As an entering student to the U of S, you can receive two types of awards: Guaranteed Entrance Scholarships, which are awarded automatically based on your Grade 11 and 12 marks and Competitive Entrance Awards, which you apply for and compete for among your peers.



You've worked hard for your academic success in high school, and we want to recognize your achievements. So, beginning this year, instead of one or the other, you can receive both a Competitive Entrance Award and your guaranteed, automatic entrance scholarship of up to \$3,000!

(If you're selected for more than one Competitive Entrance Award, you will be asked to choose which award you wish to accept.)

Transfer Student Scholarships

Best of Two

Competitive Entrance Awards

What are Competitive Entrance Awards?

Have you contributed to a school club? Have musical accomplishments? Are a star athlete? There could be a Competitive Entrance Award for you!

Competitive Entrance Awards recognize your academic achievement, financial need, and contributions to school and community life. Awards include:

- SCHOLARSHIPS awarded based on your academic achievement and may take your school and community activities, leadership or other criteria into consideration.
- BURSARIES awarded based on your financial need and may take your academic achievement into consideration as well.
- PRIZES awarded based on your specific achievements (e.g., science fair project) and could be monetary or an item, such as a book.

Who is eligible?

You are eligible to apply for Competitive Entrance Awards if:

- You are a Grade 12 graduate coming directly to the U of S, or
- You have already completed high school and have less than 18 transferrable credit units

In order to be considered you must submit the following by February 15*:

- Application for Competitive Entrance Awards
- Application for Admission
- \$90 application fee

And the following by March 15*:

- Your up-to-date transcript including Semester One final grades and/or January midterm marks for non-semestered subjects
- Supporting documentation, as outlined in each Competitive Entrance Award listing

How is my Competitive Entrance Awards Average calculated?

Your Competitive Entrance Awards average considers your five best subjects, as completed by the end of Semester One of Grade 12, according to specific criteria. Your awards average is calculated similarly to your admission average. To view how your admission average is calculated, visit the province-specific links at:

When will you hear from us?

If you are selected to receive a Competitive Entrance Award, you will be mailed a notification package as early as April 2012.

Supporting Documents

Tips for submitting supporting documentation for Competitive Entrance Awards

Cover Letter

Provide a cover letter with your supporting documents that includes your:

- contact information, including your email address
- University of Saskatchewan student number, if known
- Application for Competitive Entrance Awards reference code
- list of awards
- list of package contents

List of Activities

Your lists of community and school involvement, athletic ability and leadership activities should be:

- concrete, with clear examples
- dated, with a time-frame listed for each activity
- unique, tailored to each award's specific criteria

Reference Letters

CHOOSE YOUR REFERENCES CAREFULLY

Choose someone who can express themselves well in writing and who has known you long enough to describe your positive attributes in detail. Letters should not be from family members

INFORM YOUR REFERENCES

Provide your reference with lots of information about you, as it relates to your awards application. With a résumé and awards listing in hand, your reference's letter will be stronger and more relevant. Let them know your deadline, and provide them with lots of time.

ONE SIZE DOESN'T FIT ALL!

Have your references write letters specific to the award.

SUBMIT REFERENCE LETTERS WITH OTHER AWARDS DOCUMENTS

There is no need to send them in separate envelopes, signed and sealed or directly from the references themselves.

PROOFREAD YOUR REFERENCE LETTERS

Some references write several reference letters for different students. Make sure the letters describe you.

THANK YOUR REFERENCES

Send a thank you note, drop in and see them, or whatever you like!

Aboriginal Ancestry Documents required for awards

If you apply for awards that require proof of aboriginal ancestry, please include one of the following acceptable supporting documents:

- photocopy of Métis Nation Card
- letter from First Nations Band or Métis Nation
- photocopy of Indian Status Card

The following supporting documents cannot be accepted:

- family trees
- letters or notes from relatives
- photographs of grandparents, parents, relatives, etc.

Saskatchewan Resident

You are considered a Saskatchewan Resident if you:

- graduated from a Saskatchewan high school,
- submitted a 2010 Saskatchewan Income Tax Return, and/or
- hold a valid Saskatchewan Driver's Licence.

How do I submit my supporting documentation for awards?

Email admissions@usask.ca

- Emailing is quick, easy, environmentally friendly and free!
- The email should contain your full name and University of Saskatchewan student number, if known. Including your full name is especially important when sending email from your parents' email account or an email account that doesn't contain your name.
- Please send attachments in .doc, .txt or PDF format.
- Label your documents as you would if you were dropping them off.

Submit the online Application for Admission and pay the \$90 application fee. These items must be submitted by February 15 to be eligible for Competitive Entrance Awards.

✓ Self report your marks*

Include Grade 11 and 12 final marks, January midterm marks (for non-semestered subjects) and subjects in which you are registered for subsequent semesters.

By March 15 ...

Send us your Semester One final marks explore.usask.ca/contact

Ensure that you or your school sends us an up-to-date copy of your transcript, including Semester One finals, January midterm marks for non-semestered subjects and a list of subjects in which you are currently registered. **Competitive Entrance Awards will not be awarded based on your self-reported marks**.

If you attended another post-secondary institution and have less than 18 transferrable credit units, you will be considered for awards based on final high school marks. Submit a final high school transcript and an up-to-date post-secondary transcript at this time.

Make sure any lists of activities, reference letters, essays, proof of ancestry, etc. are submitted according to the online **How to Submit Supporting Documents** directions by March 15.

Arrange for your final high school transcript to be sent to the U of S

Make arrangements now! Visit our website to find province-specific information about getting your final high school transcript sent directly to the U of S from the appropriate issuing authority upon completion of Grade 12. Transcripts should be sent to the U of S by August 1.

If you attended another post-secondary institution, you must also arrange to have your final post-secondary transcript sent directly from your previous institution to the U of S by June 1.
