Vocational Access (VA)

You must be reasonably independent and want to work in order to join this one-year course. This course suits those aged 16-25 who have the ability to progress on to a vocational programme, but still lack the confidence and communication skills. You must be able to travel independently to join this course.

It would be expected that you would be able to work with only limited supervision while at College and move on to paid work in the future. You will probably still need to improve your Functional Skills and sample a variety of

vocational areas to help you choose a career area. This course will prepare you for the transition onto mainstream College courses while still being supported within the ILWS department.

This course develops basic skills and allows you to try different vocational subjects such as catering, hair and beauty, carpentry, painting and decorating, motor mechanics, retail, office work etc. You will work within three vocational areas throughout the year; you will join in with the practical session only. You will gain an accredited qualification as part of this course. You will also continue to develop English, Maths and IT, as well as Personal and Social Development.

Job Coaches work alongside tutors within all our Work Skills programmes to assist and support you in the workplace.

A highly successful Travel Training programme is part of the programme.

Other courses and programmes available in the department

Enrichment activities linked to employability skills are available within your programme, such as Get Gorgeous, art and sports. These fun activities will help you to develop team work and creative skills as well as look and feel your best. Other enrichment sessions may also be available, depending on your personal timetable.

Part-time courses

Courses are likely to be available in art, sport, cookery and horticulture.

Timetables and progression routes

Courses are set and are full-time running between two and three days a week. However, we aim to provide programmes to suit your specific learning needs. Where possible, a timetable can be arranged to accommodate your needs and the time you have available.

Attendance

All programmes are expected to run between Monday and Friday and full-time courses are up to three days a week (16 hours).



Course fees

Under 25s with a statement of learning difficulty/disability will pay no fees. Students aged 25 and over will pay fees dependent on the benefits they are on. The College will do its utmost to assist in keeping fees to a minimum or arranging remission of fees where possible.

Entry requirements

No academic qualifications are required. Your suitability for each programme will be assessed during interview and the subsequent assessment period.

English Language Skills



English as a Foreign Language (EFL)

If you are looking to improve your English language skills, Highbury College offers intermediate, advanced and pre-sessional English language courses to prepare you for future study on Pre-access, Access, Foundation Degree and university level courses.

Our English Language teaching is accredited by the British Council, which reflects the high quality of teaching we provide.

You will practice and develop your reading, writing, listening and speaking skills. There are also activities to help improve your English vocabulary, grammar, spelling and pronunciation.

You will be given IELTS training and work on developing your score so you can go on to an Access to Higher Education Diploma (see page 18) at Highbury or on to university.

You will also be given opportunities to take short courses in a variety of vocational areas, including Business, IT and Hospitality.

You need to have studied English before taking these courses and have reached a minimum of IELTS 4.0 or equivalent. We will assess you at interview. If you are applying from outside the UK we will assess you online.

Fees - this is a full-cost programme and fees do apply. You need a student visa to study in the UK or to be an EU citizen.

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) and Employability

Our 2011 Ofsted report judged Highbury's ESOL provision to be outstanding. Some of the main findings from the Ofsted 2011 report of ESOL at Highbury were:

- Teaching and learning are outstanding in ESOL provision.
- Pass rates are consistently high and well above the national average.
- Students successfully progress onto vocational programmes, Access to higher education courses or gain employment.

If you are looking to improve your English language skills, Highbury College runs popular full-time ESOL courses for students aged 16-18 and for adults. We have developed a programme that aims to help the ESOL student learn all the skills needed for future training and work, as well as home and community life.

This is a vibrant department where opportunities are made available to be involved in activities such as multicultural days and sport, as well as benefitting from guest speakers.

We offer a range of full-time classes to suit a variety of levels and needs. The courses include class-based study and online learning.
