## **Campus Locations**

Study for *ifs* School of Finance degrees is offered at campuses in London, Birmingham and Leeds with a number of further campus locations planned across the UK. #### London

Our London campus, Peninsular House, is situated near Monument in the heart of the City's financial district and surrounded by many of the world's leading financial institutions.

# Student support and advice

# Programme Manager and Lead Tutor Support

At each campus delivering our programmes we provide a focal point of student contact and support in the form of a programme manager or lead tutor. Their role is to ensure that our programmes are delivering on their promise and are meeting the needs of our students. They are easily accessible by students and can provide support and advice on any aspect of study or student life.

#### Advice and Pastoral Care

The *ifs* also has a dedicated team of advisors who are on hand to assist students. They are able to provide advice on pastoral matters in the strictest confidence and where appropriate put students in contact with a range of other supporting organisations.

The *ifs* also operates a student mentor scheme. Mentors have first hand experiene of studying with the *ifs* and can offer support with study skills, motivation, and time management. They are committed to helping you overcome any issues you might encounter on the path to successful completion of your course. *ifs* mentors are already working within the financial services industry so can also offer advice and guidance on career development and securing employment.

#### Careers

# Teaching and learning

The *ifs*' approach to teaching and learning ensures that you complete your studies with a deep theoretical understanding and the real-world practical knowledge needed to apply that theory in the workplace.

#### Study

In your first year there will be approximately 12 to 14 hours face-to-face teaching contact time per week. As with any programme at degree level, you will also be expected to undertake a considerable amount of independent study. On-line discussion forums will support your developing abilities to critique and challenge models. You will learn the theoretical frameworks and explore their use through research, report writing and via debate and discussion with your fellow students.

#### The Lecturing Team

We ensure a blend of academic and vocational experience within our lecturing team. Many of our lecturers have themselves worked in the financial services industry and this enables them to help you understand how the theory relates to practice.

#### Putting it into context

Throughout the duration of your studies you will have opportunities to understand how your learning can be applied to the workplace. You will hear from a variety of guest lecturers who hold senior positions within the industry and as such are able to give you unrivalled insight and understanding of the subjects under discussion. We also provide opportunities for students to engage with industry professionals via our alumni events and networking programmes and our student mentoring scheme.

We strongly encourage work based learning, either as part of the course itself or as a complementary activity to support your studies and your future employment prospects. The course team can provide assistance to you in identifying and securing suitable placements and internships. It will work with employers to ensure that any placements are adding genuine value to your studies and experience.

# Money matters

Under the present arrangements, if you are a full-time student studying on your first higher education course, you can apply for a government loan for your tuition fees along with a means-tested maintenance loan to help with your costs of living. You may also be eligible for additional support in the form of maintenance grant.\*

The *ifs* also offers a range of scholarships and bursaries.

#### Government Grants and Loans\*

Government grants and loans can help to cover student tuition fees and living costs. Financial support and applications are available for students from the UK, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales and EU countries.

- Tuition fee loan Covers your full tuition fees and is paid directly to the learning provider which means you will not have to pay the tuition fee prior your studies commencing or during your course. More details are available from the Student Loans Company at www.slc.co.uk
- Maintenance loan Students can apply for a further loan to assist with living costs, the final amount will depend on your household income.
- Maintenance grant A means tested non-repayable grant is available for eligible students from lower-income backgrounds.

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#### Scholarships and Bursaries

A number of first year scholarships are available to recognise and reward high academic achievement by students who have already studied with the *ifs* School of Finance. These are awarded upon commencement of studies in the first semester to the highest achieving students of *ifs* Certificate and Diploma in Financial Studies qualifications.

#### **Tuition Fees**

Our fees are set at a level that reflects the academic quality and professional relevance of our programmes. We are able to offer a learning experience of the highest quality and qualifications that are internationally recognised at a lower cost than traditional universities. This is because we are not burdened by large overheads for such things as estates management and our specialist nature allows us to focus our resources squarely on the teaching of our programmes. Tuition fees for 2013 are yet to be confirmed, however fees for 2012 ranged from £5,750 to £6,000 per annum.

# BSc (Hons) in Banking Practice and Management

#### **UCAS Code N310**

The BSc (Hons) in Banking Practice and Management draws upon the many years of experience held by the *ifs* in educating banking professionals and our unrivalled understanding of the banking and financial services industry.

The programme covers all the essential understanding that you need to prepare for a successful career in banking and financial services management. Crucially it reflects what employers tell us they are looking for from potential recruits.

In the first year you will get to grips with the workings of the sector both from an organisational point of view and in respect of the financial markets. You will also gain a thorough grounding in the essential concepts of risk that underpin financial decision making at every level, and an appreciation of the different customer groups and their financial needs.

The second year builds specific understanding of the commercial environment in which banks operate and the principles of management and organisational effectiveness. There is also an opportunity to build specialist knowledge in retail or corporate financial services.

Through our links with the major financial services organisations, we can also help students to secure work placements or internships to enable them to undertake Work-based Learning.

