


## Discover our beautiful campus...

The Sports Complex houses a gymnasium, fitness centre, racquetball/squash court, dormitories and an indoor hockey rink.












# Your success is important...

## Our Programs...

At St. Peter's College, you can begin your University of Saskatchewan degree in Arts & Science, Commerce/Business, Agriculture or Kinesiology.



You can fulfill the entrance requirements to the University of Saskatchewan Colleges of Education, Law, Dentistry, Nursing, Pharmacy, Nutrition, Medicine or Veterinary Medicine.



You can transfer to programs such as Education, Engineering, Social Work, Journalism, Optometry, Nursing, Communication Disorders, Police Studies or Environmental Studies.

St. Peter's College provides free academic advising throughout the year. Academic advising is recommended for all students. To ensure your classes meet your degree requirements, please contact Student Services at 306.682.7886 to book an appointment.

#### **Arts and Science**

Arts and Science is the starting university college for many of the students who attend St. Peter's College and leads to many different degree options. Arts and Science classes can be used to fulfill some or all of the requirements for the Health Science or Professional Colleges offered by the University of Saskatchewan.

The final admission average for Saskatchewan high school students wishing to be accepted as an Arts and Science student is 70%. If your admission average is between 50% - 70%, you may be offered the Transition Program. The deadline to apply to Arts and Science is August 15.

Your choice of degree program will determine which classes you will take in your first year. Please see an academic advisor to ensure that your classes meet the requirements of your degree.

Students who are pursuing careers in Health Sciences, Education or Law appreciate the small class sizes and quality of education that we provide.

Please note that the non-direct entry colleges may have additional requirements prior to your acceptance into their program. These requirements may include volunteer/working experience, interviews and exams. 

## **Agriculture and Bioresources**

The deadline to apply to the University of Saskatchewan into the College of Agriculture and Bioresources is August 15. The final admission average for a Saskatchewan High School Student wishing to be accepted as an Agriculture student is 70%.

## Commerce – Business Edwards School of Business

St. Peter's College offers the first year of courses for the Bachelor of Commerce from the Edwards School of Business at the University of Saskatchewan. This is a direct entry program.

At St. Peter's College, students also have the option of taking the required first year courses as an Arts and Science or Transition student, meeting the Edwards School of Business transfer average, and then transferring to the Edwards School of Business.

The deadline to apply to the Edwards School of Business to take classes at St. Peter's College is May 1. The final admission average is 78%. If your average is between 75% and 77.9%, you will be waitlisted.

### **Kinesiology**

St. Peter's College offers the first year of courses for the Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology program at the University of Saskatchewan. This is a direct entry program.

The deadline to apply to the College of Kinesiology is February 15. Applicants will be waitlisted and ranked according to average. The top 100+ students will be admitted.

At St. Peter's College, students also have the option of taking the required first year Kinesiology courses as an Arts and Science or Transition student, meeting the College of Kinesiology transfer average of 75% and applying as a transfer student to the College of Kinesiology.

### **Admission Categories**

You are considered a University of Saskatchewan student while you attend St. Peter's College. The University of Saskatchewan has a number of admission categories depending on a student's age, academic standing, educational history and country of origin.

If you are not sure what admission category you are in, or what the university requires for your admission, please contact Student Services at 306.682.7886.

#### Early (Conditional) or Regular Admission

If you have completed or are currently completing high school, this is the category in which you will be considered. The admission average will be calculated using the final marks for the completed subjects and the projected or estimated marks for the subjects in progress.

#### **Transition Program**

If you have graduated from high school, but do not meet the College of Arts & Science admission requirements, you may be eligible for admission to the Transition Program.

#### **Special (Mature) Admission**

Special (Mature) Admission is available to applicants who do not qualify for Regular Admission. All direct-entry colleges except the College of Education consider applicants under Special Admission.

To apply for Special (Mature) Admission you must meet the following criteria:

- You must be 21 years of age by the first day of classes.
- You must be a Canadian citizen or a landed immigrant.
- You must be entering the first year of study. Applicants who have completed 18 credit units or more of university-level credits are not eligible to apply for Special (Mature) Admission.

## **Admission Categories**

#### **International Students**

International students are very welcome at St. Peter's College and the University of Saskatchewan. Students will require a study permit issued by Canada Customs and Immigration. Application procedures for international students are very similar to those of Canadian students. Please contact us for all the requirements for admssion.

#### **Audit Students**

Should you wish to sit in on a particular course, but do not want to take the course for credit, you may apply as an audit student. Fees are assessed at 50% of the regular course cost.

#### **Senior Citizen Option**

As a senior citizen, you may take less than 18 credit units with all tuition fees waived. However, you will be responsible for any materials, laboratory fees, student fees and other class costs. You must submit proof of age, and, in order to qualify, you must be 65 years of age by the date the class starts and submit your request for waiver to the Finance Office.

You may pay by credit card online by selecting "Pay Now" on the application form. If you select the "Pay Later" option you may submit the \$90 application fee by:

If you have previously attended the U of S, you are not required to pay the application fee.