In the final year the focus is on developing and embedding core strategic concepts, enhancing decision-making ability and growing the detailed industry knowledge that is essential for a successful management career in banking and financial services. Throughout the programme you will have the opportunity to be introduced to, and interact with, financial services employers through visits, industry speakers and practical workshop activities.

# Career Opportunities

Graduates of this course would normally go on to careers in retail financial services or corporate banking and would be particularly well placed to enter executive and management trainee schemes. Typical future roles for graduates include leadership positions in the central functions of large institutions or areas such as branch or regional management, corporate lending and credit, relationship management and product development. The programme is also an excellent foundation for the study of finance at a higher level such as the *ifs* MSc in Banking Practice & Management and Chartered Fellowship (CFifs).

# BSc (Hons) in Finance and Accounting for Financial Services UCAS Code NN34

The BSc (Hons) in Finance and Accounting for Financial Services prepares you for a finance and accounting related role in the financial services industry whilst also giving you the credentials you need to pursue a career in other sectors.

In the first year you will gain a thorough grounding in both the workings of the financial services sector and the fundamental principles of accounting and finance. This will include the development of an appreciation of economic theory and the operation of financial markets along with an introduction to how the quantitative methods are used to measure financial performance and the essential concepts of risk.

The second year allows you to develop a more detailed understanding of core accounting and financial principles such as taxation, management and financial accounting and business law whilst also gaining an appreciation of the commercial environment in which financial services organisations operate.

In the third year you will explore and become familiar with the ways and means by which finance and accounting impacts the strategic management of organisations. Subjects such as financial reporting and corporate risk management are examined in detail along with the high-level principles of corporate governance. You will also be able to explore core course themes further via the final year project.

# Career Opportunities

Graduates of this course are likely to go on to careers in a number of areas of finance including financial and management accounting; business planning, corporate finance and risk management. The ifs will be seeking maximum exemption against the ACCA (Association of Chartered Certified Accountants) Fundamentals papers for students who successfully complete the ifs BSc (Hons) in Finance and Accounting for Financial Services, in which case the programme will also provide a progression route to becoming a Chartered Accountant.

### BSc (Hons) in Finance, Investment and Risk\*

#### **UCAS Code N300**

The BSc (Hons) in Finance, Investment and Risk\* is a new programme designed for students who want a career in investment banking and related roles. It provides the opportunity to study for a directly relevant degree in a business-like environment that gives unique exposure to, and immersion in, the financial services industry.

The programme will enable you to develop a comprehensive knowledge and understanding of the core elements of investment and financial analysis and risk management that underpin sound decision-making. It will provide you with opportunities to investigate and analyse a range of issues relating to financial markets and the financial services sector (particularly investment/corporate banking) and its national and international environment.

Alongside study of the broader environment in which investment banking operates, the programme will also develop your understanding of key aspects of equity markets and investments, security analysis, asset classes and bond and equity pricing as well as covering portfolio management, derivatives, and alternative investments.

Critically, the programme also provides you with the opportunity to evaluate the impact of changing regulatory and operating conditions and gain insights into and understanding of the local and global tensions in banking and financial services. Ethics and professional standards form a key component of the course and will be taught at each level of the programme.

# Programme outline

#### Year 1

The first year provides you with a thorough grounding in key areas of financial markets, assessing financial performance, economics and quantitative methods. The focus will be on introducing tools that will support investment analysis later in the programme as well as enhancing your quantitative skills. You will gain an appreciation of economic theory and the operation of financial markets as well as the essential concepts of risk.

#### Year 2

The second year will focus on developing your knowledge, both theoretical and practical, of key aspects of equity markets and investments, security analysis, corporate finance and associated risk management frameworks and models. You will develop a more detailed understanding of asset classes and bond and equity pricing and build on study in year one to consider modelling and testing in finance and risk management.

#### Year 3

In year 3, further investment-specific modules will cover portfolio management, derivatives, alternative investments and financial reporting and analysis. You will gain an indepth knowledge of these subject areas to enable financial evaluation for decision-making at a more strategic level. You will also be able to explore course themes via the final year dissertation component.

In addition, and throughout each level of study, you will be introduced to and gain an understanding and appreciation of the importance of ethics and professional standards.



# Career Opportunities

Graduates of this course are likely to go on to careers in a wide range of investment banking roles as traders, fund and asset managers, analysts and brokers. Students will be supported throughout their studies to gain summer internships with leading investment banks to give their career a head start. The programme is also designed to be an excellent foundation for the CFA Institute's globally recognised CFA award or further specialist studies in Finance at Masters level.

Mature students who do not meet the entry requirements will be required to submit a CV supported by a 500 to 600 word statement indicating why they have chosen to undertake the programme and how it will support their career plans. If invited to progress, an interview may be held and a numeracy and deductive reasoning assessment may need to be passed.

Applicants for a full-time BSc (Hons) programme may be interviewed and will be required to submit a piece of written work (personal statement) as part of their UCAS application to enable an assessment to be made of their suitability for the programme.




